



shade to one and all, symbolize the formators.



Premananda of Botany Department retired from service. Dr. Anuba Singh, Ms. Anju Susan Kuriakose, Ms. Anuradha P.S., Mrs Sharone Andrew, Ms Santhosh Kumari, Mr Krishnan, Mr. C.S. Dixit, Fr. Paulson, Mrs. Rathi and Ms Annapoorna Ramu joined the staff of Christ College. Mr. Sujendra Prakash, Mr. Chakrapani, Mr. Shiva Reddy, Mrs. Ritu Thakur and Mr Justine Baby left the college in the course of this year. Welcome to the new members and all the best wishes and thanks for the valuable service to all those who have left us.

Going through the harvest of the last academic year, we are proud of our results, although not hundredfold in all, we are near to it. For PUC we got 91%; B.A - 80%; B.Sc. - 80%; B.Com - 75%; BBM - 84%; BHM - 90%; MA - 94%; M.Sc. - 100% and MBA - 93% to summarise our result. About 40 students found their names in rank list and to mention a few, Prema Martin Noronha (two gold medals) and Aparna Tapadia - I and V rank in MBA; George Kunnappally, Jose Kunnappally and Ashraf Abbas Badami - I, III and IV ranks in BHM; Sunil Putty A and Aparna George - second and third ranks in BBM; Shivaprakash B.S. - II rank in B.Sc.; Udaya Kumar, IV Rank in B.Com; Preethy, Rosmy Varghese, Sonia Annabelle Robert, and Hima Reddy - second, third and fourth ranks in M.A. Sociology,; Sandhya K and Lokesh H D II and V Rank

in M.Sc. and Deepak M. - eighth rank in PU Commerce. Congratulations to all the rank holders for achievement and fruits of the labour which they will cherish for ever. The teachers who helped in achieving this feat also deserve our commendation and they will find the fulfillment of their life in their students' going higher and higher on the ladder of life.

During this academic year, in the month of July, we started the Iwinning programme with Western Michigan University with 22 students in the first batch, 15 for Business Management and 7 for Computer Science. We also have academic collaboration and understanding with Luton University, UK for our MBA programme. On September 8, 1997 we started with the construction of the fourth wing of the second block of our college and the work is in steady progress with blessings of the Almighty.

The year was extraordinarily active in terms of association and club activities, most of which was co-curricular. The novel items of competitions helping the students to what their academic appetite and inquisitiveness, the organisation at skills achieved, the camaraderie and interaction with students of other colleges, etc., will remain green in our minds for some time. Scores of associations in existence gave rise to dozens of inter-collegiate festivals and almost every week-end we had an inter-collegiate fest, related to one academic branch or the other. 

he National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) is an autonomous organisation, established by the University Grants Commission (UGC), with its headquarters at Bangalore.

NAAC's responsibility is to assess and accredit public and private institutions of higher learning, based on certain parameters which reflect on the functioning of the institutions in totality. NAAC's process of assessment leading to accreditation, involves preparation of a self study report by the institution, its validation by the peers and final decision by the council.

The philosophy of NAAC is ameliorative and enabling rather than punitive or judgemental so that all constituency of institutions of higher education are empowered to maximize their resources opportunities and capabilities.

The management, staff- both teaching and non-teaching and the students representatives have taken a big step ahead to lead Christ College, which is one of the leading colleges of Bangalore, to National Assessment and Accreditation.

Apart from the regular classes and practical on state of the art equipment, the Association also creates an opportunity for students to have actual "on the job experience" like the "Tomato fest


and Aangan". Aangan, a transitory fast food restaurant caters to the appetites of the crowd gathered for the inter-collegiate

organized year for this august association.




Competitions like quiz, debates and poster painting were conducted in which Surana College, Mount Carmel College, and Jyothi Nivas College also participated.

CENTRE FOR CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT




