The Vice Chancellor





ENGLISH



The Department of English organizes the screening of a visual text every year for the first year students. "The Pianist", a feature film, was screened on Tuesday, 04 February 2014 in the Main Auditorium. The movie was followed by a presentation and a question answer session.

Mr Prabhas Pandith, (faculty, Department of English, AIMS, Bangalore) an acclaimed scholar of Sanskrit drama, presented to both the undergraduate and postgraduate students of English Studies, a comprehensive account of Natya, an ancient Indian treatise on the performing arts, encompassing theatre, dance and music, where emphasis was maintained at the essentials of these arts, especially drama. The Department of English hosted a talk by renowned British writer Adam Foulds in association with Granta and the British Council and students of I CEP and TCE took part in the deliberations and discussions with English Honours and M.A students. Students of ELT (Elective) were introduced to Teach for India and given an orientation about internships available for students. The final year JP and PEP students attended a talk on 'Writing the Feminine' by Shikha Malaviya, organized as part of Corpus, one-day workshop on gender discourses.

The Honours in English Studies programme, true to its dynamic standards, had a host of diverse events organized, addressing a variety of objectives. The students were taken on a three-day Field trip to Dandeli-Anshi Tiger Reserve in July as part of their Ecological Discourses and Practices course and gained a close understanding of human-animal conflict contexts, bioregionalistic pressures, diversity of flora and fauna in the Dandeli forests, etc. Later, on a nippy September morning, they were taken on a Bird-watching session to LalBagh. They had workshops arranged on Gender Discourses – Corpus; Close Reading Fictional texts; Film Appreciation; Bio Mapping; and





Teaching English Language through Theatre. Guest lectures on Iron Smelting and Indian Environmental History, Gender and Mythology, On Ethics, On Environmental Concerns in Koodankulam, were organized. Jabberwocky – the Annual Literary Fest and Chautuaqua – the Intercollegiate Poetry Out Loud Fest, enabled the student community to explore cocurricular terrains.

This year's National Seminar Maya Bazaar – Re-viewing 100 Years of Indian Cinema had a rich and diverse set of resource people - Mr. S. Theodore Bhaskaran, Film Historian; Mr. C. S. Venkateswaran, Film Critic & Documentary Film maker, Ms. Bina Paul, Film Editor, Mr. Jaideep Varma, Writer and Film maker, Mr. Gnani Sankaran, Writer and Mr. Rajesh, Script Doctor.

It was an eventful year for the M.A. English with Communication Studies, with the department fest, National seminar *Mayabazar* and much more. 'Coffee Hour' saw guest lectures by artists such as Charles Ma (classical dancer) and Simon Lamour (graphic artist) 'Srujana' -Teaching in the Slums program in collaboration with the Centre for Social Action had students of I year M.A. conduct classes each Saturday afternoon. This year in keeping with the University's commitment to digital teaching/ learning, the II MA's produced a series of short films "Ajji's Learning English" to be used as teaching material in the Srujana classrooms.

The Quill's Will team published 4 online issues of the newsletter. A series of guest lectures on the 'The Great Indian Novel'was organised by II MA. The speakers were His Excellency, Ambassador Muthukumar, Prof Chengappa, Prof Gerard Rassendran, Prof Sindhujaa Iyengar and Prof Susan Andrade (Fulbright Scholar). The themes ranged from the economic fesibility of the Indian novel to the Emegency and its impact on the Indian Novel

In all, the Department of English, along with nurturing the existing activities, has spearheaded events in this academic year which have opened boulevards to making the experience of being in Christ University truly a holistic experience.

Students of MS in communication also participated in a workshop on food photography on February 28, 2014.




LANGUAGES




Wikipedia team. On 15 February, 2014, Inter class competitions were held as part of Susamskriti. Students participated joyfully and baggedprizes.



HISTORY

The Department of History inaugurated its series of seminars from the month of June by organizing a lecture session on 26June in Assembly Hall, Block-2 from 12 noon. This academic year was titled as "Retrieval of History". To set the pace of its launching program, "Explorations", Dr. T.M. Keshava from Archaeological Department of India was invited. His second session "Excavations" was held in Mini Auditoriumon 4thJuly.Further,in collaboration with English Department a lecture session was organized in Central Block on 10July, titled as "History through literature and Narratives" and was presided by Dr.Abhaya who discussed about various creation myths of the Earth when finally on 12July her second session was held at Panel Room, Block 2. Apart from this, on 25 July in Conference Hall, Block-2, alecture was held titled "Retrieving History through Theatre" presided by Dr. Prakash Belawadi, Co founder of Centre of Film and Drama. A documentary screening program on 23 August was organized for the students, titled as "Days That Shook the World". Two student seminars were also conducted. First as "Instability in Asia" took place on 28 August in Assembly Hall, Block-2 where Dr. Yong, Korean Teacher, obliged to be the chief guest. Second Student Seminar-"Cold War and its effects on the then society" was held on 5 September in Central Block where Dr.M.K.Singh honored to be the presiding member. Apart from this, an in-class presentation was held on 12 September where SafiullahNaseri,2nd Year,EPS student presented a paper"Afghanistan". Further, in collaboration with Archaeological Survey of India ,student campaign on 19th November for World Heritage Week was



organized to spread awareness of rich heritage and ancient monuments worldwide. This week long celebration, paused with exhibition on 25-26 November in Central Block titled as Archaeological Findings and Monuments and two day National Seminar on South Indian Archaeology on 25-26 November which focused on Pre-History, Mesolithic, Neolithic, Chalcolithic, Megalithic, Architecture of South India, Archaeological excavations of Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Marine Archaeology, Archaeological excavations and Roman trade with India where presenters(historians, scholars, academicians, renounced lecturers) from across the nation presented their papers. Finally, on 19December,Mr. Sudeesh, CPO, AzimPremji University gave a guest talk on Social Sciences-Its Relevance and Applications.

With this, the Department winded its activities up in the month of February for the academic year 2013-14.

POLITICAL SCIENCE



The Dept. of Political Science combines classroom teaching with other activities that provides students with political exposure. Students gain an in-depth knowledge of political theory and the practical applications of political principles. This approach equips them to better understand the nuances of political dynamics. As part of these initiatives, The Department of Political Science sent four students from the 6 semester to the *Institut d'études politiques de Paris* i.e. Sciences Po, Paris as a part of an exchange program. Practical activities ensure that

students understand certain concepts and theories better. Keeping this in mind, On 23, 24 August, the final year students of HEP(History, Economics, Political Science) and EPS (Economics, Political Science, Sociology)were taken to an overnight rural camp in Kolar to study local governance. The department has also initiated a working paper on electoral reforms. Apart from this the Department also comes out with e-journal by the students of Political Science called *Avalokana*which means 'Outlook'.



PHILOSOPHY

The first year students of Bachelor of Philosophy, Master in Philosophy, and Licentiate in Philosophy were initiated into the new academic session on 4 June 2013. Prof. Dr. Saju Chackalackal, President of DVK and Dr. Jose Nandhikkara, Dean of the Faculty of Philosophy accorded warm welcome to the freshers in the function organized at the JBC Auditorium. Rev Fr. Raju Akkara, introduced the students to the wonders of life and philosophy. The One day session was held at Multimedia Hall, DVK Central Library on 5 June. The Vice Chancellor, Rev Dr Thomas C Mathew also welcomed the freshers into the world of philosophical investigations. The Department of Philosophy, also orgainsed, under the leadership of Fr John Neelankavil, , the Paul Wiegelmann Annual Lectures, on Environmental Studies, on 14 August 2013. Ms Bhargavi S. Rao spoke on Rejuvenating lakes, rivers, wells and ensuring water security. As a person committed to Environmental Education, Environmental health, Biodiversity, and an activist on environmental issues Bhargavi S. Rao addressed the various aspects of environment especially related to waterbodies.


Dr. JojoParecattil organised a programme on 7 Septemebr 2013 in collaboration with the Centre for Dalit/Subaltern Studies, New Delhi in which the *Journal of Subaltern and Cultural Theology* was launched. Three other books, *Rethinking Theology in India*, *DBC Volume 10: Ezra*, *Nehemiah and Tobit& DBC Volume 13: Proverbs and Ecclesiastes* and *Christians of Scheduled Caste Origin In India: A Study of Their Socio-Economic*, *Cultural and Political Status* were released.

Dharma Endowment Lectures 2013-2014 was by Prof Dr Gerald J. Pillay Vice-Chancellor and Rector at Liverpool Hope

University, UK on 7-8 January 2014. The title of the series of lectures, "How Can We Sing the Lord's Song in a Strange Land?" came from the concern of Jews expressed while they were in exile. The lectures reflected on a similar alienation felt by believers today who, in the face of secularism, often are withdrawn, defensive, and even intimidated. A special session for the members of the staff was arranged on Thursday 7 January, 2014, followed by dinner.

On Thursday, 21 November, 2013, the department celebrated World Philosophy Day with a seminar on Religion and Ethics. Besides the staff and students from the Department of Philosophy there were also participants from the Faculty of Philosophy, DharmaramVidyaKsheram, De Paul Institute of Philosophy and Pushpasram Institute of Philosophy and Religion. There were six papers examining the interface of religion and ethics. The seminar was concluded with a challenging and fruitful Panel Discussion. Prof Alex Thannippara and Dr JojoParecattil were the directors of the Department Seminar.

The annual Philosophy Day celebrations were held on 4 February, 2014 at Pastor Herbert Kringe Auditorium, Dharmaram Research Centre. Prof Dr Saju Chackalackal, President DVK presided over the function. The teachers were thanked and appreciated (Gurudin), the parents and guardians were felicitated (Pitr-Matrdin), the outgoing students were given a warm send-off and students from all batches performed a variety of entertainment programmes which were both enjoyable and thought provoking (Satīrtyadin).



PSYCHOLOGY

The Psychology association is a student body comprising of representatives from all the undergraduate and postgraduate Psychology classes. The association is guided by faculty members and aims to promote curricular and extracurricular activities related to Psychology. The governing body of the association consists of a president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer. The three major events organized for the year 2013-14 were:

Street play competition for the first year students was held on 30-8-13

Singing competition for the second year UG students was held on 29-11-13

Exhibition for all UG & PG students was held on 13-12-13

Research paper presentations for third year undergraduate students were held on 30-11-12



Among the initiatives of community service, the department organized an annual workshop for school teachers on 15 and 16 November 2013. The resource persons for the workshop were the faculty members of the department of psychology who shared their expertise and knowledge with the community of school teachers. The theme of the workshop was creating positive learning spaces: Recognizing diversity and Enhancing student empowerment.

The Department of Psychology organized a three day workshop on Restoring Safety to the Shattering of the Trauma from June 17th-19th, 2013. Thirty Three participants representing a cross-section of counselors, students and others who had a keen interest in therapy through art attended the workshop. The facilitator for the workshop was Dr. Kate Donohue, Registered Expressive Arts Therapist from California.

As a part of its commitment to community initiative and service, department supported the awareness rally against drug abuse and illicit trafficking by participating in the event.64 undergraduate PSEng (Psychology, Sociology, English), Honours (Psychology) and postgraduate students of the Department of Psychology volunteered to participate in the rally. The rally commenced at 3.00 pm, and involved a 1- km

awareness walk from the Police Wireless Headquarters on M.G. Road. The students were provided with placards, stickers, caps and t-shirts with slogans.

The National Seminar on *Living Well: Grounding Positive Psychology in Practice* was held on January 20, 2014. 35 participants consisting of postgraduate students, research scholars, teaching faculty and practitioners took part in the seminar. The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Navin Kumar, Associate Professor, University of Delhi. His talk centred around the influence of mass media on youth. The panel discussions that followed were on the broad theme of *Positive psychology in Clinical Practice* and mental health.

The fifth Workshop for Teachers and Educators was organized by the Department of Psychology on November 15-16, 2013 at Christ University. The workshop provides a common platform for schools teachers, administrators and counsellors to discuss various issues related to current trends and research in the field of Educational Psychology. This year 27 participants registered for the workshop and consisted of middle and high school teachers and administrators from schools across Bangalore and teacher trainees from the School of Education, Christ University. The theme for this year was Creating Positive Learning Spaces and focused on two contemporary topics namely – Diversity in schools and classrooms and Student Empowerment.

The Department also organized a three-day workshop on the Therapeutic Process of Psychoanalysis, from October 16-18, 2013. 
has come to spotlight again. Another panel dicussion on the topic 'Political Nitty Gritty on the Economy of India' was organised on

g) Blossoms Theatre Festival

The idea of Blossoms was to make every student of the University – creatively alive. Everyone participates to "Be the Best". Every individual is uniquely gifted and Blossoms allows the space for that gift to be expressed in a non-threatening environment. As a collective endeavor with those who study together this drama opportunity gives students and faculty to bond together and showcase their thought processes as a



deanery. With the freedom to work as per deanery orientation and time-table - this platform brings together students who otherwise might go unnoticed in the large academic backdrop of the University. Blossoms Theatre Festivalexposes deanery talent in the field of drama through the Proscenium and Street Theatre formats.

h) Founder's Day

For the first time short stories from across the globe highlighting the values of Blessed Chavarawere chosen. Done using elements of dance, shadow and acting the presentation introduced the concept of short play presentation to the young audience members of Christ Junior College. 5 stories were presented as a follow up to the visual representation of Blessed Chavara's life and achievements. The drama students of Christ Junior College had an opportunity to imbibe and impart the teaching of the Founder in a unique manner which touched the hearts and minds of the audience.

i) National Theatre Festival-Baptizer 2014

North, South, East, West - Baptizer is an opportunity for theatre

teams from across the country to be part of this National Theatre Festival. With script screening being an integral part of this festival the aim is always to provide a platform for plays which highlight human values. Clowns, Ghosts, Professional Teams....workshops for students ...the year 2014 has seen the best of Baptizer participation till date. Teams which had taken part only in Proscenium/Street Theatre format were guided to explore both formats to expand their capabilities and look at the possibilities of creative expression.

j) Class room productions

Theatre Lab a place where one can experiment with ideas and concepts was introduced by the Performing Arts Department. Class room productions are an outcome of this ideation. The drama class and corridor spaces have become vibrant with creative energies drawing people at least 12 times in a year to experience the magic of intimate theatre. Be the story of a thief or what happens in one's imagination the basic tools of theatre are brought together by the students of Performing Arts. As a full time undergraduate program students are encouraged to stumble



upon their theatrical truths with original texts as well as classics. Peer learning and feedback under faculty guidance is the cornerstone of this initiative.

k) Departmental Theatre

How can a student who has not enrolled for a drama program enjoy the benefits of this field. Departmental Theatre was introduced to provide basic orientation and exposure to those students and departments who want to use the tools available through drama. Over the years teams have represented the department, deaneries and University – thanks to this initiative. B Com Tourism, Management Studies and Department of Commerce were the front runners this year. These three teams accounted for more than 15 shows during the academic year apart from winning competitions.

1) Certificate Courses

Investment and returns, principals of finance, business models, these are just few of things which a student of Art Entrepreneurshipis exposed to. Introduced as a certificate program this is an emerging filed for those interested in merging art and business. Proscenium Theatre certificate program with its practicality of staging a performance introduces all students to the basics of drama. Script, Lights, Costumes, Make up, Sets, Props...every aspect is incorporated into a play. Without the stress of exam students are allowed to grasp those aspects of a play production which appeal to them the most. Playback Theatre certificate program is a launch pad for the actor. Creative games, exercises and stories bind the playback actors and team to the international network of Playbackers around the world.

m) International Trainers – Insights, Workshops and Performances

A theatre performance by Ronald Rand from USA, a mime performance by Marcus Schmidfrom Switzerland, and a Playback Theatre workshop by Joke Rood (Holland) and Karin Gisler (Switzerland). These three were the practical highlights of the year 2013-14. Guidance by John Bennett - Department of Drama - Liverpool Hope University on curriculum orientation gave academic teeth to ensure that the drama at Christ University keeps developing as per global standards.

n) Performances Outside campus

Vellore, Goa and Mumbai were exposed to Christ University brand of theatre as teams from the University took their enthusiasm and energy to theatre related events in these parts of the country. As part of youth theatre initiative these exposures gave ample opportunity to students to compete and collaborate with the creative best in the field of drama. With more than 20 teams in the University campus the exposure was open to not only the best teams but also to those who had the drive to collaborate and willingness to learn. A noticeable aspect of these performances is the attraction towards a competitive format of drama with the desire to be the best. Trophies from Bangalore,





Goa and Mumbai stand as a testimony to these initiatives.

o) Television

As part of the practical's of Art Entrepreneurship certificate program and Departmental Theatre program students performed for the camera. Divine Vision channel for their initiative of 'Noel Fest' and Channel V for the 'India Fest' were the platforms Christ University students utilized to rise up to their dramatic potential. Performing for the camera with close-ups and retakes was a unique experience for all those who qualified for these events. National and International exposure apart from a video documentary proof was the reward for this effort led entirely by the student community.

o) School and Corporate outreach

From a department perspective the aim to reach out to a larger community has ensured that developmental drama touched a few schools and corporate houses. PERFORMING ARTS



CHEMISTRY



Department of chemistry offers four UG programmes PCM, CBZ, BCB, BCZ and two MSc programmes with specialization in Organic and Analytical chemistry. The department also offers MPhil and PhD programmes in chemistry. 7 certificate courses are offered to take care off for the overall development of the students. These courses provide quality education at affordable costs and enable them with the required qualities for research and employment in relevant industries and institutes.

The Chemistry Association of the department was inaugurated on 26 July 2013 by Dr. Chandrabhas Narayana, CPMU, JNCASR, Bangalore and he delivered a talk on "Chemistry-Challenges and opportunities". An Intercollegiate science fest "Chemoz" was organized by the department on 29 August 2013 to inculcate scientific temper, event management skills and social interaction skills among our students. Final year MSc Chemistry students visited Anthembio Sciences Ltd Bangalore on 2 September 2013. Students got an opportunity to understand the instrumentation and working of NMR spectroscopy and GCMS. Second year B.Sc. students visited Karnataka Soaps and Detergents Ltd., final year B.Sc. PCM and CBZ students visited Apotex pharmachem Ltd. and BCB and BCZ students visited Biocon Ltd. as a part of industrial visit. All faculty members visited JNCASR, Jakkur Bangalore on 9 Oct 2013.

A News letter "Chemunique", was released in the month of January 2014.

The Two day Workshop on 'Advances in Chemical Sciences' was Organized by Department of Chemistry, In association with Karnataka Science and Technology Academy, Bangalore on 12-13 September 2013 and two day workshop on Recent advances in Spectroscopy in association with Indian academy of sciences on 28 february and 1 of March 2014. These kind of programmes provide a great opportunity to meet and interact with the



scientists of renowned institutions.

Department of Chemistry, Christ UniversityIn association with National Science and Technology Entrepreneurship Development Board Department of Science & Technology, Government of India, New Delhi Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India, Ahmedabad organized Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp for the final year undergraduate science students.

Final year MSc students won second prize in intercollegiate quiz competition conducted by IISc, Bangalore during Feb 2014.

Special lecture sessions on topics related to Stereochemistry by Dr. M. A. Pasha, Prof. of Chemistry, Bangalore University and Neutron Activation Analysis by Dr.Gulshan Relhan Nuclear Analytical Chemist Rtd from BARC, Mumbai have been organized by the department for final year M.Sc. students. On 15 Feb 2014 Dr. Ganesh Sambashivam CSO, Anthembiosciences addressed the final year B.Sc PCM,CBZ,BCB and BCZ students on carrer opportunities in chemistry.

A five day quality Improvement programme for the faculty members was organized by the department from 18 to 22 March 2014. The department also organized two batches of INSPIRE science camp for class 11 students from various colleges in and around Bangalore.

The department organised campus recruitments for the post graduate students with reputed firms like Apotex Pharmaceuticals Pvt Ltd., Bangalore, Aten Biotech Ltd., Anthem Biosciences, Bangalore and Medriech Pharmaceuticals Pvt Ltd., Bangalore.







The Botany Curriculum is designed to suit the industry and global competency, with the latest topics o ntissue culture technology, Agriculture, Ethnobotanical foundation, Genetic engineering technology, phytochemistry, pharmacognosy and application oriented topics like organic farming, waste management, rainwater harvesting, paper recycling, organic composting and mushroom cultivation included in it. The students are imparted with a practical knowledge and are trained in all the above areas inside the lab as well as in the field.

Study trips are an important and integral part of the curriculum. Students are taken for study trips every semester. Inter departmental program is also arranged biotechnology department to conduct tissue culture experiments and projects. Extracurricular activities — like the department fest called FLORA is conducted by the students of our department where students of other educational institutions are involved in competitions pertaining to Botany. Students are also encouraged

to participate in similar programs in other institutions also. Selected students accompany the staff members of the department to participate outstation programs like camps, seminars, and workshops etc., Students are actively involved in paper recycling process and prepare many attractive items like folders, invitation cards, posters, carry bags etc., Students are actively involved in organic waste recycling process and prepare organic composts. Certificate courses like Gardening and Home medicine (Ethnobotany), give ample opportunity to create self job opportunities after their graduation. Assessments are conducted through library assignments, submission of assignments through internet, field studies and submission of reports, participation in co-curricular programmes etc.





ZOOLOGY

The department of Zoology organized trekking on 3 July, 2013 to Antaragangebetta situated in Kolar district. The students who were part of this trekking exercise learnt team building, and to identify different species of birds and animals. Trekking helped



them to be physically healthy and gave an exposure for adventures.

The department of Zoology also arranged a talk on Yoga, on 19 July, 2013 (From 11pm-12pm). Well-trained teachers' from "A 1000 Yoga" association gave a brief introduction about Yoga and its effects on our body and health. They also stressed on the need for Yoga for our life and its importance. This programme was part of the Activity hour for both CBZ and BCZ students. Fr. Jobi, prof. Dr. P.U. Antony, Prof. S. Ganesh and Asst. Prof. J.D. Nandini attended the seminar.

The Green Army of Zoology department organized 'Birding' on 30 July, 2013. Students were taken to LalbaghBotanical Garden for bird watching, where they observed a number of species of birds which were flying around Lalbagh.

'Species' is an intercollegiate fest organized by the department on 26 August, 2013. The programme included crossword, dumb charades, photography, pick and speak and quizcompetitions. An Exhibition was put up which showcased the peculiar, uncommon and interesting specimens and also some cancer specimens from KIDWAI hospital. Brain specimens from NIMHANS were also under display. A live glass beehive and aquarium were additional attractions. Thirteen colleges from Bangalore participated in the fest. The green army of Zoology department arranged for trekking on 26th January, 2014 to Munniswamybetta, located in Kanakpura. The students learnt about the diversity of Fauna in that particular area along with trekking.

A colloquium "SYNERGY" was held for students on 4th February, 2014 in JyothiNivascollege, Bangalore. This was a perfect platform for the students to exhibit their research papers. MATHEMATICS

Department of Mathematics in Christ University offers good opportunities and programmes that the students need to establish themselves.


STATISTICS

MBA-CHRIST UNIVERSITY INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT

CUIM is a differentiated B- School aimed at offering comprehensive post graduate management development tuned to the dynamic requirement of industry and society.

In the first year all candidates go through a formal socialization process 'Back to School', the intention being to transition them from outsiders to quickly embrace the Christ culture, making them insiders. They attend a three day 'Out Bound Training' to experience team work, trust, and get to understand, accept and value differences. The 'Organization Structure Training' allow the candidates to become familiar with working of the various functions and operations of management in a manufacturing firm. This experience gets them to break unrealistic or exaggerated expectations they may have about organizations. The art and science of management is appreciated by each one reviewing and presenting management related 'Book Reviews'. The 'Theater' workshop stimulates the creative child and aids in expression of feelings and emotions and allows them to experiment. The 'Industry Visits' help them understand and apply classroom content in reality. The "Psychometric profile" provides insights to candidates to pick the right specializations and the sector to work. It allows them to look at job-person and person-organization fits.

In the second year, all candidates underwent eight weeks of 'Summer Internship Programs' in specific organisations. This encounter radically alterd their thinking, feeling and behaviours toward corporate expectations. The students also go through a complex and challenging simulation game to apply their skills and team work in general management, leveraging their learned specializations for decision-making, strategy and other functional areas by top trainers using video based medium. All candidates attended more than six workshops to enhance skills such as Excel, negotiation, neuro-lingustic programming, SPSS, SAP training, training undergraduate and post graduate students for life skills allowing them hands-on-experience. Each specialization offers specific functional skills training to be industry ready and employable. Around 120 organizations have visited and selected candidates for final placements.

The pedagogy continuously aims at adopting the latest technology in the teaching-learning process including Learning Management Systems, Flipped Classrooms, Co-teaching and Joint-teaching and Digital Learning which significantly enhances students' learning capabilities

The Institute organized various Conferences, one Case conference – Cognosco, student research paper presentation, Entrepreneurship workshops and training and a research methodology workshop for all second year students to engage in meaningful research in completing their dissertation more systematically. The 'Entrepreneurship cell' of the institute organized workshops for women entrepreneur in association with Google. 10 candidates from the institute are aided the Incubation Center.An Inter- departmental entrepreneur

competition 'Manthan' was conducted to promote entrepreneurship.

The co-curricular activities include the Club activity specialization wise to enhance functional skills and interact with the best from the industry to keep in touch with the latest. The Institute publishes for private circulation 12 newsletters specialization wise and clubs including 2 campus newsletters. Corporate interfaces and invited lectures are organized for candidates to transit them smoothly from the academic to a corporate sensitivity. More than 150 corporate professionals have visited the institute for training, student interface and engage in special sessions. 'Ushus'&'Chrizellenz' are two national level management events that have more than 80 B-Schools participating and competing for the top honours. Extracurricular activities of the institute include 'Altius' an interclass sports and games event, 'Cantata' family day of the Institute. The Institute bagged the third place in inter deanery level at 'Blossoms' the University cultural, literary fest.

Christ University Institute of Management offers two internationally linked programmes:

- 1. MBA awarded by Christ University, India and MS in Business awarded by Virginia Commonwealth University, USA through transfer of credit
- 2. PGDM awarded by Christ University, India and MBA awarded by University of Applied Sciences, Wurzburg-Schweinfurt, Germany through transfer of credits.

Christ University Institute of Management - Finance

One of the most sought after specialization is Finance. Over the past few years, this specialization is successful in turning out highly corporate compatible candidates.

During the academic year 2013-14 an optional add-on course was conducted by the Finance Group for the senior finance students on 'Management of Small and Medium Enterprises' in which 80 students participated. Skill based SAS training program of around 40 hours duration was conducted in which around 60 students from Finance and Lean Operations and Systems participated. A workshop on 'Financial Modelling using Excel' was conducted for a duration of 10 hours for all the Junior Finance students. The students of the Finance group

periodically publish three newsletters 'Chaanakya', 'Nishka' and 'Symbiont' each one with a different focus and circulate 'Economic Numbers' every fortnight to encourage students in knowing important economic parameters





which impact the markets. This enables them to keep their fingers on the pulse of financial markets at all times.

The students are exposed to corporate developments by inviting executives from Schneider Electric, Wipro, Income Tax Department, Govt of India, Oracle, Citi Group, Fed Reserve of Richmond, State of Virginia, US, ING Vysya Bank etc. These



executives gave different perspectives of the important areas they are handling in the corporate domain which includes Data

Analytics, Corporate Finance, Credit Appraisal techniques in banking, Monetary Policy, IT matters from the IT department perspective etc. Students were also exposed to 'career prospects in the area of finance' and the skills that are necessary to become employable. In all the finance group students had 26 such exposures apart from the class room sessions.

The finance faculty is actively engaged in preparing videos using CCD (Centre for Concept Design) facility of the University in the area of 'Accounting for Managers', to be used by all the MBA students.



Christ University Institute of Management - Marketing

The focus of the marketing department for the academic year 2013-2014 was on course quality improvement & student experiential learning. The students also actively participated and proved their merit at a number of national and regional Commerce and Management Fests organized by SRCC, Symbiosis College of Arts and







The UG level courses are:

Bachelor of Commerce (Professional)

Higher level corporate placement is an outcome of simultaneous pursuit of CIMA or CS and the add on programs such as advanced excel, six sigma, portfolio management and SAP. The professional courses and add on programs are designed and integrated with BCom P curriculum to make students corporate fit.

Bachelor of Commerce (Finance & Accountancy)

(Christ University is amongst very few institutions that provide a course specifically designed for students pursuing Chartered Accountancy. The course, B.Com F&A - is the largest course in terms of student strength in the department of Professional Studies. The course has been designed with subjects allocated based on its relevance to the Chartered Accountancy profession. Holistic growth and soft-skill development is given prime importance to inculcate corporate finesse and further the global visibility. Students are given the opportunity to get trained in their cognitive thinking abilities and logical reasoning skills by way of business fests. All these help shape the students and prepare them to meet the requirements of the corporate world.

CHARTERED ACCOUNTANCY (C.A.) PROGRAM

Christ University has started the C.A. Program along with B.com - Finance and Accounting degree course which enables the students to pursue C.A course along with under graduation course.

Bachelor of Business Administration (Finance & Accountancy)

BBA F&A is a unique course aimed at graduates who are proficient in the field of Finance and Accounting. Higher level corporate placement is an outcome of simultaneous pursuit of ACCA and CS or Insurance. BBA F&A graduates are entitled to exemptions of 9 papers (out of 14 papers) of the examinations

organized by the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA). ACCA India signed its first university MoU with Christ University. With the MoU in place, Christ students can avail exemptions while studying or completing their BBA (Finance and accounting) degree.

BCOM EVENING: sessions are held regularly for professionals desirous of continuous learning.

At the PG level, the Professional Studies Department is offering MSc Actuarial Science (MAS)

MAS is a two-year postgraduate course spread over four semesters comprising modules on Financial Mathematics, Actuarial Statistics, Insurance and Economics. The course covers key areas in global business with in-depth coverage of Risk Management opening a plethora of opportunities in the insurance and global investment sectors. The course is dedicated towards dealing with real-world scenarios and application of the analytical process that students are trained for; practical application, case studies and market analysis with experts guiding individuals will be an important aspect of the learning process.

The Department also hosts and urges students to participate in various fests and events. COGNITO – All India Business Fest is the flagship event conducted by the Department of Professional Studies. The fest is designed to emulate the corporate world and it recreates real-time business scenarios and situations to analyze the participants and find the best among the competitors. 

Christ University students were also part of one semester study abroad programs at Baldwin Wallace University (USA) NHTV (Netherland), IESEG (France) and Science Po (France).






CENTRE FOR PUBLICATION

CENTRE FOR RESEARCH



The Centre for Research was established at Christ University in 2008 to nurture the research talents. Through various academic exchange programs, the centre aims at establishing a universal nature and legitimacy of a research centre. It motivates and facilitates scholars to cultivate an aptitude for intercultural and transnational communications in economic, social, political and scientific spheres. The centre has PhD program in eighteen disciplines. There are eighty nine empanelled guides supervising the scholars. So far, sixteen PhD scholars have obtained their degree. Three PhD scholars have completed their viva voce exam and five PhD scholars have submitted their thesis. Apart from this, four Zimbabwe PhD scholars have also submitted their synopsis for defense.

The Centre for Research completed review meeting for the 2010

and 2012 batch PhD Scholars and verified their progress in research.

Centre for Research conducted Synopsis defense for 2009, 2010, and 2011 batch PhD Scholars. The Defense was monitored and evaluated by invited external subject experts as well as internal subject

experts. The vigorous assessment procedure helped the PhD scholars to improve the quality of their PhD Thesis.

2 PhD scholars of 2009 batch and 1 scholar from 2010 batch have completed their PhD viva voce exam defense and will be awarded PhD degree during this academic year.

Centre for Research organized a National Workshop on 9 July, 2013 on Research Publications. Resource Persons:

74 participants including academicians, faculty members and Research scholars, attended the seminar and richly benefited from the resource persons.

Centre for Research organized series of lectures under the banner of Forum for Knowledge Sharing during the academic year 2013-2014. Experienced and Eminent Professors shared their research experience and it was a platform for great learning experience for the budding research scholars.

The admission procedure commenced in the month of August 2013 and 31 students selected for admission for the academic year 2013-2014. Number of students admitted in different disciplines are as follows; Chemistry – 2, Commerce - 3, Law – 2, Computer Science - 3, Economics – 2. Education – 1, Engineering – 4, Management – 2, Mathematics – 4, Psychology – 5 and Social Work – 3.

PhD Course work was formally inaugurated on 16 December 2013,by our Vice chancellor, Dr.Fr. Thomas C Mathew.

The Course work Classes started in the month of December, 2013 and will be completed in the Month of May, 2014. The

Course Work Classes were conducted under three phases; Course Work Phase I, Phase – II, Phase – III and Phase – IV. At the end of the course work, the Centre will conduct End Semester Examination for the PhD scholars.

Research Proposal Presentation for the present batch scholars will

be held during the month of June, 2014 followed by the issue of Course Work Completion Certificates.

The centre for research has also conducted several discussions meet with experts and orientation to scholars on tool construction, data analysis and interpretation of results.



CENTRE FOR SOCIAL ACTION

Centre for Social Action (CSA) is a social development of Christ University, where student communities are sensitised on various issues affecting the poor and marginalized sections of society. This is done so that they can internalize and personalize the issues and contribute to sustainable changes in the lives of the poor and the oppressed. Through such processes of involvement, CSA aims to enable the students to be aware of the social realities around them as well as impart them with ideas of how they can contribute towards the upliftment of unheeded

sections. Following are the activities of CSA 2013-14 which derive their strength from its vision and mission. They form the framework and the basis for activity implementation.

Rural Exposure Visits: Students get an opportunity to learn and understand the rural life in India. It fosters community based experiential learning to the students which is

community centred in bridging out the gaps between academics its applicability, It helps students to relate themselves with the situations around and to come up

with decisions resulting to holistic development of individual selves.

Altogether 60 Rural Study Visits/Camps, (Including HP Camp and Exposure visits for International Students) were conducted for 3184- Three Thousand One Eighty Four participants at our project areas in Kolar and Hoskote.

Child Sponsorship: Students community of Christ University sponsor poor children from urban slums for their education and for their overall growth and development. Children are supported with school fees, books, uniforms, bags and other stationary items. They also access services to improve their academic and personal growth; the services include workshops on personality development, leadership skill and creative skill development. Health camps, talent shows, excursions and sports competitions are also conducted for children. Six Hundred fifty Six children from 3 different urban slum project areas were sponsored this year with the contribution of INR 22,97,621-Twenty Two Lakhs, Ninety Seven Thousand, Six Twenty contributed by 172 Individual Sponsors and 126 Class/Group/Sections Sponsors.

Visits and Orientation: Special Visits are organized for students and resource staff to our project areas, in order to make them aware of different activities and interventions of CSA at Urban and Rural Communities and at Christ University Campus as well. Visitors are oriented on sustainable development concepts which CSA strives to achieve at our different community development projects, both at urban slums in bangalore. Altogether we had 427. No of Students/ Faculty

visitors this year at Janakiram Layout (No of visitors 229), and at LR Nagar, Ambedkarnar and Rajendranagar. (No visitors are 198).

Extension Activities for Social Work Students, as part of Extension Activity for 1st year Masters of Social Work students, campaigns were conducted to spread awareness on different social concerns and relevance. It's a unique approach which is found highly useful for application of social work theories into

practice which has lead to change in the society.

Four campaigns were conducted in the academic year on Waste Management, Disability Sensitization, and Importance of Girl safety and on Health, Sanitation and Ill Effects of Substance Abuse at L.R Nagar, Ambedkarnagar and at Janakiram Layout slum project areas.

Social Responsibility Week: An initiative started in the year 2010, is a week/day in every semester, where every

department will be sensitized about a single social issue decided for that semester .All the students are assisted and guided by their respective faculties to conduct various activities within their own departments to achieve the purpose through various competitions, presentations, screening of documentaries, role plays etc.

In 2013-14, Two Social Responsibility Week's that were organized and observed in each of the semester; the theme for first semester was on "Fundamental Duties under Constitution of India", Students from each class/section give a short comprehensive presentation on all the fundamental duties at their respective classes. Faculties guided students on the purpose of why it was important to observe "Social Responsibility Week "and made them aware of its significance of knowing and practicing all the duties. Students also gave demonstration on each of the fundamental duties to the



passerby's on the pathway. Presentations of charts and street plays were also performed by the students. Range of programmes like mime, street play, slogan competition, demonstration on pathway and class room presentation were organized to educate nearly 1000 students of our university.

In the Second semester the theme was on 'Child Rights and Action', the event was conducted in collaboration with CRY (Child Rights Organization) and with all the associated academic departments, Six Departments (CUIM, CSA, Commerce, Political Science, Economics, and Psychology) of Christ University participated in organizing various events ranging from slogan competition, street plays, signature campaign, a poster presentation, sticker campaign, competition on creative chart presentations etc. A group of students met and forwarded a list of 10 child rights manifesto to Mr. Rahul Gandhi during his visit to Bangalore. Nearly 1500 students directly or indirectly participated in the event either by organizing various awareness programmes or by participating in the event/competition organized for the students.

Drishti: Prayatna was a rally initiated by Drishti to segregate waste in slums. It was conducted in the project areas where people were shown how to segregate Wet and Dry waste. Drishti also performed three street plays in those project areas. Radio Drama was a Voice Play conducted in association with Radio Active Station, a community radio station. The main theme was Women Empowerment and the drama was broadcasted on Women's Day. Two different topics, Dowry and Women Education in two languages Kannada and Telegu were enacted. Drishti was also invited to put up a play in collaboration with IISC for National Seminar on Solid Waste Management. The seminar was held in Maharani Lakshmi Ammanni College in Malleshwaram.

Activity Centre: A Heath camp was initiated by Activity Centre in Ambedhkar Nagar. The doctors, after the evaluation, interacted with the parents and asked them to give more importance to their children's Dental Hygiene. The highlight of this academic year, apart from Milan, was the Career Guidance Program that was conducted in the same project area. Our main aim was to expose them to career opportunities available across various disciplines and at the same time give due importance to Diploma or Vocational courses, Govt. jobs, Sports and Entertainment industry.

Media and Communication Team: Creativity Club, a part of Media & Communication team initiated what is called Photowalk where people who are interested in going around the city and cover socially relevant issues can come and join us. We do have certain themes. The places we visit will be in accordance with this theme. For example, once we had taken up the theme 'Religion' and visited a temple, a church, a Gurudwara and a mosque to see how just the definition of God varied from place to place and documented them with photographs.

Milan -2013-14 Milan' is a two day inter-regional sports and cultural festival conducted for the sponsored children from the urban slums, rural and tribal backward spaces from across three states of India, organized at the Christ University Campus here in Bangalore. Most of these children are being sponsored for



their education by the students of Christ University. Altogether nearly 500 children from 8 different regional and state project areas participated in 11 various cultural and sports competitions.). Mr. Vijay Lancy a renowned Indian badminton player presided over the programme as the chief guest. In the end Hoskote-Chethana Project- won the overall championship, which lifted and retained 'Milan' rolling shield for third consecutive time. Nearly 140 student volunteers and 20 Volunteers from a Corporate Social Responsibility Group from Hewlett Packard Company took active role in organizing and making the event successful.

Gracias- 2013-14 'Gracias' is a thanks giving event by the children from urban slum project areas of CSA, to express their heartfelt gratitude to their sponsors through various cultural performances, children managed to put up 10 different stalls to showcase and demonstrate the significance of all the community development projects and programmes of CSA. The students felt happy to see all the performances by their sponsored children in Gracias and were inspired by the chief guest's speech from Mr. Girisha Gowda, Silver Medallist for India in 2012 Paraolympics in London and recipient of Padmashri Award.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMME

ENGLISH ACCESS MICRO-SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME: English Access Micro scholarship program is to provide a foundation of English language skills and communication strategies to economically disadvantaged children through two years of after school instruction and intensive session.

The Access Program (AP) is an added feather in the development cap of CSA through Christ University. The AMIDEAST-USA, Regional English Office (RELO), New Delhi, and US Consulate- Chennai, came forward to join hands with CSA to undertake this unique project. Prior to its restart in the month of November 2012 this AP was executed by EDC (another NGO) for 6 months (77hours). When it was given to CSA the task of completing 283 hours out of 360 hours of instruction and implementing several Enhancement Activities have been entrusted. Accordingly a detailed plan of action with a proposal was developed and agreed by the partners to implement these activities with a lifespan of 18 months beginning from Nov 2012 to April 2014.

RURAL COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

MANIKGARH HILLS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT (MHCDP), Maharashtra: As the years have gone by since the inception of MHCDP, CSA has crossed mid-way in implementing Community Development project since April 2013 for the near-extinct Kollam and Gond tribal communities residing in 24 villages/hamlets of Jiwati Taluk, Chandrapur District of Maharashtra state. The years 2011-12 and 2012-13 were indeed exciting and challenging for the project implementation team, where many strategies and capacity building exercises of the staff and the community emerged.

As a felt need to improve the effectiveness of the program implementation, good practices were developed in order to empower the staff and stakeholders for ensuring the sustainability of the project. The project supported more than 1100 most deserving children and their families in the target area with education, health, livelihood support and many such developmental interventions.

Project had good network with other developmental partners/institutions i.e. various government departments, financial institutions and other NGOs in Jiwati Taluk for increasing the impact and quality of the various initiatives.



MANIKGARH HILLS CLIMATE CHANGE PROJECT:

Now-a-days Climate Change, global warming, ecological imbalance and disposal of solid waste are some of the matters that are often discussed in the entire universe. Now the global community has realized that there needs to be a strategy in place to arrest the furtherance of its negative impacts. The situation demanded such a thinking as climate change is spreading across its vicious hands to each and every nuke and corner of the globe.

Therefore, to ensure CSA's role in such a noble endeavor a project was launched at Jiwati Taluk, of Maharashtra state in the year 2012-13 in partnership with HCDI, Pune & KNH-Germany. The major focus is on climate change and the project is implemented in this poverty stricken tribal belt and climate sensitive area with 24 villages and 1430 families. Activities such as tree plantation and awareness campaigns on education, sustainable agricultural practices, installation of energy efficient technologies based on nature, promotion of the usage of solar lamps, CFL bulbs, smokeless ovens etc were planned and executed to ensure the fulfillment of objectives.

It is quite encouraging to notice that the project reached out to over 4727 individuals in the process of executing the above listed activities. project" works towards "Child Focused Community Development" covering 15 villages in Nirmal Mandal of Adilabad District in Andhra Pradesh. During its lifespan, intended attempts were made to ensure the prevalence and functioning of the community based organizations (CBOs) such as Children Parliaments, Self Help Groups, Village Development Committees and Project Level Federations.

This was done to promote the concept of sustainable development. The project has been supporting 1800 deprived families covering 1500 children in the age group of 0-16 years. The target families belong to Lambada, Gond, Thoti and Nayakkapod tribal communities. During the last two years the major focus was on building sustainability mechanism and capacity building of the CBOs like self help groups and village development committees (VDC) under the project. The following table explains the details of CBOs that were established under the project.

PRAGATHI CFCD PROJECT: Pragathi is the name of the "Child Focused Community Development" project which started its interventions in June 2012 covering 22 interior villages in Srinivasapura and Mulbagal taluk of Kolar District in Karnataka State. The project has chosen to support 1800 deprived families for their sustainable development through 5 major components i.e., 1) ECC and Nutrition of 0-6 years children 2) Strengthening the education of children in the age group of 6-16 years 3) Community Health 4)Livelihood development and 5) Promoting and strengthening Community Based Organizations. 60% of the families in the proposed project impact villages belong to Schedule Caste (SC) which is highest in these two taluks.

WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

PARIVARTHANA- Waste Management Unit: Centre for Social Action (CSA), with the support of Global Communities has been implementing a community based solid waste management initiative called the 'Parivarthana Project' which also has been serving as a livelihood program in Ambedkar Nagar, Rajendra Nagar and Christ University Campus. The project was initiated to undertake decentralized solid waste management which includes collection, sorting and sale of recyclables, composting and paper recycling.

Christ University - A zero waste campus: Christ University generates around 800 kgs of waste everyday which includes both wet and dry waste. The waste is primarily segregated by students. They are being sensitized by CSA Staff propagate the message of waste segregation and solid waste management practices in the slums through awareness campaign, rally, street plays, door to door campaign and formation of eco-clubs for children.

About 12000 students and faculty members are sensitized and educated on solid waste management practices. From each department students and faculty members are given exposure to understand solid waste management practices initiated in Christ University and further encouraged to carry the message back to their home. Waste bins for safe disposal of dry waste, wet waste



and food/kitchen waste are kept at different locations to ensure the primary segregation. This practice helps complete 70% of waste segregation by the students. Every one hour wastes are collected and taken to sorting unit where the secondary segregation (30%) takes place. All the paper recyclables are processed at paper recycling unit and various types of papers products are made. Tetra packs are sent to Janakiram Layout where SHG members promoted by CSA make artistically designed vanity bags and other products which are being sold to the external markets. Most importantly the student volunteers of Christ University propagate the message of waste segregation and solid waste management practices in the slums through awareness campaign, rally, street plays, door to door campaign and formation of eco-clubs for children.

URBAN SLUM COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

3D PROJECT AT JANAKIRAM LAYOUT: Centre for Social Action (CSA), has been implementing integrated Desirable Dynamic Development (3-D) Empowerment Project at Janakiram Layout since 2008. The project is a brain child of in-Z, Netherlands which played an active part in its inception. HP-Bangalore also supported the project by sponsoring 100 children for a year. Bosch India Foundation executed activities pertaining to vocational skills. The intervention promoted by CSA is essentially a community based developmental paradigm based on the principle of people's decision- making and participation for their own development. Educational Programmes through Activity Centre and Child Sponsorship Initiatives, about 532 children in the year 2011-12 & 511 children during 2012-13 were supported by Christ University students.

L R NAGAR INTEGRATED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT: Hundreds of children! 100s of dreams and the only route- Education! It is here that "GMR Varalakshmi Foundation", Bangalore and "Centre for Social Action" jointly pitched in to facilitate the education of 250 deprived children .United in a pact with a purpose during July 2010, the focus was imparting educational and life skills to the children of the age group of 5-14 years. However, GMR broadened its horizon by adding three more activities viz., Women Empowerment, Day Care Centres and a Transit School for dropout children. After a thorough study of the poverty levels in Laxman Rao (L.R) Nagar slum near Koramangala, Bangalore, GMR confirmed the continuation of their funding



for 3 more years i.e., from July 2011 to June 2014. In addition, 150 children from this project area were supported under 'Educate a Child' scheme, by the students of Christ University, Bangalore. With contributions of the students, other individuals and organizations around 232 children received educational support in L.R.Nagar slum. Following are the major activities of the project at L.R.Nagar:

- 1. Running "Children's Activity Centres" for enhancing the quality of education.
- 2. "Transit school" for dropout children up to 13 years.
- 3. Running "Day Care Centres" for the children between 18months 3 years.
- 4. "Women's Empowerment" through education, awareness and creating opportunities for additional income through alternative employment opportunities.

RAJENDRANAGAR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT: What started off as a humble support by Christites in 1999 that boosted the lives of 50 children in Rajendranagar slum in Koramangala, has indeed come a long way thanks to the relentless efforts of the student volunteers. Over the years this continued gesture has elevated the Child Sponsorship

Program into a movement and around 225 marginalized children from this slum are receiving support for continued education as well as life skills development. Thus the sponsored children in Rajendranagar slum have been supported with four major activities viz., Supplementary Educational Centres, Children's Library under "Grow by Reading" concept, Computer Education and Personality Development. NODAL OFFICE

The Nodal Office, Thiruvananthapuram reflected on its aims, strategies and activities, and identified the following activities for coming years: (a) conduct training workshops for academic and development professionals; (b) conduct studies/evaluations; (c) organize workshops/seminars; (d) organize cultural and informal meetings on relevant topics from time to time and (e) function as a link between the Christ University and the academic community of Kerala. Of these activities, organising training workshops for enhancing capacities of the academic and development professionals was the main focus and activity of the Nodal Office, Thiruvananthapuram during 2013-14.

Topics selected for the training workshops were Topics of the innovative, useful and demand-driven. workshops for academic professionals included (a) qualitative research using NVivo software; (b) improved methods of teaching in colleges and universities; (c) qualitative research using "R" software; (d) quantitative research using open source (e) structural equation modelling; (f) software methods; quantitative research using IBM SPSS methods; (g) action research methods; and (h) human migration. These workshops started attracting more participants from academic institutions located outside Kerala. Participants from the academic community included teachers, researchers, research guides, and doctoral and PG students. Duration of the workshops varied from two to four days. Average number of participants was around fifteen.

It is aimed to enhance the capacities of the academic community, and thereby improve the quality of teaching and research by organizing at least three training workshops every month on different new, innovative and useful research topics/issues/methods during 2014-15. Special efforts are made to improve participation of researchers (including



students) from weaker sections and rural and isolated regions of the country.

During 2013-14, the office identified the following important issues/topics of training for the development professionals, in consultation with development organizations of Kerala: (a) action research, (b) development-research linkages; (c) documentation of best practises and key learnings; (d) programme cycle management; (e) climate change management; and (f) inclusive development. Training workshops on action research and documentation of best practices and key learnings were organized. Planned to conduct training on the selected topics, on a more regular basis, with the support of government and non-government agencies during 2014-15.

Consultations with government and non-government agencies are going on to organize studies, evaluations, seminars and workshops on relevant issues. It is also planned to organize at least one cultural/informal discussion every month on a selected topic of interest.



The year 2013-14 also saw an increase in the number of examinations per year. The "odd to odd" and "even to even"policy for supplementary examinations was abolished thus reducing the waiting period for the students. In the previous scheme the students seeking supplementary examinations had to wait for 12 months to clear their backlogs. The new policy ensures a speedy clearance of the pending papers. For the Institute of Management, a special supplementary examination in the month of February was introduced to enable the students to clear their backlogs beforethe placements. Inorder to make the system more reliable, efficient and fast, 90 per cent of the work at the Office of Examination was automated. Applications for mid semester examinations were made available online for the students. Further, availability of information on seating allotment in the "Hall Ticket" has made the system more favourable for the students. Students also have the facility of applying for revaluation through online and get the update in the system within 10 days after the application. Some of the new processes introduced viz., preparation of seating charts, invigilation allotment, invigilation and valuation payments through ERP software of the university have not only eased the work process in the Office of Examinations but also have brought about more transparencyin the system. The


introduction of valuation dashboard has made the status of evaluation all-time accessible for the higher officials of the University. This also has helped the university to publish the results within 14 days after the completion of the examinations.

Another student-friendly practice enforced was to make the Office of Examination accessible for them during lunch hour since they are free between 12. 30 pm and 2 pm. One or more staff member will be readily available to attend to the students during this time.

An interdisciplinary and external review of the question banks was introduced in order to make it more accountable and errorfree, this has drastically scuttled the number of errors in the question papers.

The annual convocation was held on the 25and 26May 2013. The chief guests were Dr Deviprasad Shetty, Chairman, Narayana Hrudayalaya Group of Hospitals, for the Deanery of Science, Deanery of humanities and Social Sciences and faculty of Engineering on Saturday, 25 May 2013 at 11 am; Dr G Vishwanathan, Hon. Chancellor, VIT University, Vellore, delivered the address to the graduates of the Deanery of Commerce and Management on Saturday, 25 May 2013 at 6.00 pm.

The convocation for the outgoing graduates of Deanery of Commerce and Management and School of Law was held on 26 May 2013 at 5.00 pm. The chief guest was DrMichael Rao, President, Virginia Commonwealth University, Richmond, Virginia, USA. There were 3288 students from undergraduate, post graduate, MPhil and PhD programmes who were honoured with various degrees.



THE IMPLEMENTERS



OFFICE OF PLACEMENTS

The Placement Office facilitates the students to explore the world of employment. The Placement Office takes initiatives to explore new career avenues for undergraduates and postgraduates through visits to organisations. The Placement Office focuses on the professional development of students and trains them to get an entry into a career of their choice. The Placement Office also helps students in career planning through career counselling where in they get an insight about themselves in terms of their interests, aptitudes and abilities.

Campus recruitments are usually organized between August and February every year. The recruitment process usually starts with a pre-placement talk in which the organization gives the students information about the job profile etc. It is followed by the actual selection process i.e., written test/group discussion/personal interviews etc. Student placement representatives from every class are also present to provide assistance throughout the recruitment process.

The University has state-of-the-art facilities that make campus recruitment a pleasant experience.

HOLISTIC EDUCATION

Christ University understands the limitations of compartmentalized knowledge which is not adequate enough to face the challenges of the globalized world. With a mission to prepare the students for life and not just for the acquisition of a degree, it encourages every initiative that would help students make perfect connections with the world outside. Inspired by the educational philosophy of Rousseau, Emerson, Ivan Illich, Paulo Freire, Gandhi, Tagore and Blessed Chavara, the University formulated this concept of Holistic Education more than fifteen years ago and included it in the curriculum and makes necessary changes every year. A group of teachers drawn from across the streams go through the whole process of designing the curriculum through a series of intense discussions under the broad classification of three skills: personal, interpersonal and societal. Classes are conducted every week both for the undergraduate and postgraduate students through mandatory attendance and an evaluation which is done at the end of each semester.


The library has renewed its institutional membership with British Council, ISEC Library, IIM-Bangalore library and

DELNET services. Research scholars and faculty members can avail both reference and borrowing facility from above libraries.



STUDENT COUNCIL



The Student Council members for this academic year were solemnly inducted on the 23 of February, 2013. The council consisted of representatives from all the Deaneries along with representatives from the student service wings i.e. the NCC, SWO and the Peer Education. On the 15 and 16 of June, 2013, the newly inducted Student Council members underwent a two day intensive workshop on leadership, held in the Kengeri campus, with the assistance of the resource person Mr. Arvind.

Following this orientation which marked the full induction of the Student Council, all the Deaneries took up the task of briefing the first year students regarding the functioning of the Council and the possible assistance they could gain from this system. The University level student council members thereafter took it upon themselves to orient the Deanery level members as well, with regard to their roles and duties in the hierarchy.

The Student Council has made incessant efforts to table issues pertaining to the academic, curricular and co-curricular activities on campus, following which there have been changes made though they may not seem to be particularly noticeable. I take this opportunity to mention a few of them as follows:

- The shift from Thermacoal plates and bowls to biodegradable bowls, in synergy with the aim to achieve a zerowaste campus was an initiative by the council.
- Proper queue system was initiated in the Gourmet, so that time and crowd could be managed for systematic functioning.
- In the absence of Kamath in Gourmet, the Council felt the need to bring up the issue of availability of wholesome meals in the canteens and as a result of this effort South- Indian dishes were also introduced along with newly established Golden Chopsticks.
- The University Level Student Council as per its annual plan, organized the Higher Education fair, Daksh, on the 13th of January, 2014 which garnered a large audience who gained from the display of the Universities academia.

The role of Student Council members in the Deanery level is also of utmost importance. Individually the Deaneries have taken up various concerns and activities and duly have worked towards finding plausible solution and they are as follows:

In The Deanery of Commerce:

- The council members from the Deanery took up the task of reforming certain placement related activities; the placements that were restricted to Bcom(regular and Honours) were opened up for Bcom Tourism students in this academic year.
- This year the Council members from the Deanery also worked along with the Organizers of Campus-connect to facilitate the functioning of the event seamlessly.
- The council also strived to campaign with regard to the new dress code that was implemented in the Deanery to bring in a smooth transition from the previous system.
- The council also was instrumental in the changing of the morning break time which was constrained between 8:30-9:00 am, with an extension of 15 mins till 9:15 am.



The Deanery of PG commerce and Management on the other hand worked towards various changes such as,

- The allotment of new lockers to the students of MTA
- The council also took up the task of campaigning about the advantages of the library and other infrastructure.
- In conglomeration with the house keeping staff the Council took up an initiative to keep the washrooms and the allied facilities in the canteen areas clean.

The Deanery of Humanities and Social Sciences on the other hand took up initiatives. Few of them being:

- to establish a seamless contact between the Deanery level members and the university level members
- The council established itself as a strong placement link between the Placement office and the aspiring students

- The council organized a session under its lecture forum Student Consortium for Academic Negotiations (SCAN) under the topic Art Entrepreneurship, with Mr Vineeth Vincent, Beat-boxer and Mr. Rajesh Pai, Theatre artist, who addressed issues pertaining to Entrepreneurship in their respective fields
- The council also facilitated the option given to honours students to issue 4 books instead of 2 from the library

The Deanery of Sciences as part of its responsibility took up issues like,

- Bettering the curriculum of the courses under the Deanery
- Facilitating the Students of the Deanery to be part of the Nation Students Challenge 2013, organized by Indian Institute of Human Settlement
- The Council also suggested changes in the Environment Education Holistic curriculum, to make it more relevant and contemporary
- Along with this the Council also brought about changes in the Research Laboratory functioning, to cater to more academic rigour
- The council members were also part of the organization of the Science week

The Student Council members at Kengeri-

- Initiated the formation of the Kengeri Campus Cultural Team.
- They also Initiated the Dance, Music, Sports, Robotics and Programming Clubs which have resulted in finding many students with vast and varied Talents and interests.
- For the first time the Kengeri Cultutural Team and SWO body were trained during separate workshops that were conducted in coordination with their City Campus counterparts.



He is a management consultant at the Centre for Financial Consultancy & Training, Bangalore. He is also a member of the editorial board, Indian Journal of Marketing, New Delhi and member of the Research Committee, ABBS Bangalore. He has completed 49 Major & Minor Research and Consultancy Projects on various

aspects of Business, Finance, PPP etc. and 61 Research papers in National and International Journals, Magazines and Newspapers. He has also published five books on Management, Cost and Finance, and Two Monographs. He was honoured with the Bhartiya Rastriya Vocational Excellence Award in 2007 & Mohammad Yunus Economic Development Award in 2006. Dr. DNS Kumar, Ph.D, CMA (USA)

Please tell us about the major research programs taken up by faculty members in Christ University?

Research and continuing activity form the backbone of a university. Traditionally, universities have been the centres for research, though the government has a network of science and technology laboratories for research & development, the major base for research remain within the universities.

Accordingly Christ University, Bangalore, assumes a responsive role in order to promote advanced academic research in diversified disciplines through the establishment of the Centre for Research-Projects in 2010. The Centre for Research-Projects in its endeavour to help society, businesses and enterprises to manage risk and uncertainty has different professional groups, who assist and take up 'pure' and 'applied' research assignments. This research projects focus on various issues related to the economy, society, industry, government agencies etc. in the form of major research projects (MRPs), research monographs, and working papers.

The major research projects conceived by the Centre and executed by faculty members of Christ University at different levels in social sciences, natural and physical sciences and applied science disciplines, not only adds significant value to the society but are also important in the ever changing global scenario. The monograph, which is an in-depth study on a specific theme, concept or model, doctrine; treatise or a report is published by the Centre to provide an in-depth insight to drive further research or application. Another level is the Working Paper or Work paper that the Centre publishes and which provides scholars opportunity to further deliberate and expand the knowledge frontier.

After inception, the Centre has approved 47 MRPs, 23 monographs, and 20 working papers. The track record has been two MRPs, three Monographs and nine Working papers.

How do you think the quality of research can be maintained and students can be encouraged to take up original research instead of just copying off others?

For all the above projects, faculty members, industrial executives, scientists from institutions/organizations like the Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore; Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore; Institute for Social and Economic Change, Bangalore; National Law School of India University, Bangalore; Karnataka University, Dharwad; Gulbarga University, Gulbarga; Bangalore University, Bangalore; PHILIPS, Bangalore; Institute for Fiscal Policy (Government of Karnataka),

Bangalore; Indian Statistical Institute, Bangalore; AzimPremji University, Bangalore; Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre, Trivandrum; ISRO, Bangalore etc., are involved in the review of proposals and bi-annual reviews. These projects are approved with due internal vetting, external review and personal defence of proposal before a duly constituted committee with a Vice-Chancellor's nominee. The highlights of the projects are: bi-annual reviews with external experts, publication of research papers, presentations at seminars/conferences, involvement of students, discussion with colleagues, inter-disciplinary approaches, panel discussions, interaction with experts, field surveys, involvement of departmental/deanery colleagues, and engagement of students.

Please tell us about the Academic staff college in Christ University?

Christ University recognizes its role as a transformer of value education with the motto 'Excellence and Service' to create an appropriate learning platform for its teachers has established an Academic Staff College in 2011. The CU-Academic Staff College conducts orientation, refresher and quality improvement programs to augment the skill levels, knowledge and competency of faculty members. The CU-Academic Staff College has a duly constituted a Board of Studies, members being nominated by the Vice-Chancellor, and all Deans/Associate Deans, Personnel Officer and Registrar being the ex-officio members; and an Academic Advisory Committee chaired by the Vice Chancellor with due representation from faculty members, Deans, two external experts, Registrar, Chairman, Board of Studies of ASC as members, and Chief Finance Officer and Personnel Officer as special invitees, to deliberate on need, significance, time frame, and financial approval aspects of the programmes.

How is it benefiting the faculty members of Christ University?

The orientation programs are for Assistant Professors in the grades of IV and V which highlight the various aspects of higher education, academic leadership, value education, innovative methods of teaching - learning pedagogy, etc. The Refresher programs for Professors/Associate Professors and Assistant Professors grade III and above, emphasizes the contemporary and applied aspects of knowledge in different disciplines leading to advancement in research and consultancy with a focus on multidisciplinary approaches. The Quality Improvement Programmes (QIP) is about domain knowledge and aimed at all faculty members on capstone areas is subject-specific.

How many programs has it organized till date for their academic development?

The CU-ASC has so far completed seven orientation and 15 refresher programs, apart from four quality improvement program. The topics pertaining to the programs are discussed well in advance with participants and their inputs taken. The external resource persons are drawn from across the country and to name a few, Dr. Arun Nigvekar- former Chairman UGC; Dr M I Savadatti, former Vice Chancellor, Mangalore University; Dr. M. M. Salunkhe, Vice Chancellor, Central University of Rajastan, Dr PG Apte, former Director IIMB; Dr. Prasanna Chandra-Director CFM; Dr. A.M. On 26 May, 2013 the PG students along with the students of MBA graduated from this prestigious University. Clad in black





Our Vice Chancellor, Col. (Dr.) Fr. Thomas. C. Mathew addressed the entire student body and staff members.


