



OUR HISTORY

The congregation with a membership of more than 2000, renders service to humanity in educational, social, aims at integral development. The congregation has various institutions in Bangalore, namely, Dharmaram College - a seminary for the CMIs; Dharmaram Vidya Kshetram - an Ecclesiastical University which confers Degrees in Philosophy, Theology and Canon Law; Christavidyalaya - a Kannada Medium School; Christ English Medium School and Christ PU Residential College. Other institutions on campus are Christ Junior College, Christ College of Education and Christ College of Law.








Journey to Autonomous Status




13th September 2005, is a red letter day in the annals of the history of Christ College. With effect from that day, the college became autonomous and all the first year undergraduate and post graduate students became the first batch of Christ College (Autonomous) students.

Pursuant to the Government letter No. ED 214
JUNE 2005 dated 1-9-2005; Bangalore
University accorded Autonomous status to
Christ College. Under the autonomous system
the institution exercises independence from the
University in terms of syllabus and the conduct
and mode of examinations. The marks cards
will be issued by Christ College and the Degree
certificate will be awarded by Bangalore
University.



Message from **Principal**



Christ College was declared Autonomous on September 13, 2005, Autonomy in all first year under graduate & post graduate courses was implemented. First and second semester examinations were conducted and results declared within a month of the conduct of examinations.

The student strength rose to 5655 - 3988 students in Undergraduate courses, 594 students in Post graduate courses, 983 students in the evening twinning programme with Pondicherry University and 90 students in the various international twinning programmes.

The Academic year began on June 15, when orientation programmes were held for two days. A staff orientation programme was held on the 25th of June at Eagleton, the Golf Resort.

New Programmes/initiatives:

Two new post graduate courses, viz. Masters in Mathematics & Masters in Economics were introduced. The association of Company secretaries has recognized Christ College as one of the accredited centres. On the international arena, a new tie up with University of Wales, Swansea for twinning in under graduate Business education with the option to continue their Masters programme; a tie up with Ohio University for MBA programme in Christ College to commence from the next academic year and the Christ College Liverpool – Hope University –Institute of Business, Management & Leadership aimed at collaborative research between the faculty of the two institutions.

This year we have also started the Christ College of Education for B.Ed courses.

Results & Achievements

The following students have excelled in the Bangalore University examinations, 2005. Shashank V secured the 1st rank Nidhi Mohta – 3rd rank and Chandana Baruah – 4th rank in BCA. In BSc Sanjana Rao secured the 1st rank and Suman Prakash Das the 2nd rank They were also awarded the University Gold medals. Chandrika Kadur from BCOM secured the 9th rank. Grishma S M secured the 4th rank, Kavitha Mohandas & Aarti Iyer the 9th rank in BA. Snehal R secured the gold medal for journalism. Sheetal Balani from BHM secured the 1st rank & gold medal, Avin Thaliath the 4th





rank, and Sameer Badkaney the 5th rank. Dhanvinder Kaur Virdee of BBM secured the 1st rank.

Amongst our post graduate students, Kenath Arun of MSc Physics secured the 1st rank and the Gold medal; in MCA, Nisha Kurien secured the 1st rank & gold medal, Namratha Maheshwary the 4th rank, Soumya B the 5th rank; in MA Sociology, Mary Brigeet secured the 3rd rank and Vijay Lakshmi the 4th rank. Roberta D'costa of MTA secured the 3rd rank.

The National Cadet Corps of Christ College has been awarded the Best Institution award for 2004-05. Bejoy Isaac from 3rd CBZ represented India at the Youth Exchange programme in the United Kingdom. Sharron Garewal, Shubra Acharya & Rakesh Nair represented Karnataka & Goa Directorate at the Republic Day Camp, 2006. Esha K was selected to participate in the Thalsainik Camp.

Amrita Shastri of III BHM & Christopher Varghese of IV BHM were awarded scholarships from LaVatel Institute of Hospitality, France, for a two month internship in France.

Krittika Vishwanath from PSEco was invited to be part of the Solar generation Expedition programme, conducted by Greenpeace International. Sreyashi Ghosh from PSEnglish took part in the UNESCO sponsored Inter-generational conference: Human rights as a tool for Social change in Connecticut, USA.

The College choir won the Annual Basel Mission competition held in the month of December 2005. In various other intercollegiate programmes our students have come out on top and won the overall championships in most competitions.

Faculty achievements: The following faculty were awarded their PhD - Ms. Praphulla M V from the Sanskrit department, Mr. P.M Mathew from the Department of Economics, Fr. Varghese K J and Ms. Shalini Poddar from the Department of Psychology. Many faculty have completed their M.Phil' during the course of the current academic year.

The Centre for Social Action in collaboration with Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation conducted a national seminar on Child labour titled 'Escape to freedom' in February 2006.

Centre for Social Action: The Centre for Social Action continued with its activities of reaching out through its programmes for children, women and youth in the field of education, health & nutrition, vocational skill training, capacity building, income generation and natural resource management in 26 villages of Bangalore, 15 villages in Adilabad district of Andhra Pradesh and 4 slums in Bangalore. The Centre received two participants from Sundfolk College Norway and Jai Kumar of 3rd PSEnglish, Cheryl Clare of 3rd HEP, Renu Jacob of 3rd BCOM and Thomas Paul of 2nd BCOM are currently in Norway as part of the International Youth Exchange Programme with Sundfolk College, Norway.

Kannada Sangha & Centre for Publications: To commemorate the memory of Dr. Da Ra Bhendre, celebrated as 'Kavi Dina' this year two books were published which comprised of prize winning essays & poems contributed by students. The Sangha also assisted the Centre for Publications in the publication of 'Lokavirodhigala jate yali' by Dr. Rahamat Tarikere. The Centre also published further editions of the journals Artha, Ushus & Mapana.

Placement Centre: With near 100% placement in MBA, MCA & BHM, the institution is proud to state that companies that placed our students included Maersk-Sealand, Google, J P Morgan, Goldman Sachs, ITC Infotech, Taj, Cognisant, Jet Airways, KPMG, Axa, Accenture, Progeon, Mahindra British Telecom, Wipro, Acculogix. The annual Career fair, 'Crossroads' was held on 10 & 11 February, 2006 in partnership with Confederation of Indian Industry. As part of Crossroads, a separate programme called CEO's Speak was also organized where 10 CEOs from various industries interacted with the students.

Counseling Centre: The centre expanded to include 5 counselors and a medical practitioner. The Centre provides Academic counseling, personal counseling and admission

counseling. Several preventive health workshops were conducted human sexuality and ill effects of Tobacco use.

Student Welfare Office: The in house talent search programme, 'Darpan' and the inter-collegiate festival 'In-Bloom' were held with improved participation. Students won several trophies at various inter collegiate programmes.

Departmental Fests: All the departments conducted subject festivals to enhance the students learning in a spirit of competition. Some of the fests conducted were Prayas, Ushus, Interface, Exodus, Convergence, Eureka, Esprit, Alta Vista, Communiquere, Bhasha Utsav, Hat Com, etc.

Green Army: The Green army in association with project Agastya organized an Environment & Urban Ecology Week at Christ College, from Monday 26th September 2005 through Saturday 1st October 2005.

Alumni Association: The Association continued with its regular activities of honouring retired staff and providing scholarships for meritorious students and sportsmen. The family get together was held on 26th January 2006. The AGM was held on the 3rd Sunday in October, 2005. Besides these, a charity lunch was given to the children of Rajendranagar slum on the occasion of Christmas. Another initiative of the Alumni Association was to support all activities of various departments such as CSA, NCC, BHM & MTA by sponsoring of prizes and offering expertise in judging events.

Sports & Games: The football team won three of the four tournaments they participated. The Basket ball team won five tournaments. 
India Gateway Program – IGP a residential program for international students to learn the culture, history and tradition of India was organized for students of Assumption University, Bangkok, Thailand for a week.


SYNOSURE 2005 "be heard" is an inter-collegiate management fest organized for the first year students from



Pinakshi Talukdar, our ex-student from TISS was invited to acquaint the students with the Institute.










Industrial trips were organized for the third years to familiarize them to the world that lay ahead of them.




VALUE ADDED PROGRAMS


The Company won the Best Institution Trophy for the year 2004-05 among the Karnataka and Goa Directorate.




B.Com (Morning Batch)

More than 800 students from Christ College and other neighboring institutions were taken to the villages and exposed to the social realities.





Counselling Centre


The year 2005-2006 saw the Department grow further to include two more full time counselors making the services offered accessible to more students.




Cultural Extravaganza




Admin & Support Staff


