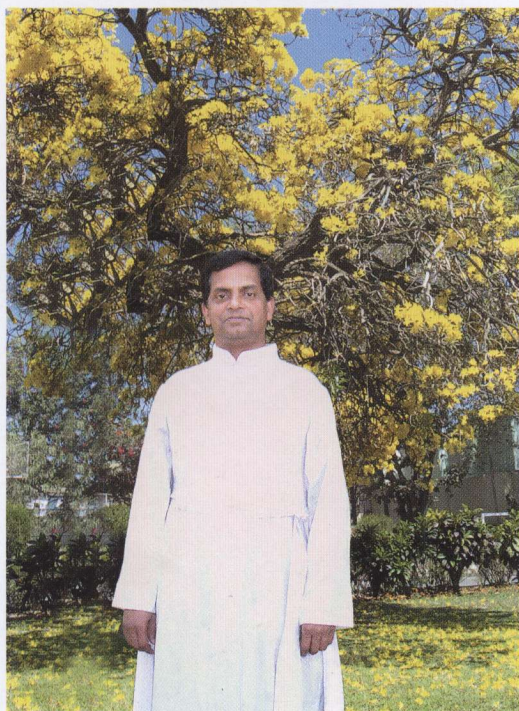


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# Principal's Report



**THIRTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT  
PRESENTED AT THE COLLEGE DAY**

In spatio-temporal history, our institution has crossed yet another milestone. Year 2001-2002 has been a very turbulent one in terms of political and social implications world over and consequently for us in Bangalore as well. However, we could carry out our programmes and projects without much of a fall out. This year, it was our considered opinion that the final years, including senior PU students, should get recognition and they should be the cynosure for the day as the ambassadors we send out to carry the name of Christ College far and wide. I call upon them to take up the challenges and live up to the ideals of "*Excellence and Service*" with utmost valour and commitment. May the Almighty be the strength and the light before your footsteps.

The student strength this year was 5624 including the students of twinning programmes with Pondicherry University and Western Michigan University, USA. It included 1687 PUC students and 370 students in various postgraduate programmes. The College had 145 full time teaching staff and 65 non-teaching staff. The College places on record the valuable services of Professors Abraham Jose, D. Srinivasan, and N Sundararajan from the teaching fraternity and Mr. Sashidharan Nair of non-teaching staff as they retired from service this academic year. May I take this opportunity to congratulate all the staff members who published and presented papers, obtained doctoral degrees and added value to themselves and to the institution. I welcome and offer my best wishes to all the new comers to the teaching fraternity.

To make specific mention of some of our students for their sterling performance in the university examinations: Regula Gedda Anuradha -1<sup>st</sup> rank in MCA; Jessy C.A, Barsha Rana and Rekha P., 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> ranks respectively in MA Sociology; Deepak P., Swetha Venugopal, Geena Xavier, and Pramod David 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> ranks respectively in BHM; Kavitha -3<sup>rd</sup> Rank; Rima Maria Aranha and Anitha Mary Ollappally-8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> ranks respectively in BA; Manjula K.P. and Nisha Kurian-8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> ranks respectively in B.Sc. Sunil R Swamy brought laurels to the College scoring maximum in commerce stream in the State with Nivedita coming second. Achievement of 92% results in PUC is commendable compared to the very low state average.

It was with a renewed vigour and strengthened resolve towards *Excellence and Service* that the new academic year was formally inaugurated on Friday June 15, 2001. Modules of Holistic education like leadership, value consciousness, and cultural heritage were taken up in all classes with the valuable services of the heads of departments and other staff members. Members of the core committees spent a day at Claret Nivas for strategic planning at the departmental and institutional levels.

An induction programme for the new teachers was held on the 16<sup>th</sup> of June 2001. The Staff orientation programme was held at Georgian Resorts on Saturday June 30<sup>th</sup>. The orientation for the senior students was organized by a team of teachers incorporating the modules of holistic education: leadership skills, values and integrity, learning styles and student ethics. Orientation programmes for the I PU & I degree were held on June 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>, July 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> respectively. Orientation was held for all the other courses as and when they commenced. During the process of admission itself, counseling department and teacher volunteers organized a session with the parents about the campus culture, attendance policy and discipline. As a result, there was marked improvement in student attendance and academic performance in all the courses. Classroom teaching in all the courses was complemented and enriched through guest lectures, field trips, research projects and internships. Departmental fests and programmes like Eureka, Species, Circuit, Flora, Inference, Convergence, Historia, Politicus, Vistas, Synosure, Interface, Karunadu Yatre, Prayas, Poets' meet, Espirit, Communiquere, Ushus, Susamskrti, Jagruti, PU fest, Joie de Vivre, Exodus, In Bloom, Darpan, Book mark, A Little Night Music, Sambandh, Kavidina, Career Fair, Disha, HAT and Chef competitions, the theme dinners by BHM department and corporate workshops kept the campus abuzz with scholastic and extra-curricular activities all through the year. A galaxy of dignitaries visited the campus on various occasions.



Another major development in the academic arena was the bifurcation of PU courses from the degree College. Fr. Abraham Vettiyankal is the principal of Christ Junior College. The Construction of the PU building is under way.

Major activities that took place under the auspices of Centre for Social Action and NSS are worth mentioning. Child development programme covers three hundred and fifty poor children from the slum with the support of our student community and Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA). A centre for non-formal education and childrens library was also started in Rajendranagar slum. Vocational training centres were established in Kenchanpalya and Adigondanahalli villages for carpentry and two wheeler mechanisms targeting unemployed youth. Self help groups and income generation programmes have been formed in these villages and slums. The fund raising programme, A Little Night Music organized with the support of College cultural team, Thermal and a Quarter, Theatre group, and slum children was unique and a great success. A social service centre coming up in a one-acre campus near Kenchanpalya village, Kengeri will open up further opportunities of community involvement for our students. Mr. Johny Joseph, Mr. Antony P.U, Mr. Antony Raju and volunteering staff members guide these programmes very successfully.

Publications department and Kannada Sangha together brought out three more books this year. "Kolaligondur Kaipidi" by Shankar Rao and collections of poems and essays from Anakru and Bendre state level competitions were released on January 31, 2002. Publication department is currently working on three journals to commence publication shortly, one in social sciences, one in natural sciences, and the third in commerce and management.

Centre for Education Beyond Curriculum (CEDBEC) apart from organizing strategic planning and orientation programmes of Christ College, conducted many workshops and seminars this year. In collaboration with Institute of Quality of Confederation of Indian Industry, a workshop on Total Quality Management was held from July 26<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> 2001 for educational institutions of the tri-states in the South. Three-day workshop on Effective Teaching Strategy for fresh College Teachers was held from September 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>. Two-day workshop on managerial skills for HODs, Administrators and senior lecturers was held on October 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup>. The educational summit of CII was jointly organized by CII and Christ College at the 9<sup>th</sup> Quality Summit on November 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>. A workshop on *Office Information Systems for Librarians* was held on December 5<sup>th</sup> 2001. Special mention of Mr. Kennedy Thomas, Dr.Senthil Kumaran and the volunteers would be in order here. United Board of Christian Higher Education (USA) has sponsored a workshop on library

automation for Colleges, which will be organized this summer in collaboration with AIACHE.


Twinning programmes with Western Michigan University and Pondicherry University are gaining strength from year to year thanks to the efforts of the coordinators. Sund Folk College Norway has evinced interest in the activities of CSA and joint student programs would be held in the near future. The college has also signed an MOU with the Assumption University, Thailand for joint programs in Management and Information Technology.

The Alumni Association took long strides by involving itself in supporting the College with many a scholarships for academically excellent, talented and financially backward students.

Theatre groups were also active with their performances. "Abhimanyu Kalaga", a Yaksha Gana performance was held at Christ College. The Kannada Theatre Group won the State level competition for their play 'Medea' by Euripedes staged at Ravindra Kalakshetra on January 11, 2002.

Our students fared very well in sports and games too. Swathi Shukla (gold and silver medals in nationals and state level swimming competitions), Sanath Shetty (Karnataka state junior basket ball team), Jacob M (Karnataka rowing team and medals in nationals), Gopalan Bharathwaj (Karnataka state under-19 cricket team) Amit D'Cruz, Calvin Sumitra and Bijoy Subbarao (Bangalore university basket ball team), Arvin (university football team), Rohit Goel (university cricket team), and Monisha Kalappa (university hockey team) have been exceptional achievements. Eunica Shirley won the gold medal at the NCC Republic Day Yachting/Sailing Regatta competitions. Tarun Appanna and Veroni Rajani were the individual champions at degree level and Augustine Jose at PU level in the intra-collegiate competitions.

The College specially recognizes Fr. Thomas Chathamparampil, the Vice-Principal who with his exceptional leadership, organizational and logistical skills supported all the visions and programmes that take this institution towards greater glory. I also applaud the heads of departments, coordinators, teachers and the administrative staff who with their readiness to change and grow for the better, moment after moment, have gained for our society an institution of ***Excellence And Service.***

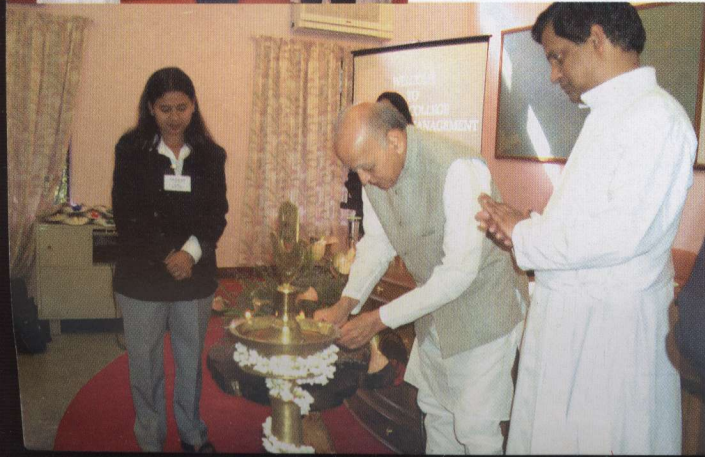

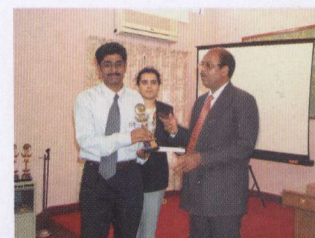

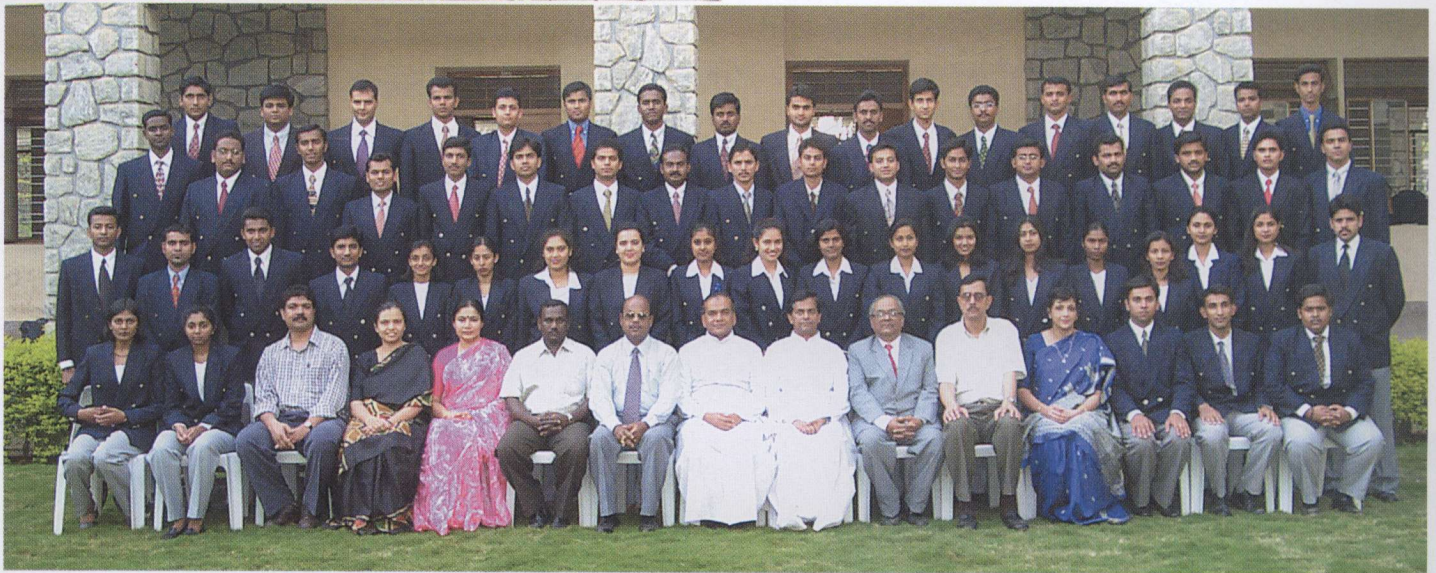

The I Rank in the Bangalore University Examinations was secured by Miss. Anuradha.





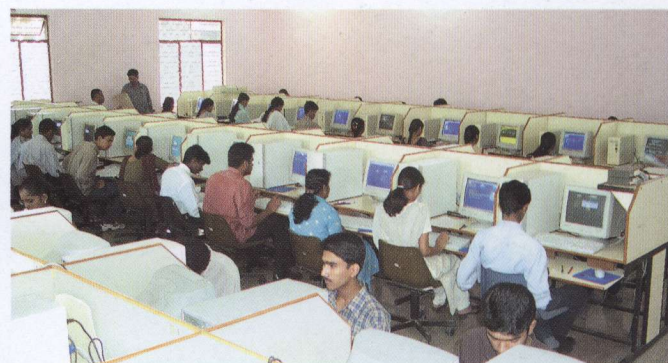

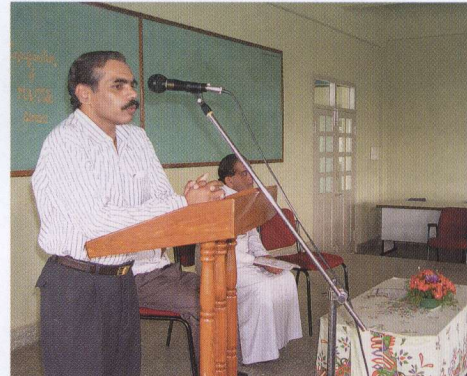

The students secured 4 ranks in the Bangalore University Exams.





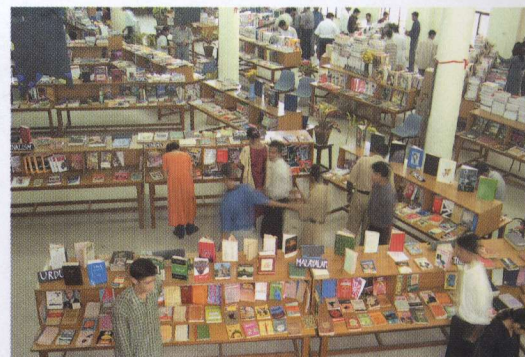
# BA (Communicative English)

The academic year 2001-2002 commenced with an orientation programme on Christite values, model code of conduct and course requirements by Prof. Suniti Phadke.

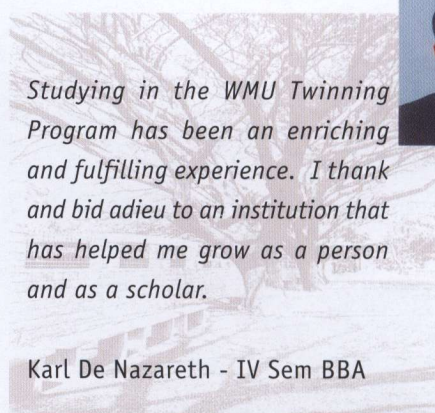
Some of the workshops/seminars held during the year were:

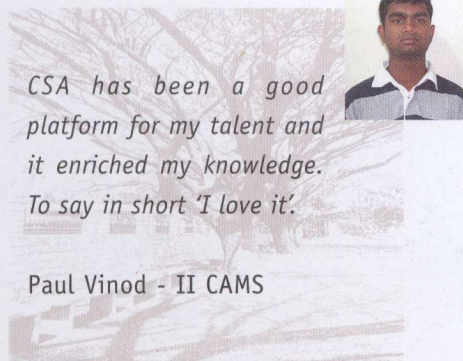
## Child Development Programme

## Socio-Economic Development Programmes

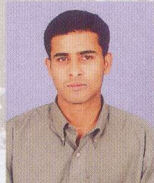

The No.2 Coy aims at marching ahead with the Vision and Mission of the college and the motto of NCC "UNITY AND DISCIPLINE."

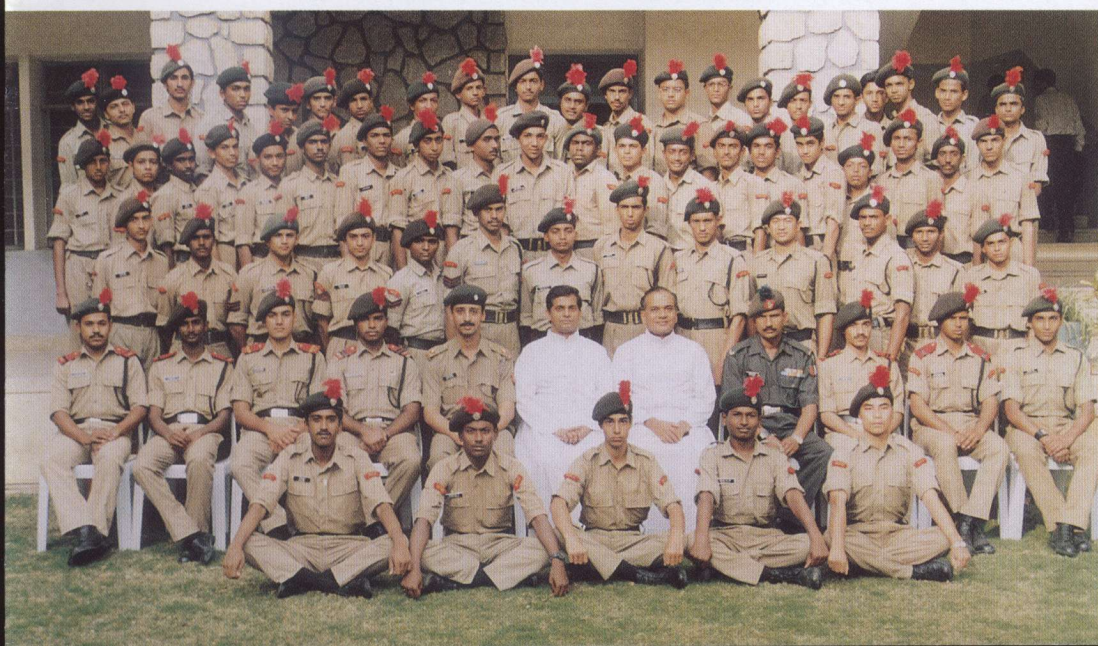

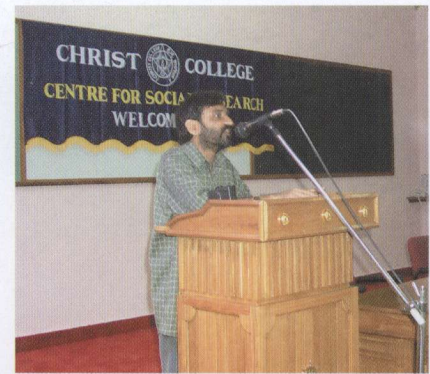
## Research Studies

The Centre for Social Research (CSR) was involved in two studies during the last academic year. An educational study was taken up on "Comparative Perceptions of students towards ISC and PUC pattern of secondary education in India."

ActionAid, the British NGO has commissioned CSR to undertake the analysis of the data collected by the organization on 'Untouchability Practices in Rural Karnataka'. Postgraduate sociology students were co-opted as research assistants in these studies.

## Seminars/ Workshops

The most significant event this year was the hosting of the International Cultural Studies workshop on *Culture/Political Theory/Activism* in association with Centre for Study of Culture and Society, Bangalore. 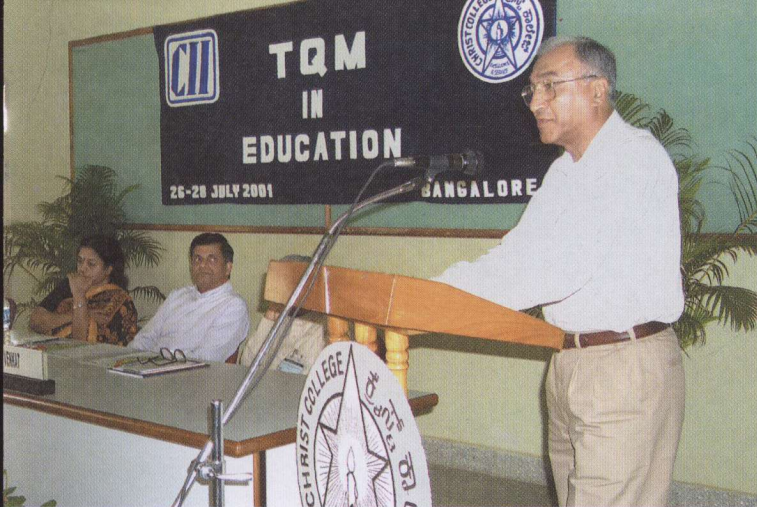


## Study Programmes

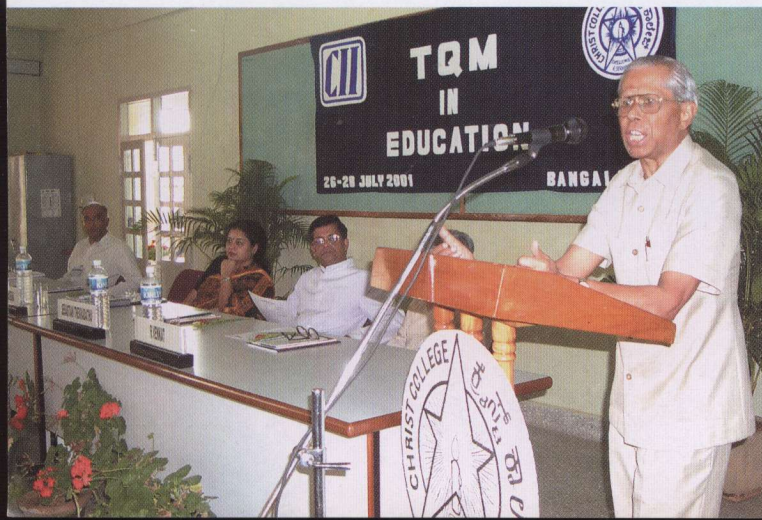

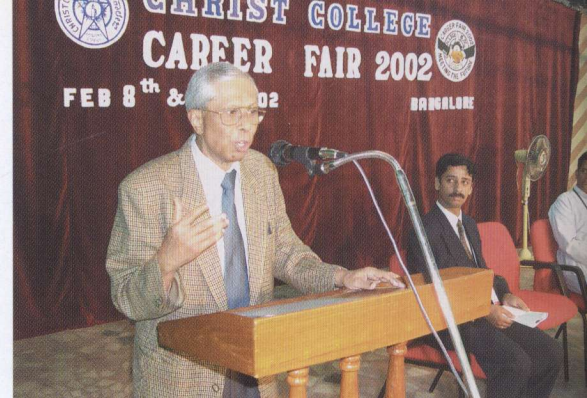
# Career Fair

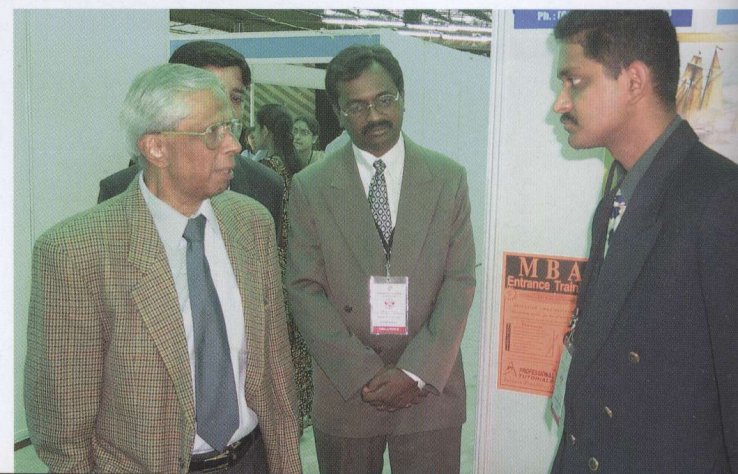

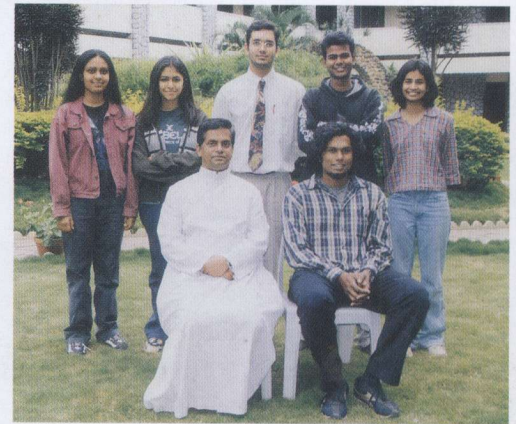

music competitions at IIT Mumbai and IIT Chennai. The Dance team also had a similar track record.



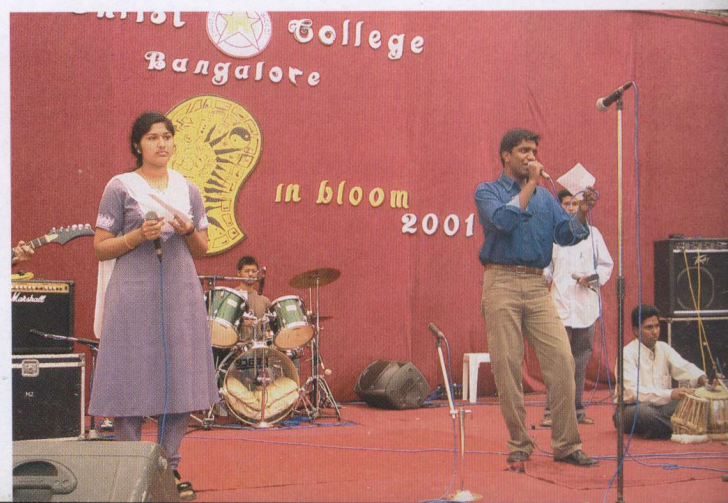

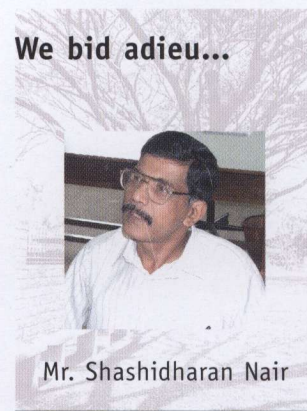
## NON-TEACHING STAFF

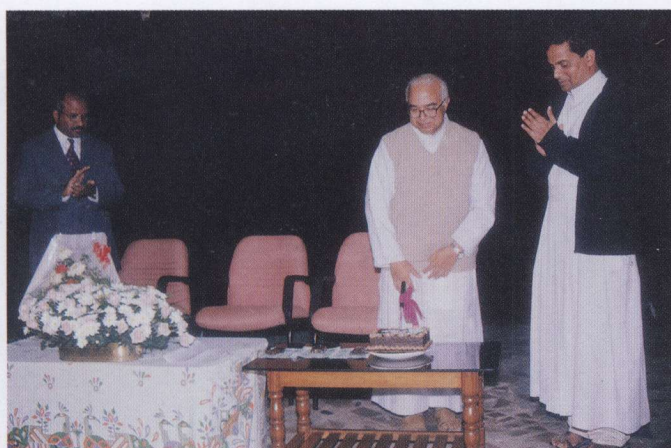
