



Sighs of relief fill the air, as anxieties give way to applause. In three years the anxieties have been various for the management, the staff and the students. The applause and appraisals equally various.


The management responded to the (much awaited) autonomous powers with acceleration in its drive for formal efficiency and rationalization.

Growing from strength to strength

Another glorious academic year has come to an end. It is with a sense of overwhelming pride that we announce the passing out of our first batch of undergraduate students in 2008. In this calendar year, the number of students enrolled in various programmes of Christ College has shown an increase.

Our post graduate student strength rose to 1179 with 589 men and 590 women joining the various PG programmes in Science, Social Science and Management. The undergraduate strength was 4082 with 2520 boys and 1562 girls. 87 students were admitted to the International Twinning programmes and 2031 were admitted into the evening Twinning programme with Pondicherry University. The total strength of the College now stands at 7379.

And all these and more could be addressed only if the technological potent of the institute enables speedy connection of the academic, administrative and financial wings of the institute. The way Christ College technological upgradations have worked in this direction is to put modestly "commendable".

I. Internet

We have now six mbps leased-line internet connection in the campus. Every student and staff is given a username and password to streamline internet usage. Downloads and visit of non-academic sites are checked to ensure speedy connectivity to all in the college.

2. Telephone

Every department is provided with a telephone line which has direct incoming and intercom facilities. Out-going calls can be made using Telephone Cards from any telephone in the college. Further, Interactive Voice Response System (IVRS) is activated to provide basic information about the college, courses and daily events. It is an easy way for the students to check attendance updates and marks-related information.

3. Email

In addition to the departmental and class specific Email- IDs, all staff and students have also been given the same through the college webmail system. Each ID has a capacity of 6 GB. Calendar, documents and spread sheets, sites etc. strongly support academic interactivity in the college.





It offers B.Com Tourism and Travel Management, and is an IATA/UFTAA Authorized Training Centre for international travel and tourism training programmes.





Choices aplenty in evaluation practices



Under the autonomous system, the examination office exercises independence and innovation in all aspects of examination and evaluation. Unlike in the university stream, the student is evaluated on the basis of knowledge, skill, application, understanding of concepts and finally, creativity.

There is a continuous evaluation system that gives the student ample opportunity to scale the performance ladder. A unique feature of the evaluation system is that the student is awarded extra points for attendance. The pattern of CIAs (Continuous Internal Assessments) is such that a student's creativity is triggered in written as well as spoken areas of learning. The teacher's innovative abilities are also given due expression in this set-up.

The COE's office gives every student credit numerical value for each paper. Extra courses attended earn credit points. This application helps the student to a great extent when they go abroad for higher studies.

Under Autonomy, the Examination and Evaluation systems at Christ College have undergone a healthy change. From the performance perspective, the student stands to gain at every point, whether in the classroom assignments, or the final semester examination.

The evaluation system for the Mid-semester and the End-semester examination is transparent, unbiased and executed with a lot of care, caution and confidentiality. The centralized evaluation system is very organized and the results are announced within a month; the markscard is issued within 10 days after the results are announced.





In all, the entire department witnessed an eventful year with the students displaying great team work and exhibiting leadership qualities in the programmes conducted.









The freedom to experiment and evolve

The department of social work has undertaken several innovations under the autonomous system. The course is a blend of theory and practice. Both segments have seen a complete restructuring of the syllabus and introduction of major papers relating to communication, counseling, and disaster management. In fact the department is the only one of its kind in Bangalore to offer 'Disaster Management' as a specialization paper.

Faculty members have been experimenting with various teaching methods including extensive use of AV aids. Now the system has to further adapt itself to a more participatory mode. This of course requires teachers as well as students to be more updated about issues and enter the classroom very well prepared.

The department has an excellent mix of students by way of linguistic skills and cultural background. An all-India representation including foreign students is seen within the classroom. Teachers have the responsibility to mould all these students to function at a higher plane of learning. Article/research reviews, case study analysis and other forms of experiential learning have been introduced to augment the learning process. The teachers, under the autonomous system have been able to plan and design relevant course plans.

Apart from regular fieldwork of 15 hours per week, the department has also introduced extension activities in collaboration with the CSA. As part of the curriculum, this course includes organizing awareness campaigns and rural exposure camps for the students of the various departments of the college. These activities have further intensified during the last three years so that students gain a comprehensive understanding of the chosen social issues.

Around 55 teaching hours were spent in engaging students for each of the major papers. Similar practices were used for fieldwork supervision. Regular interaction with personnel in the various agencies has been insightful, and has greatly contributed to the improvement of the procedures followed during fieldwork.

Christ College has been offering master's degree in social work since 2004. The department has been actively engaged in upgrading its syllabi and teaching practices since the inception of autonomy.

Since the course demands a lot of practical exposure and onfield training, the department has consistently striven towards building a good relationship with all the leading industries/organizations in the city. It has succeeded in doing so while establishing a strong theoretical base in the classroom.

The syllabus is designed by the members of BOS which typically comprises all the faculty members of the department and a team of external members from different universities/colleges. The course is designed keeping its relevance and suitability to the present day society. The experience of the students during their field work and the emerging concepts/trends in related workplaces like CSR, concepts on developmental activities in human resources are kept in mind while designing / modifying the syllabus.

Similarly, the role of the teacher is also undergoing a transition. Perhaps, today it is measured more in terms of approachability and his/her ability to interact with the students apart from his/her mastery over the subject. A lecture can no more hold original meanings, as this can never be practiced alone be it in UG or PG classes. The students always look forward to interactive and 'fun filled' classes where the latter cannot be always possible.

The use of visual aids like LCD/OHP which was hitherto a choice, has almost become mandatory with the students.

It is a good learning place not only for the students but also for the teachers, each experience being so unique and enriching.



Initially, there were hiccups which any change automatically brings along with it. But we slowly got used to it (adaptation!) Initially, the teachers felt that work has increased stupendously. But each one of us realized that our work directly benefited our students. The assignments, projects, tests... It seemed endless..., but the light at the end of the tunnel seemed to say something different. Our students were definitely at an advantage compared to other students doing the same courses elsewhere.

Autonomy gave the teachers a chance to be creative and innovative in teaching. We had regular discussions on the different and innovative teaching methodologies adopted by various teachers. 

Autonomy, through my critical eye

After teaching the entire syllabi once, I am proud to look back and see what we have achieved. Now all of us can think, write syllabus for undergraduate and postgraduate courses. But we have to prepare ourselves for a new challenge. Our syllabus is our lifeline. To be creative, original and relevant, we need to read and update consistently. We need to build our library. With innovative testing patterns, our work load has increased. CIA's and other routine work cannot be ignored. When we do not have time to prepare for classes when do we read to update ourselves for writing new papers? A very valid question. But, unless we have cutting edge syllabus we can not survive. If we want to grow we have to challenge our students and stretch ourselves. Otherwise there is no point in being an autonomous institution.

As we compete with other autonomous institutions in the city we have to be aware of what is going on in Central Universities and research institutions. UGC has given instructions to Central Universities and research institutes to begin five years integrated postgraduate courses. When they begin such programs the creamy layer - which was the target of Christ College - will prefer these institutions. Unless we equip ourselves intellectually to compete with such challenges, we won't be anything but a mediocre institution. None of us can afford to cite work load as a reason not to grow, not to publish, not to do research.

Personally, I would like our syllabi to equip our students to deal with contradictions. We live in a city which is complex, competitive, and global and at the same time regional in a local and national sense. Students need different languages to negotiate with different layers of this city. If our syllabi could make them find their roots, anchors, identity as they deal with the rest of the world ... that would be ideal. I am not looking at this as an end but as an informing principle for our syllabi.

The result was an extensive thematic variety ranging from caste-class politics to cinema, art, music, mall and multiplex culture.


As a part of their project work, they had to select

a structure, religious or secular, to analyze and interpret its form, content, spatial arrangement as well as its ideological orientation if any. The structures selected for this, varied from Satya Sai hospital, Paying Guest accommodation, Begur

Nageshwara temple complex, St Mary's church to the design and layout of ones street. This project was continued with seven field studies. It began with a visit to the Meenakshi and Begur temple complex. The Buddhist centre, the Mahabodhi Society was visited to infer religious spatial arrangement and

identity. To sharpen the student's powers of observation and inference, various blocks of Christ College were taken up as study projects. The Daly

Memorial Hall and the Mythic Society libraries were the other field-study themes. A study tour was organized to Avani, in Kolar district, which is a 1200 year-old historical centre of Ganga Monuments. The second year students had Current Affairs Appraisal programme on an everyday basis. Clippings from various newspapers with specific reference to South, South East and Far East Asia were selected for reading. The emphasis was on politics, culture, economy and ideology, so that these would serve as a link to the early and late twentieth century studies of the region.


Department of Social Sciences and Languages - report

CERTIFICATE COURSES- REPORT

As in the previous year this year too we offered a number of certificate courses in both the semesters. A student is eligible to take up one certificate course per semester which fetches them two credits. In the beginning of each semester the office of certificate courses put up a list of courses offered in that semester indicating the fees ,timing , eligibility and maximum intake. Students apply for the courses in which they are interested in and are selected on a first-come-first-serve basis. In the next stage the selected students are asked to pay the fees. Once this is over the students are assigned to the department offering the particular course. In the odd semester we offered 25 courses which were taken up by 450 students. These courses were from science, humanities, commerce, management and languages streams. In the even semester we offered 22 courses, which were taken up by 380 students. In the coming academic year we are planning to introduce about 50 courses. All these courses are discussed and approved in the respective board of studies meetings.



The Placement Centre takes the initiative to explore new career avenues for graduates and post graduates through visits to new companies and unexplored sectors.


Campus recruitment
