

The Eye...



Many things are taught in the schools and colleges. But all of them are not worth the name, knowledge or wisdom Sophia. Apart from imparting





Principal Speaks......

Sir, could you please summarise the activities at the beginning of the year?

"The year commenced on June 15, 1998 which marked the beginning of the academic year ushering in days of hectic activity and struggle to reach out to our goal and motto of "excellence and service". Almost becoming a tradition, our teaching faculty spent the last Saturday of June at Sunny Holiday Village, fixing themselves and reviving up and gathering energy through planning and discussion to devise strategies for the new academic year. All the first year students had orientation programmes and personality development programmes to initiate them to the college and instil in them the basics of christite culture. 3897 students are currently on the rolls undergoing various courses of Bangalore University. Some changes occured in the faculty list and I make use of this opportunity to welcome the new faces. Mr. Dwarakanath of Chemistry Department retired after a long stint of service which saw the beginning and growth of Christ College. Mr. Desmond Fullinfaw of Mathematics Department took voluntary retirement. I offer them our gratitude and prayerful wishes. "

Sir, what about the visit by the NAAC peer team?

"On July 15th and 16th we had the privilege of being assessed by the Peer Team comprising Dr. G. Sukumaran Nair, Prof. Francis Sounderaj, and Prof. V. Shirgurkar along with Dr. Latha Pillai, Dr. Madhukar and Dr. Shyamsunder of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). Let me proudly announce the fact that in the letter dated January 9, 1999 signed by Chairman NAAC we were informed that "our college was accredited, a rare and unique accomplishment to become the first institution to get that status in the whole of Karnataka State."

How was the performance of students in the last year's university exams?

Glancing through the results, our PU students scored an overall win of 92.15% with 98% in PCME and 96.2% in PCMB. Degree and PG results range from 76% to 98%. To cite a few, BBM 98%, MBA 98%, MCA 97%, BA 88% overall with 100% in JPEng combination. Coming to ranks, Mr. Raja Chaudhary - ranks first in BHM, Mr. Vivek - third in BBM, Miss Vidya M. Bhat - fifth in B.Sc., Bro. Devasiachan J. - fifth in B.A., Miss

Nirmala Suhag - first in MBA, Miss Anamika Choudhury - third in MBA, Miss Deepa Dayanand Achar - fourth in MBA, Mr. Rudresh - fourth in M.Sc., and another list of 33 brought laurels to the college appearing in the rank list of the University. Mr. Roy Chacko and Ashok Alex who completed MBA were offered liberal scholar-ships to study in Brussels, Belgium for a semester all expenses paid by ICHEC. Mr. Deepak Dembla of third PCM was invited to Inter-University Center for Astronomy and Astrophysics for Second Level Astronomical and Photometry Programmes.

Could you tell us about the cultural activities and sports competitions?

"The academic year was packed with various co-curricular activities. Starting with Darpan, our annual talent search competitions to the recently concluded EURO for the executives in the industry and GRACIAS which brought 30 corporate guides from the industries, almost every week we had one inter-collegiate programme or the other. The tradition goes on through this year's edition of Ushus, Jagruthi, Prayas, Espirit, Eureka, Com.com, Silhouette, Species, Interface, Convergence, In Bloom, etc., to name a few and various performances by English Theatre group, Nataka Abhiruchi Kendra, Hindi Drama, etc."

"Thanks to Mr. Srinivasa Raju's effort, our Kannada Sangha has published its 150th book in a colourful function on January 31, 1999 with Dr. H. Narasimhiah as the chief guest. Many staff members published textbooks and research papers in national and international journals. Among them, Mr. Pranesh of Mathematics Department deserves special place. New editions of Christime, Journal, Silhoutte, Inquiry, Infobahn, etc., were released on various occasions. The placement center was very active and coordinated the campus recruitment programmes for many students. Placements in prestigious companies like MICO, Satyam Computers, Intercop, Toyota Kirloskar, Birla 3M, GECIS, BPL, OPM, Titan, HCL, Taj Group, etc., who recruited our students have taken our name to the corporate map.

Student talents participated in so many intercollegiate festivals and events from JIPMER Pondicherry to IIM Bangalore bagging many overall championships and runners up trophies competing with the other bests of the nation. Special commendations to the staff coordinators and supporting staff for their toil and sacrifice to achieve this feat. Miss Gayathri Aithal K, one of our NCC cadets took part in the RD Parade held in New Delhi. NSS marked special social significance launching the joint venture with APSA, an NGO working among street children and slum dwellers resulting in the birth of VIKAS. Apart from regular rural camp, blood donation, polio vaccination, etc., the Saturday afternoon exposure for our students in various slums and centers for rehabilitation instilled in them the fire of creative social involvement. Special credits to our NSS coordinators, and also to Dr. Kshithij and Mr Lakshapathy of APSA. Sports and Games activities also saw a spurt with the Football Team winning trophies like RBANMS and also in Chrispo-Fest and the Basketball Team also finding a place in University matches. Many students wore university uniform this year. Eight of our students represented Karnataka State in the Rugby Championship held at Rourkela, Bihar. Congratulations."

What were the other activities of the year, Sir?

"Christ College Alumni Association has been revived this year with a general body meeting on October 25, 1998 and a Family get-together on January 26, 1999. These programmes will be held annually, with the

General Body Meeting on the Second Sunday of October and the Family get-together to be held on January 26th. Mr. E. Jerome of Chemistry Department will coordinate the alumni/ae activities. All the outgoing students are requested to take note of this. CHANEL is the newsletter of this association."

"The academic year also witnessed our horizons expand with a host of job-oriented evening courses through twinning arrangement with Pondicherry Central University signed at Christ College by Dr. V.T. Patil, Vice-chancellor and Principal, Christ College on September 25,1998".

Another important event that took Christ College to national publicity was the Annual Conference of Indian Colleges' Forum which was held here on 27th and 28th of January 1999 which was attended by about 500 Principals from 25 states of India. It was an occasion where we could showcase our college and its functioning to the rest of the country. His Excellency Khurshed Alam Khan, Governor of Karnataka and G.D. Sharma, Secretary of UGC were among the dignitaries who were with us during this programme.

Were there any improvements in the campus infrastructure?

"Infrastructural facilities also got a fillip this year with the new wing of Block II inaugurated on August 12, 1998 adding 60,000 sq. ft. of built-up area with the Seminar Hall, Terrace Garden, Assembly Hall, Panel Room and 30 individual staff rooms and spacious classrooms. With the internet made available through leased line, the students get a hands-on experience of the new-world trends in education. A snack-bar right in the middle of the campus refresh the students and staff alike. For a third consecutive year, Bangalore Urban Art Commission has awarded the prize to Christ College for the best maintained building and campus. Special kudos to Fr. Thomas C. Mathew, the Vice-Principal."

What are the future plans?

"Above everything, the college is getting ready to welcome the new millennium with its promises and possibilities through a quiet movement to adapt our teaching and learning process to suit to the coming years of the third millennium. Right now the staff members are working towards this individually and collectively with the expert help of Mr. Surinder P. Ahuja and it will definitely show results in the years to come. Well, an educational institution cannot be stagnant in an age of Liberalisation, Privatisation and Globalisation. With the dynamic support and yearning for improvement prevalent among the staff and students alike in Christ College, I am sure, we will continue to keep Christ College striving to conquer the pinnacles of excellence. 'Excellence and Service' is our mantra. Wishing and praying for the continued blessings of Christ our patron par excellence on all of you."






Thus, it was a very successful year for the Association, which has a lot of future plans waiting to take shape in the years to come.

year, the Association has completed another glorious and eventful year.




The Intercollegiate Commerce Fest- *Prayas'99*, reflected the 'efforts' put in by the Commerce students to attain excellence in the field of Commerce.

The students had an opportunity to take part in a seminar on Artificial Intelligence conducted by Graphics Silicon Private Limited. There was


also an interactive session with two leading professionals in the IT industry,

NATURAL SCIENCE ASSOCIATION



"It was great working for Species'99. Everybody was given a chance to do something constructive and an opportunity to participate in workshops and events conducted outside."




PHYSICAL SCIENCE ASSOCIATION






JAGRUTI - A Super Hit


other places too, where prizes were bagged by our students.



IN BLOOM', the annual cultural festival hosted by Christ College, was a grand success as well, with over 40 participating teams and several new competitions.






