



Our History

Christ University blossomed out of the educational vision of Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI). Blessed Kuriakose Elias Chavara founded this congregation in 1831. Blessed Chavara was a great educationist and a social reformer of the 19th century.

Christ University was formerly established in July 1969 as Christ College under Bangalore University. UGC conferred Autonomy to Christ College (No. F.13 -1/2004) on October 7, 2004. It became the first college in South India to be reaccredited with A+ by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in May 2005. UGC identified it as an Institution with Potential for Excellence in June 2006. Under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, Ministry of Human Resources Development of the Union Government of India, vide Notification No.F.9-34/2007-U.3 (A), declared Christ College as a Deemed to be University, in the name and style of Christ University on July 22, 2008.

Christ University is rooted in Gospel values and is committed to provide Holistic education through the development of intellectual competence, personal skills, inter-personal skills and societal skills. The University offers undergraduate and postgraduate courses in Humanities and Social Sciences, Pure Sciences, Commerce and Management, Law, Education as well as Engineering. Students from all over the country are admitted at Christ University in an environment of religious harmony and secularism.

Chancellor's Message

The theme of this year's annual souvenir of Christ University is Progress.

Progress in general can be characterized as a movement of a person, organization, institution, thing or event to a higher level; or to a better ambiance; or towards a superior goal. Thus progress in history, for example, would mean that the world becomes better in terms of the standard of living, quality of life, societal organization, social institutions, liberty, modernization, science, technology, etc.

Progress of a person means that he/she becomes a better human being, an enhanced person before God, before his/her fellow humans and before himself/herself. A better human being is the one who harmoniously blends in his/her life with personal integrity, healthy interpersonal rapport, social responsibility and a symbiotic relationship with nature; the one who pursues to excel in knowledge and wisdom with a passion for common good and faith in the supreme Being. The oft-quoted sentence of St. Irenaus, who, according to tradition, died in 202 as Martyr in Asia Minor, Homo vivens dei Gloria, "God's glory is man, fully alive" is relevant here. The message is clear. God is really glorified when the humans celebrate their life fully, dynamically and enthusiastically. Humans need to develop their capabilities, God-given talents, natural gifts, mental faculties and cultural aptitudes fully and radically. They should unfold their humanity fully and blossom into complete and wholesome human beings. God in his inscrutable providence bestows on humans the intellectual, mental and physical gifts and abilities in varying intensities and degrees. But each one has the responsibility to develop these gifts to the fullest, joyfully celebrate life on earth and progress into becoming a good human being. If this happens God is really glorified. On the contrary if a man/woman mismanages his/her life, develops negative attitudes and aptitudes, and thus makes his/her life barren, sterile and desolate, God becomes unhappy, and he/she turns out to be a burden to himself/herself, a sign of negativity, pessimism and despondency to others.

Existentialists say that there are two types of persons: persons of being and persons of having. Persons of being are those who possess a solid character anchored in moral values and spiritual principles, whose lives revolve around an intelligently ordered value system, who are noble in deeds and words, who hold fast to their convictions and worldviews in all circumstances and who always have a positive vision of life. They stand near to the sthita-prajna of the Gita (II.54-72). Persons of having, on the other hand, are those who possess material objects and values, whose lives revolve around these material possessions and who take pride in being endowed with mundane riches and resources.

Progress in life, therefore, means that we become persons who give glory to God, happiness to fellow human beings, and protection to nature. It also means that we become persons of being.

As an administrator he has taken up many important responsibilities like Prior General and Provincial of CMI Congregation, President of Dharmaram Vidya Kshetram, Chairman of Deepika (Malayalam Daily) etc. In his career as an academician, spanning several years, the Reverend has established many training centres for the religious as well as the lay people and has held various important positions at and has been associated with different organisations such as, Dharmaram Vidya Kshetram in Bangalore, Darsana Institute of Philosophy in Wardha, Centre for Spiritual Realisation in Pariyaram, Poornodaya Training Centre in Bhopal, Centre for the Study of World Religions and Chavara Institute of Indian and Inter-religious Studies (CIIS) in Rome.

An indelible part of the intellectual consciousness of many of his contemporaries, Rev. Dr. Fr. Aykara, has also been the editor of magazines and newsletters like the 'Journal of Dharma' in Bangalore, 'Third Millennium' in Rajkot and 'Jeevadhara' in Kottayam. The books he has authored, including, 'Meeting of Religions: New Orientations and Perspectives', 'Living Flame', 'Cosmic Consciousness: A Study of Teilhard de Chardin and Sri Aurobindo' and 'A Missiology for Third Millenium', have been a source of knowledge, wisdom and inspiration to many readers.

We hereby extend a hearty welcome to Rev. Dr.Fr. Thomas Aykara, the new Chancellor of our University, and eagerly look forward to his leadership while we are all set to move towards greater heights and farther destinations of academic excellence and intellectual glory.



 - Dance day as part of a 100+ team dance team.






Languages




FRENCH Departemnt


HINDI Department



Psychology






Philosophy



An inhouse magazine called "Inquiry" is in the making by the final year students of CBZ/BCZ combinations.
















GREEN ARMY






Faculty of Engineering



Office of Examinations

Interview with the COE

Q:How important or relevant are conventional tests and exams in the present day?

COE: Conventional examination system has not lost its flavour even now. It has its value. It is in conducting the exams properly. We are trying to make it as impartial as possible. One way of ensuring that is by giving more freedom to teachers and students by reposing faith in them. The system of 50% CIA at our university is one step towards that. Though one may suspect chances of misappropriation, it is an open and transparent system. We even hold open book and online exams. Technology too is used to the possible extent.

Q: Considering that testing and evaluation patterns have evolved over the years, could you tell us more about the progressive practices such as open book and online exams that have been adopted at our university in recent times?

COE: Open book exams are used at the PG level. Online exam is being used for additional courses like "The Indian Constitution" and other value added courses. Holistic Education exam too is conducted online. One great disadvantage here though is that descriptive questions cannot be used to a large extent.

Q: In future could this kind of testing pattern be used for other subjects as well?

COE: Yes, it is possible. There are software firms which could help us in this regard. For instance answers from conventional answer books could be uploaded on to the system from where teachers could assess them online. But how far it is practical is to be found out. Teachers need to be specially trained for it too.

Q: Is it possible to have practical components in testing with regard to every subject or is it limited to just a few?

COE: Traditionally practical exams were conducted only for science subjects. But now other departments like Media studies and Psychology too hold practical exams. However it may not be possible to conduct practical exams for all subjects in a conventional sense. For instance, practical exams in History may not be possible in the same sense as in Psychology where



models for testing and assessment are already in place.

Q: Could you tell us about the Question Bank and how successful it has been?

COE: the Question Bank generates the question paper for the ESE. Teachers check the question paper just before the start of the exam. It has been noticed that the number of errors in the question paper is lesser now compared to the earlier system. Another advantage of the question bank is that there are no chances for out-of-the-syllabus questions and that it is totally impartial as it has wiped out the concept of "more important questions" and "less important questions". It has been working well except for a few instances of overlapping questions. It also means extra work for the teachers with respect to modifications that need to be made in the Question Bank every year.

Q: Do teachers come forward with suggestions and ideas to bring about changes in the examination system?

COE: Yes, any idea that comes from teachers' experience is taken into consideration, especially the teachers who have exposure to innovative practices in other universities in India and abroad do give us suggestions, and whatever is practically possible is incorporated into the system. For instance the credit system that was adopted when we got autonomy was based on our experience with the Twinning Programme with Western Michigan University that started in 1997. It follows the grading pattern on a scale of 4 points.

Q: Is the Office of Examination open to response and feedback from the students and the parents?

COE: We have a student council where students are allowed to express their views freely Practical

suggestions given by them are often taken into consideration.

During the PTA meeting parents give their feedback and voice out their concerns which are taken into consideration.

Q: As the COE what is the message you would give to our students, considering that exams are just a means and not an end in itself?

COE: Students should give equal importance to both CIA and ESE. If they take CIAs lightly there are chances

of them losing a year as they get an opportunity at betterment of CIA marks only after the completion of the course. Attendance too should be taken seriously as they get marks for it. Also there should be a good and healthy interaction between the teachers and the students even outside the classroom to ensure better understanding.

Finally, tests and exams are not just a means to assess the students' performance for successful completion of the course, but it also prepares them for life. The problems and difficulties they encounter here make them ready to face the challenges of the world later.

in the ceremony.



Counselling Centre






The Inaugural Holy Mass for the year was held in June 2010. A two-day leadership camp was held for all volunteers in July, 2010.

National Cadet Corps
















Centre for Research

Center for Research was established at Christ University in the year 2008 to nurture and nourish the research talents. The centre has MOU with many research foundations.

At present there are 55 PhD scholars doing research in ten disciplines. There are thirty seven empanelled guides supervising the PhD Scholars.

PhD courses start in the month of August / September of every academic year. Six months course work is compulsory and the classes are held between 5.00pm and 7.00pm. Eighty five percent attendance is compulsory.

The humanities group is trained in SPSS package and the science Group in 'Mat lab' and 'Origin' with hands on experience. Term paper submissions ,paper presentations, participation in colloquia and national conferences are compulsory. Some of our Ph.D scholars have already published articles in international journals.




Student Welfare Office


