
Our college has the rare distinction of being the first college in Karnataka to be accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), an independent Council under UGC.







# Principal's Report

## Thirty-Fourth Annual Report (2002-2003) Presented at the College Day

Ms Vineesha Ann Raj of III B.A. went to Sundfolk College, Norway as Fredskorps volunteer through CSA. Cadet Benny Thomas of I JPEng took part in Republic Day Parade through NCC and was selected for the Youth Exchange Programme at London. Ms Peroline Prunier of the University of Lille, France was the visiting student and French Assistant.

Faculty Development: Under the aegis of the Centre for Education beyond Curriculum (CEDBEC), various in-house faculty development programmes were organized including one-day orientation at Gold Coin Club on June 29, 2002. The core group and faculty coordinators spent a whole day discussing the holistic education modules camping at Jyotir Bhavan, Carmelaram. CEDBEC organised workshops on Team-Building Skills for Educational Administrators, Developing Strategic Mindset for Excellence in Higher Education and an year-long course in Lifeskills Education. The Quality Summit organised at Tata Auditorium jointly with CII Quality Institute was inaugurated by Hon'ble Minister for Higher Education Mr G Parameshwar. Ms Mayamma, Mr Shaji Varghese, Mrs Geetha KA, Mr Bhuvan, Mr Vinod, Mrs Sunithi Phadke had curricular and co-curricular overseas assignments this year.

Centre for Social Action (CSA) is going through a phase of rapid growth and expansion. Community Centre at Kenchanpalya was inaugurated by Mrs. Motamma, Hon'ble Minister for Women and Child Welfare. The voluntary support of children from Rajendranagar slum, skill training and capacity building programmes like blood donation, vocational skill training, self-help groups, housing projects, rural camps, funding collaboration with CIDA, FVTF, IGSS, ADER and FREDSKORPSET are here to testify about the life and activity of this centre.

The academic session commenced for the senior classes from June 17, 2002. We have a student strength of 3050 in undergraduate programmes, 387 in Masters Programmes, 108 in Twinning Programmes with Western Michigan University, USA and Assumption University, Thailand, and 797 students doing their evening courses under Twinning agreement with Pondicherry University. Excluding evening students we have 3545 students out of which about 1620 are girls. The grand total for the Degree College is 4342. Teaching staff for the year is 168 and the non-teaching staff has the strength of 81.

New Courses and Programmes: B.Com with Travel and Tourism was introduced with UGC assistance from this year. Twinning Programme with Assumption University, Bangkok was also introduced from this year to add yet another leaf to the international collaboration and wider student choices. India Window Programme of Sung KongHoe University of South Korea was started for the first time for Korean students. Centre for Career Advancement started courses to enable students of Christ College and others to get trained for IAS and other civil services examinations.

Results and Achievements: The results of university examinations were excellent with many of our students bagging ranks. We are getting closer to our primary target of 100% results in all subjects and then look forward to the next level of 100% first class in all subjects. To mention the important rank holders: Soujanya Ram Athreya — 3<sup>rd</sup> Rank, Annie P Mathews — 4<sup>th</sup> rank and Gold Medal for the highest marks in Mathematics in Bangalore University, Meenakshi Sundaram K — 5<sup>th</sup> rank, Sheeja C.J. —6<sup>th</sup>, Achut Mallya — 7<sup>th</sup>, - all in B.Sc. examinations; Niharika Nihalani 2<sup>nd</sup> and Shweta Maheshwari 3<sup>rd</sup> and Nidhi Jaipuria 4<sup>th</sup> ranks in BBM; Vinataa Hariram — 2<sup>nd</sup> and Preeti G T — 4<sup>th</sup> ranks in BHM; Rathipriya — 1<sup>st</sup>, Kannan K-2<sup>nd</sup> and Shamima Akhtar —4<sup>th</sup> ranks in MTA; Hassanali Khairun-nisa H — 1<sup>st</sup> rank in MCA with Gold Medal. Congratulations to all the rank holders.

Centre for Social Research also took up studies and surveys for various agencies and for our own projects. *Articulating Undergraduate Spaces* was an academic workshop organized in collaboration with Centre for the Study of Culture and Society in August 2002.

Centre for Publications launched three journals this year. Artha: Journal of Social Sciences, Ushus: Journal of Management and Mapana: Journal of Sciences were released on July 17<sup>th</sup> 2002 by Dr M.S.Thimmappa, Vice-Chancellor of Bangalore University. The traditional Kannada Sangha book release was held on January 31<sup>st</sup> 2003. Niluvu by Sri Lingaedevaru Halemane and two other small books, collection of poems and essays were published.

Placement Centre could find jobs for a few hundreds of undergraduate students apart from organising the two-day career fair open for all colleges of Bangalore. Placement in professional courses like MBA, MCA & BHM were nearly 100% through the departmental promotion and job-hunting activities.

Counselling Centre too worked in a very silent way through out the year providing us the soothing comfort of a healthy mind.





A series of talks, workshops and seminars were anchored by CCIM. Some of them are:




# MASTER OF TOURISM ADMINISTRATION








# POSTGRADUATE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY






A talk on 'Housekeeping, Costing and Operations' by Mrs. Jayashree, Executive House Keeper of St. Marks Hotel was held.

The academic year began with celebrations at the inauguration of the Psychology Association in July 2002. Juniors were welcomed in the month of August.




The year ended with a solemn farewell, to the seniors but was accompanied by the appointment of the new office bearers of the Psychology Association for the year 2003-04.



Our students participated and won prizes in the inter-collegiate competitions organized by various city colleges.










III CME

The mathematics students participated in various competitions like Mathematics Olympiad organized by Bangalore University, Samiksha –








20 final year CBZ students attended a one-day workshop on  $\emph{Bio-Informatics}$  on  $27^{th}$  July.







- Participated in Exodus 2003 MTA festival and bagged first prize for Mad Ads and Facial Painting and were placed fourth in the overall tally.





I express my gratitude to Christ College and all the individuals involved in the WMU twinning program for providing me with a solid foundation on which I can build my career.











#### TWINNING PROGRAMME





The annual Sanskrit fest 'Susamskruti' was held on 25th January, 2003, based on the theme 'Sasya Sanjeevini' in which







The Senior Wing (girls division) was started during this academic year. 55 girls have enrolled in this year. As part of adventure training, the cadets trekked to Savandurga.







ACS - (Foundation and Intermediate) for college going


