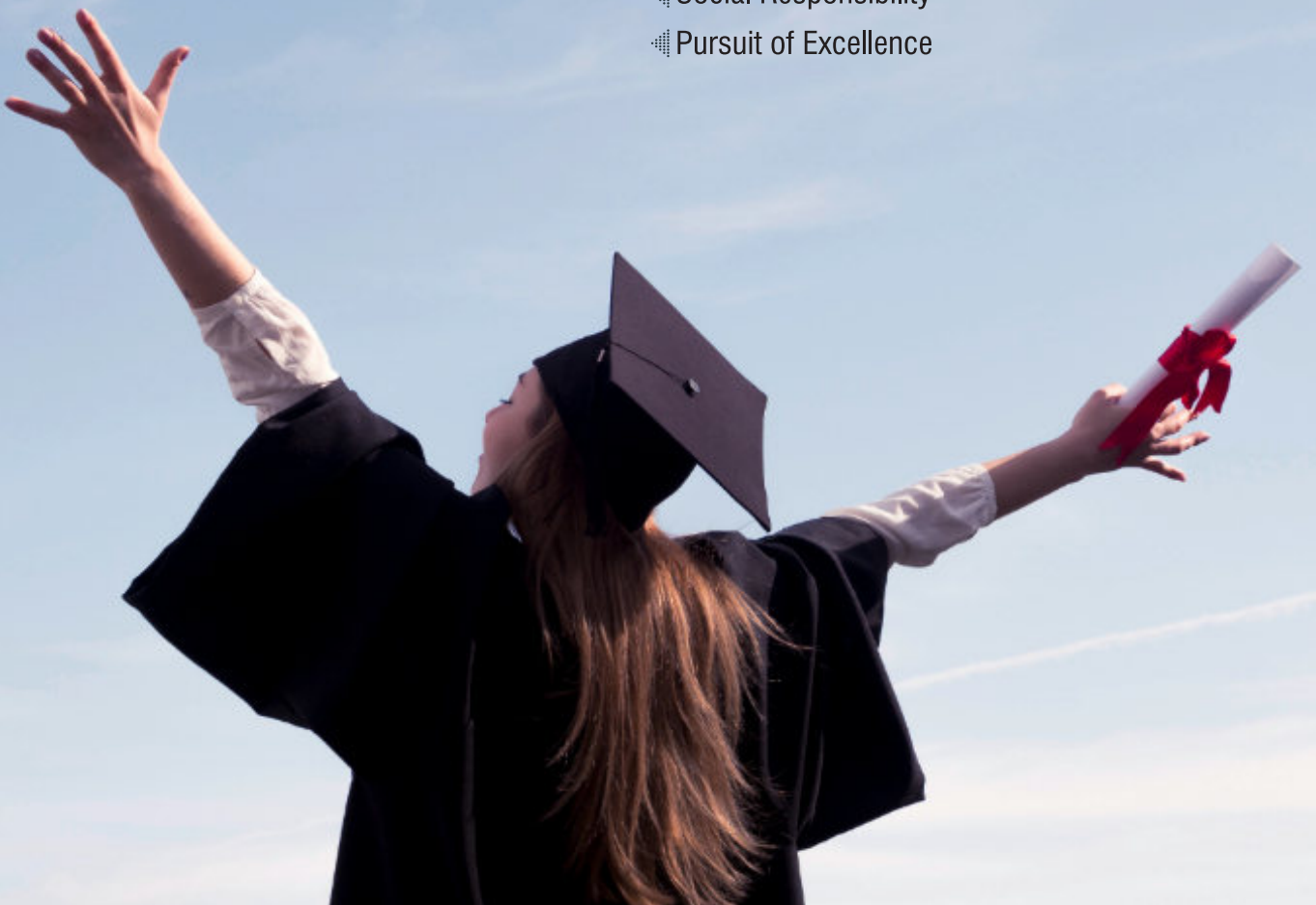
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

## DEPARTMENT OF LIFE SCIENCE

The Department of Life Science has continuously nurtured students' growth and encouraged various initiatives for student progression. It is one of the oldest departments at CHRIST University. The Department has firmly established itself as a center of excellence with a focus on multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary teaching and research. In addition to academics, the Department encourages students to participate in various events and activities, allowing them to showcase their diverse talents. Department had conducted various programs on skill enhancement. Awareness program related to environmental sustainability was conducted throughout the academic year. Several trekking, plantation, farming and cleanup drives were conducted in the academic year. Special sessions on stress management for self-care, physical and mental health were carried out to nurture the wellbeing of the student community. Field visits scheduled for the students to industries and nature camps had provided enormous learning experience to the students. Besides equipping students in acquiring academic knowledge through seminars, field visits, Industry collaborations and guest talks, several training programs were conducted throughout the academic year.





## DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS

The department of Mathematics had throughout the year organized several activities for students and faculty to enhance research, soft and life skills, leadership qualities and learning beyond academics. The programs for the academic year commenced with an orientation and induction program for BSc (EMS) and MSc (Mathematics) students. A series of guest lectures were arranged throughout the year on various topics covering academics, research and career development. Various other programs such as International workshop on “Non-Linear Stability of Thermoconductive Flows”, National workshop on “Colouring and Domination in Graphs and its Applications” in which research scholars, faculty and students from different parts of India and abroad attended. Many International personalities too visited the department this year.

To mark the birth anniversary of Dr. S Radhakrishnan, Teachers Day was celebrated in collaboration with the student welfare office. On the occasion of International Women’s day the department organized a panel discussion on the topic “Ignite your minds with the inspirational power of women”. To commemorate the discovery of the Raman effect by Indian Physicist Sir C V Raman the department celebrated Science Fest by organizing events such as Guest lectures, Screening of a science documentary and Science Exhibition. The department successfully conducted three fests: CONVERGENCE 2023 – an intercollegiate fest, AAROHAN 2023 - an intercollegiate PG Mathematics fest and SEQUENCE 2023 - an intra class Mathematics fest. Also the annual Alumni meet was organized by the department in the month of January.

The department organized many capacity building programs such as workshops on Scientific Documentation using LaTeX, talks by Alumni on Career building, training programs through CAPS, weekly research colloquium, Journal club activities, EMS interactive sessions and Summer School. The students were also volunteering for various social activities through Handful of food drive, participating in the social awareness blog Tangents of Change initiated by the department and were involved in service learning projects.

Students also won prizes in various fests conducted by other prestigious institutions in and outside Bangalore; UG and PG Mathematics students won the Overall trophy in the intercollegiate Mathematics fest at St Joseph’s College (Autonomous) and IIT Madras. The research scholars of the department were actively involved in the research activities and five of them have successfully completed their PhD degree during this academic year. Faculty members actively presented, participated, and served as resource persons in National/International conferences and workshops. The Department reached many milestones in research including publications, projects through the Centre for Mathematical needs, research collaborations and MOU with foreign Universities. Three of the faculty members Dr Pradeep G Siddheswar, Dr Mahanthesh B and Dr Pundikala Veerasha are in the top 2% scientists listed by Stanford University. Dr Mayamma Joseph, Professor and Head, Department of Mathematics was awarded the Christ women of the year 2023. Through campus placements, 56% of UG students and 30 % of PG students were placed. Overall, the academic year saw an exponential growth in all its endeavours.



## DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS AND ELECTRONICS

The Department of Physics and Electronics has been active over the last academic year with focus on student centric activity and research. The weekly research colloquium, discussion forums like Let's Talk Astronomy and DOT Physics allows students to get a feel of current developments in physics. The annual electronics project exhibition and intercollegiate fest "Eureka" attracted active and lively participation of students. Several students in the department have won various competitions across colleges in Bengaluru. Many students have also cleared competitive national examinations and received fellowships for higher studies.

In terms of research, the department has secured multiple funding from various agencies like DST, ISRO and BRNS

for the Energy and Astrophysics research. The Department of Physics and Electronics is the first DST-FIST department of the university to receive Rs. 1.76 crores to develop the research facilities. Faculties have extensive collaboration with various national and international agencies, with fellowships and awards earned for their research work. Faculties and Students have published in international journals of repute and patented their research findings. Department has signed an MoU with Trydan Tech company for the development of materials for battery development which will provide an opportunity for students to carry out internships.





## DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

The activities of the Chemistry Association were inaugurated on 12-09-2022 by Mr. Vivek Reddy, CEO, VIGA Entertainment Technologies. The Department of Chemistry also organized inauguration of the Research Webinar Series on 24-08-22 by Prof. S. Krishna Prasad, CeNS, Bangalore and gave a talk. An intercollegiate fest CHEMOZ-2023 was organised by the department on 14 February 2023 to bring together the Chemistry fraternity from different institutions on a single platform. The students religiously engaged in this activity wherein they came together to rack their knowledge to address the recent developments in the frontiers of Chemistry.

The 29th National Conference on liquid crystals NCLC-2022 was held from 8th to 10th December 2022 organised by the Department of Chemistry CHRIST (Deemed to be University) and CARD. The mega event that spanned across three days recorded 169 registered participants comprising 20 oral and 43 poster presentations. Mr. Shibin Jasper Thomas from Aurigene Ltd, Bangalore gave a talk on Nuclear

Magnetic Resonance-An Industrial Perspective as a part of Alumni Interaction with UG and PG Chemistry students. Science exhibition was organised on the occasion of National Science Day on 28th February 2023. Poster Presentations of UG and PG students were conducted by the Department on 25th April, 2023. The informative posters displayed during the presentation were based on the Chemistry Research Projects done by both PG and UG students.

The department not only aims to foster learning and empower scholastic elevation but it also encourages the young minds to be compassionate to the destitute and the less privileged. Taking cue from this, the students of first year MSc participated in a community service programme at NEST Orphanage on Mysore Road. Campus recruitment was organised for the PG students with reputed firms like Jubilant Biosciences and Syngene International Ltd Bangalore.



## DEPARTMENT OF STATISTICS AND DATA SCIENCE



The academic year 2022-2023 has been an extraordinary journey of intellectual exploration and engagement. This academic year was very special and enriching as in its very first year of inception, the department initiated a multitude of successful ventures which were aimed at fostering connections and inspiring creativity. Different associations of the department namely, Statistics and DataScience students club (StaDa), Journal club, Association of Women for Applied Research in Data Science and Statistics (AWARDS) organized activities and events which provided an enriching experience to both students and faculty members of the department. The 2023 technical fests like DataVerse, Expectations, Predictions and non-technical fest like Tarang were successful and enhanced the technical and non technical skill set of our students.

The department organised an international conference on Artificial Intelligence in Biometrics in association with International Biometric Society, Indian Region. A National workshop on Statistical Computing Using Python was or-

ganized by the department. The department jointly organized PRISM2022 in collaboration with the Indo-Korea Science and Technology Center and the Department of Computer Science. As a distinguished initiative, the department signed a MoU with CleverInsight for introducing industry integrated PG programme MSc in Computational Statistics and Applied AI for working professionals. The department witnessed an excellent 90% PG placement record, with the highest CTC of Rs 16,00,000/- and with the highest monthly internship stipend of Rs. 56,000/-. The department contributed to the Child Sponsorship Program of CSA. The office bearers of the constituted alumni association of the department were identified. Alumni contribution was notable in activities such as orientations, project evaluation, placement guidance etc. As we reflect on the success of these celebrations, we look forward to continuing our commitment to statistical and data science education, research and innovation in the years to come.



## DEPARTMENT OF HOTEL MANAGEMENT



The department hosted its signature events interspersed throughout the academic year.

**A Handful of Food-** is an initiative brought up by the Parivaar community from the Department of Hotel Management, on the occasion of the 175th Anniversary of the establishment of the first educational institution by St Kuriakose Elias Chavara. It is an initiative to provide mid-day meals to 140 government school children in the project area.

**Dining Experience-** was organized in collaboration with Ms Anita Rao founder of Sakriya and a social activist for the inmates of Anatha Sishu Sevashrama. It aimed at curating an experience for underprivileged children through a fine dining restaurant service. Spreading Love with Food.

**Alumni Family Day-** the Christ University Department of Hotel Management held its Annual Alumni Family Day, around 60 alumni attended, an alumni wall was dedicated to our notable alumni to inspire current students to strive for success, create a sense of community and pride among alumni.

**Utsava-** is a new initiative started by SWĀD to showcase a huge variety of authentic and unique meat preparations from different parts of the country prepared by the graduating batch of culinary students. 100 Guests relished a lavish spread of 40 decadent dishes. **Arome -** A two- day food festival counselled by the final year students celebrating different cuisines and food cultures worldwide. The students managed 10 stalls and provided excellent service while engaging with the visitors, learning the art of service, aesthetics, and crowd management.



## DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND MANAGEMENT – BBA

## DEPARTMENT OF LAW



Workshops, Conferences and Panel Discussions were organized to raise the awareness of School of Law students regarding important national and global issues. Lectures on SDG 16 - Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions, Workshop on Wildlife crimes in India, Panel Discussions on Fashion Law and Understanding the role of Facial Recognition Technology in Policy Vacuum were organised by different committees of School of Law, CHRIST. Awareness programs were conducted on the eve of International Women's Day, Environment Day, Human Rights Day, Samvidhan Divas, Ambedkar Jayanti and birth anniversary of Dr Rajendra Prasad. The students of the School of Law showed enthusiasm in disseminating legal knowledge by consistently publishing magazines such as Causa et Consilium, Lex Scripta, Intellectualis, and Fluid.

The School of Law organized its flagship events such as the National Moot Court Competition, International Model United Nations Conference, National Writ Petition Drafting Competition, National Online Med-Arb Competition, National Conference, and the National Trial and Judgement Writing Competition. Students of School of Law have won national and international awards across various competitions. They have been presented with opportunities for experiential learning through six legal aid and awareness programmes in neighbouring villages, visits to Lok Adalats, prisons, and courts, as well as research projects. All of these have enriched their educational experiences. Additionally, cultural and sports activities have been organised throughout the year to enable the students to develop their personalities holistically.



## DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The School of Education emphasised whole person education via a range of activities. Workshops were organised on important topics such as Smart Board, Socio-emotional Learning, Individualised Education Plans, Art Integration, Educational Equity, Research, and First Aid. Talks on Design Thinking, Self Defence, Implementing SDG, Work-Life Balance, and Academic Writing were arranged. The 75th Independence Day, Teachers' Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Human Rights, Science Day, and Women's Day were celebrated. The alumni's help was utilised in career guidance; placement events were also hosted.

They actively took part in the US-India Gateway Programme 2022 with Western Michigan University. Our students trained over 5000 first-year students about the University Library in BookMark. The Community Living Camp at Veldur, Srinivaspura Taluk, Kolar District, Karnataka helped the students to give back to society.

## DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH AND CULTURAL STUDIES



The annual student-led conference was organised by the students of our MA English with Communication Studies in collaboration with Manchester Metropolitan University, UK titled “Beyond Boundaries: Reading Literature Culture in a Posthuman Society.”

The Cultural Studies Cell of the School of Arts and Humanities inaugurated a Cultural Studies Methodology Cell to promote a rigorous approach to research in the Humanities. An international conference-Migrant Workers, Cultural (Re)Production and Industry in South Asia was also jointly organised by the cell with the Department of Sociology, Tezpur University, Assam.

The Ecological Diversity Cell of our Department in keeping with the UN SDG organised a short film fest and conducted three events every month, a Book Talk, a trek and an activity based stall to promote an awareness of ecological issues. Organisations like WWF and Greenpeace have partnered with our cell in our commitment to the environment.

The Inclusivity Cell organized several guest lectures. Dr. Bodh Prakash, Former Professor, Ambedkar University, Delhi delivered a talk on Partition Literature. Pratyush Dayal from

Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, Saskatoon, threw light on the dynamics of representation of indigenous communities in the Media.

Dr. C. G. Shyamala addressed concerns in Masculinities and Dr. Kaustav Bakshi from Jadavpur University spoke on Queer Gaze in the films of Rituparno Ghosh. A wide range of concerns ranging from gender, caste, nationalism, indigenous rights, subalternity and popular culture were addressed to extend the scope of intersectional approaches to questions of inclusivity.

The Incubation Cell conducted field trips to visit startup sites and launched StartUp Shala with an overview of innovative initiatives in the area of English and Cultural Studies.

The MA newsletter and review magazine-Quill's Will- continued to provide timely and lively discussions pertaining to literary and cultural production over the year.



## DEPARTMENT OF LANGUAGES

The activities of the Department of Languages for the academic year 2022-23 began with the inauguration of 'Bhasha Parishat', the Centre for Culture. Students and professional teams presented various cultural programmes on the occasion.

The stall put up by the department for Daksh, the career and guidance fair drew a good crowd eager to know about the Indian and foreign languages offered by the department. 'Wikipedia in Education' was presented as one of the two best practices of our institution during the NAAC assessment. A Wiki-Club also was formed to strengthen the Wikipedia activities in the campus.

Kannada Sangha is celebrating its golden Jubilee this year. The sangha published the 256th book recently. Various events like special lecture series and book exhibitions were organized as part of the jubilee celebrations. 'Kavi Dina' was organised by the Kannada Sangha on 31 January 2022 to commemorate the great Kannada writer Dr Bendre's life and works. Kannada student theatre group staged the play 'Sati' written by H S Shivaprakash and won many prizes in various competitions. Students underwent a two-week long Yakshagana training in September 2022 and they performed a Yakshagana piece titled 'Kaviratna Kalidasa' in the main auditorium.

## DEPARTMENT OF PERFORMING ARTS



The academic year 2022 – 2023 was full of fervour for the Department of Performing Arts, CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Bangalore Central Campus which offers two courses: BA in Performing Arts, English and Psychology and a weekend course in MA Performing Arts (Bharatanatyam).

The year opened up with institutional and departmental level orientation sessions for the incoming students. Students participated in various intra-university events and bagged several positions. The students also collaborated with the School of Business and Management to organise a workshop that focused on empathy in decision making. 

## DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

The Department of Economics has completed another eventful year in terms of its journey towards the goal.

Under the banner of AMARTYA, the Economics Association at CHRIST University, a wide range of faculty-student driven activities was kick-started for the academic year 2022-23. The inauguration of AMARTYA marked the beginning of various activities of the Department.

The Association pioneered a whole range of co-curricular and extracurricular activities ranging from the release of the Department magazine to the national level Economics fest for UG and PG students. Four issues of 'Ephemeris', the Department magazine, provided a platform for the students and faculty to voice their opinions and ideas.

The Economics Fest, ALTIUS, was inaugurated on 16 September 2022 by Dr Anant Kamat from NIAS, Bangalore. In the inaugural address he dwelled upon the prospects and challenges of Indian Economy in the post Covid world.

On 17 February 2023, the Department hosted the 14th edition of the prestigious national level Young Economist Competition (YEC). The competition aims at promoting research at the undergraduate level. The department also organised one day National Conference on "Prospects and Challenges of

Labour Market Outcome in Post Covid India on 24 April, 2023. The Department organised many guest interactions during this academic year on various topics of relevance.

An Activity Club 'Aahwan' was inaugurated by Dr. Fr. Jose CC for taking care of various extra-curricular initiatives for UG students. The Department organised a series of student panel discussions and Alumni-Corporate connects under its banner. The interclass football tournament organised by the Department of Economics provided a platform for the students of different academic programmes to come together. The Department also organised a one-day workshop on Democracy and Economy for the master's students for which the sessions were handled by a group of experts led by Dr. Anjore from Azim Premji University, Bangalore.

The faculty members have made a significant contribution through research publications, presentations, consultancy, externally funded research projects and extension activities in this academic year. A good number of joint researches have been published in high quality journals. The placements of masters and bachelors students continued to remain very robust. The academic year concluded with a valedictory function on 28 May to facilitate the office bearers and student leaders of the Department of Economics.





## DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY



The Department of Psychology at Bangalore Central Campus conducted the fifth International conference on Counselling, Psychotherapy and Wellness and the third meeting of the International Society for Policy Research and Evaluation in School Based Counselling between January 5 and 8, 2023. The conference saw specialized tracks in clinical psychology, neuropsychology and substance use disorders. The department also hosted several in residence from Canada, South Africa, and United States of America. The department hosted the Young Psychologist Competition and Undergraduate research conference on April 01, 2023. The clinical services of the department were stepped up by setting up specialized clinics called COGFIT (for assessment



and remediation of cognitive functions) and WEVOLVE (for health and wellbeing services). A number of laboratories and specialized clinical training rooms were inaugurated by Dr Ricardo Machon, Loyola Marymount University in January 2023. The annual psychology festival Silhouette showcased a number of activities led by vibrant study body of the department that included workshops, street theatre, singing completions and exhibitions. The department is currently exploring new collaborative programmes in family therapy with Louisiana Tech, and Applied Behavior Analysis with Binghampton University, USA.



## DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

Certain results are eternal. The Department of Commerce, CHRIST Deemed to Be University was ranked as one of the 'Top Commerce Colleges' in India yet again in the Best Colleges survey conducted by India Today. In another rare honour, the IMA CHRIST Student Chapter was awarded the 'Gold Certificate Student Award of Excellence' by the Institute of Management Accountants, USA. This is the first student chapter in India to have received this coveted award.

During the year, the Department organised numerous events through CUCA and its affiliate clubs in a bid to create a continuous learning environment for the students. Parambh and Mitige were conducted exclusively for our students to provide them with a platform to showcase their talents across multiple fields. Prayas, the inter-collegiate business event was held in early March with teams from different premier institutions of India battling across various unique sub-events like Prashnottari and Pareekshana.



In a continuation of earlier years, events like File and Smile and DOC Model United Nations were held successfully. The Department, after almost a decade, won the Overall Trophy in the inter-deanery cultural fest 'Blossoms'. For the first time post pandemic, we also conducted CORPUS Conclave, an event where stalwarts from industry were invited to share their experiences and challenges with our students and faculties to bridge the academia-industry gap.

Samshodhan, a national level research seminar, was successfully organised by the post graduate students of the Department on the theme 'Accelerating Research and Solutions for attaining Business Resilience and Sustainability.' The Department also hosted an International Conference in hybrid mode in the second week of March on the theme 'Sustaining a Competitive Edge in the Changing Global Scenario', in collaboration with professional bodies IMA (USA) and CISI (UK)



## DEPARTMENT OF PROFESSIONAL STUDIES (DPS)



The Department of Professional Studies (DPS) had an enriching and productive year with a blend of academic and extracurricular activities with 45 achievers in CA (intermediate), 3 in Insurance Fellowship, 38 in CIMA, 18 ACCA affiliates, 4 in CPA (USA), 2 in CMA and 14 achievers for CFA (L1). This has also been a year of innovations and recognitions. Students secured 9 overall first positions in prestigious Business Fests. The department nurtured talent in sports through the annual sports festival, PROATHLON. Various programmes like CONFLUENCE, the first-year orientation programme; COGNITO, the flagship national level business fest; FUTUREMUN, the Model United Nations; CONSILIUM, a policy fest and SURAKSHA CHAKRA, an insur-

ance-based consultancy project were conducted. Outreach Programmes like Genesys, Nimmagagi Mahiti and the activities of S.A.F.E. the club, witnessed the departments' endeavours recognising social responsibility. The department also excelled in research publications and hosted an International Research Conference titled Policy Conflux. Newsletters including Magnate, Policy Matters and Pratibimb were digitally published. The DPS takes pride in being able to groom its 2400+ students into budding professionals and holistic individuals through uniquely designed UG/PG programmes and various employability skill enhancement programmes.



## CENTRE FOR EAST ASIAN STUDIES



Taking note of the importance of the East Asian region to both Indian and global policy formulations, the 'Centre for East Asian Studies' is dedicated to enhancing the understanding of the region in the country and beyond. To achieve this, the Centre has organized several academic events such as the China Talk Series, Ambassador Lecture Series, Distinguished Lecture Series, Online Certificate Course in collaboration with 'Asia Slate,' and an intensive Internship Program. In collaboration with the National Institute of Advanced Studies, it organized an India-Japan Dialogue at

Christ University on 12 April 2023. The Centre also has brought out peer-reviewed publications: Working Papers, and Perspectives, apart from reporting all the events on its website. During 2022-23, the Centre successfully unveiled its brochure and logo. It also launched its own social media platforms that receive wide attention. In addition, the Centre has actively participated in the Australia-India Leadership Dialogue, Mizuho-India Japan Study Centre Foundation Day, Western Sydney University Sustainable Development Goal Forum.





## CENTRE FOR INDIAN AND FOREIGN LANGUAGES (CIFL)

Renewing the tie up with Alliance Française de Bangalore and Goethe Institut Max Mueller Bhavan, Bangalore, and entering into a fresh tie up with Instituto Cervantes, Delhi, the Centre for Indian and Foreign Languages (CIFL) launched the A1 level of French, German and Spanish respectively. Begun in August 2022, the 120-hour courses were spread over two semesters of 60 hours each.

Catering to basic language skills and corresponding to level one (A1) in the six-level scale of competence laid down in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, the first post pandemic batches had 19 students for French, 18 for German and 16 for Spanish from across different disciplines. The course started in August 2022, and ended in April 2023. While the French and German international exams would be held in July 2023, 7 Spanish students gave the DELE A1 exams on Saturday 13 May 2023.



## CENTRE FOR DIGITAL INNOVATION (CDI)

The Centre for Digital Innovation (CDI) at CHRIST University is a vibrant ecosystem where the seeds of technological knowledge and collaboration are sown, nurtured, and harvested.

CDI (Global) facilitates workshops, internships as well as industry-level consultancy and research projects. In 2023, the Centre in collaboration with Indo-Korea Science and Technology Center (IKST) conducted a research idea contest for the students, faculty members and Researchers from all over India. The Centre offers an industry internship opportunity and placement through a consultancy agreement with Timbel India in the area of AI transcription.

The Centre also signed consultancy agreements with IKST for the following projects: Report on Leading AI Firms and Institutions, AI robotics internship in South Korea and AI Hackathon. The Centre has initiated a Global IT internship program with Kyungpook National University and a social and cultural collaboration program with Seoul Women's University. This year, WeJump.org, the Centre's social innovation initiative, has made a contribution to CHRIST University's achievement of being ranked as the 39th global university

in the category of innovation for the 4th Industrial Revolution.

CDI (ERP) is a division of the Centre for Digital Innovation which provides comprehensive solutions to its stakeholders in a manner that integrates well all key stakeholder deliverables. The ERP system is used across the campuses by staff and students. There are mobile applications developed for staff and students to access their personal data through their smartphones.

The Centre has continued adding new features and improving existing ones on the current ERP in line with the requirements of the students and staff at the university. Enhancements include payment gateway integration, exam-related features for students such as the option to select one's examination centre and the choice to opt between online and offline modes among others. Key feature enhancements for staff includes the integration of the new biometric machines, an option to upload staff investment declarations and the provision to upload research proposals. The Centre is parallelly building a new ERP with features to support complete academic life.





## CENTRE FOR RESEARCH (PHD)

The Centre for Research offers PhD programs in twenty-eight disciplines. There are 496 empaneled supervisors who have been allotted scholars in different disciplines. The Centre for Research initiated scholarship schemes for the eligible PhD scholars from 2017 onwards.

Centre for Research confers the academic degree of Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) on the eligible candidates based on the coursework in research methodology in the particular domain/s, publications in refereed journals, participation and/or presentation in National/International seminars, a thesis, and its evaluation after which public defense. The Various stages of the doctoral program are admission, validation of research proposal, PhD registration, progress review, submission of progress reports, PhD synopsis submission, defense, PhD thesis submission and final defense and award of Doctoral Degree. The degree certificate indicates the discipline under which the degree was pursued, the title of the thesis and the date of public defense. Currently there are 1845 PhD scholars pursuing their research under different disciplines.

PhD scholars selected during June/December 2022 have completed a weeklong orientation and completed their coursework.

The respective Departments review the progress of the scholars every six months and submit the reports to the Centre for Research. The 2022 June cohort of PhD scholars are currently undergoing validation of proposal presentation and are required to submit their PhD research proposal subject to the approval of the Department and Research Advisory Committee members.

22 PhD scholars have successfully defended their PhD viva voce examination and awarded PhD degree in the convocation held during February 2023. 23 scholars have successfully completed their PhD viva-voce examination and are eligible to receive their degree in the forthcoming convocation to be held in July 2023.



## CENTRE FOR STUDENT COUNCIL

The induction and oath-taking ceremony of the newly appointed University Student Council representatives took place on 12th May 2022 at the Bangalore Central Campus. In an earnest attempt to address queries from the incoming freshers, the Student Council put up Student booths across the campus in August. The Student Council was instrumental in organising different events and activities for Teachers' Day celebrations. DAKSH, the flagship event organised by the Student Council was held on the 27th and 28th of January, 2023 in a hybrid fashion. The University Level Student Council members met the Vice Chancellor once every semester. These meetings were convened on 1st December 2022 and 24th April 2023. As a symbol of student gratitude towards the unending support offered by the housekeeping, security and administrative staff, the Council organised Gratitude Week in April.





## CENTRE FOR LIBRARY AND INFORMATION CENTRE



The students at CHRIST University have access to 2 libraries at the Central Campus. The library services are fully automated, and the latest software version is being used. The library website is updated regularly.

During the academic year, the Library added 5,060 books to its existing collection of 2,59,598 books. The Library renewed 214 journals and 80 magazines for the year. The Library also renewed its subscription to online resources like JSTOR, ProQuest, Oxford University Press, Emerald, EBSCO, Cambridge University Press, Bloomsbury, Taylor and Francis, and other e-resources. With the renewal of e-resources, the Library now has more than 50,000 e-journal collections, 4,00,000 e-books and 5000 digital magazines and newspapers, in addition to conference proceedings, thesis and dissertations and statistical reports. The total library expenditure for the year was 6.8 crore.

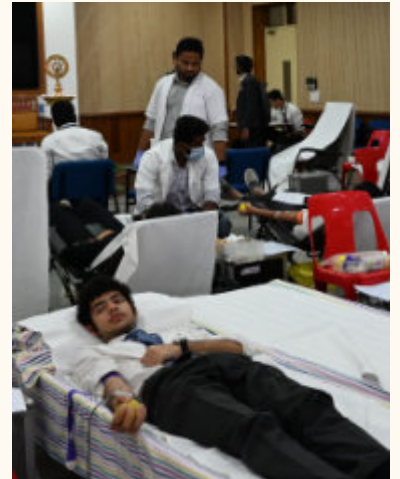
The total number of books issued during the year was 1,79,667 and 1,99,469 books were returned. The average number of walk-in users was 850 daily, including students, faculties and non-teaching staff.

The Central Campus library has provided Wi-fi hotspots to walk-in users of the Library. 8,835 walk-in users utilised and benefited from the Wi-Fi hotspots during the year.

The Library conducted 'Bookmark 2022' with the School of Education. A library orientation on using library resources was provided to all the first years with the support of the School of Education students. The library has also conducted event-based book displays during national and international events.

## CENTRE FOR ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Christ University Alumni Foundation represents the voice of all graduated Christites of the University and is committed to enhance the growth of the University by providing a wide range of resources and opportunities. 8550 (Batch of 2022) graduating students have been registered as alumni. Major activities conducted during the year are Alumni Scholarship, Annual Family Day, Medical Camp, Blood Donation Camp and Alumni Batch Reunion. Department Alumni Activity involved in supporting various activities like placement assistance, internship, event judgement during fests, workshop, panel discussion, conducting talks by alumni on various topics, student project evaluation etc. The alumni association looks forward to support and nurture the community in the years to come.





## CENTRE FOR TEACHING LEARNING ENHANCEMENT CELL (TLEC)

The Teaching Learning Enhancement Cell (TLEC) at CHRIST focuses on capacity building for faculty in higher education to enhance teaching, learning, and assessment within the framework of the University's emphasis on holistic development. It provides support and opportunities to strengthen our practices. The activities undertaken by the Cell work within the larger focus on the holistic development of the learners and the guidelines provided by the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP).

The Cell sought representation from all campuses and went through a phase of expansion in 2022. It supported the University in the adoption of the principles of Outcome Based Education across the departments. It also reviewed pedagogical practices within the University and conceptualised, designed, and organised workshops for capacity building that would enhance our practices.

TLEC has worked on the guidelines as well as other essential components of the curriculum as the University has moved to adopt UGCs Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes from the next academic year. It has supported departments across the University as they designed curricula in accordance with the new framework in keeping with the essence of the NEP 2020.



## CENTRE FOR ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT (CAPS)

The Centre for Academic and Professional Support (CAPS) is an invaluable resource at the University, offering students the guidance and support they need to excel academically and professionally. CAPS serves as a meeting place for students from various departments and programs, encouraging them to step out of their student roles and engage in open dialogue, share ideas, and cultivate professionalism. With a focus on individual and departmental needs, CAPS provides a wide range of services to assist students. Workshops and seminars on study skills, time management, and various academic, professional, and life skills empower students, setting a global benchmark in academic circles. CAPS goes beyond academic support by helping students with their career development and job readiness. Career advisors offer guidance on resume writing, interview skills, and job search strategies, enabling students to showcase their abilities and stand out in a competitive job market. Networking events, job fairs, and internship opportunities connect students with industry professionals and employers, bridging

the gap between education and employment. CAPS equips students with the knowledge and skills needed to successfully transition into the workplace.

In the academic year 2022-23, CAPS embarked on various initiatives, including the Start-up Sprint, which supported student-entrepreneurs with innovative start-up ideas. Additionally, the Artifex event showcased diverse talents through unique competitions, while Penathon encouraged students to exhibit their creative writing skills. The Psychometric assessment wing provided students with tests and psycho-education sessions to enhance their happiness, resilience, and manage exam anxiety. Overall, CAPS is an indispensable asset within the University, offering comprehensive support to students throughout their academic journey. By focusing on academic excellence, career development, and holistic well-being, CAPS empowers students to thrive academically and professionally, equipping them with the necessary skills for success in their chosen fields.





## CENTRE FOR SOCIAL ACTION (CSA)

The Centre for Social Action (CSA) at CHRIST during the academic year 2022-3, exemplified its commitment to societal change by working towards reducing prevailing disparities and providing resources to those in need.

CSA was able to support 600 children from the project area with scholarship and educational supplies for promoting education, nutri-kit for supplementary nutrition, etc., with the funds contributed by students of Christ University. CSA has also provided an opportunity to 200 children from urban slums and rural villages through Milan 2023 - A biennial flagship event. It is a two-day celebration of the skills of the children in the Sports and Cultural, motivating children to exhibit their talents in sports and cultural activities. Students have also conducted a fundraising football tournament "Ground to Glory", exclusively for Christites, and raised over ₹1.5 lakhs. This fund is now being utilised to provide health care, well-being, and education of children in the project areas. In order to contribute to women empowerment CSA had collaborated with an NGO Vimochana for conducting "Covid Courts of Women". 800 women and 500 students have participated in this programme. The students in particular were sensitised about an entirely different section of society, the harsh realities of the pandemic experienced by marginalised women. A film festival "Samabhav" was held in collaboration with MAVA, aimed to promote sensitization on gender equity, diversity, and inclusion. CSA ensured Mid-day meal to marginalised children/students in collaboration with Dept. of Hotel Management, thus working towards alleviating poverty, sensitising them on the significance of nutritional food. Clean-up Drives and Tree Plantation were also taken up aiming at promotion of a clean and green environment, and emphasising on the importance of sustainability. Social responsibility of students has increased in promoting and nurturing a greener environment through planting about 10,000 saplings at Bingipura landfill.

CSA has also been implementing various development activities focusing on the development of children and women through Child Protection Committees, Self Help

Groups and its apex body Federation for the Devadasi and Marginalised Communities of Jamkhandi Taluk in Karnataka and Tribal communities of Kanker district of Chhattisgarh. Summer camps for children were conducted benefiting 455 children from urban slum and rural areas. This has provided the children with an opportunity to learn teamwork, develop skills and to exhibit their talents this year. Both in rural villages and urban slums, important international days and other local days of importance were celebrated. Providing rural learning to the students has been possible during this academic year. Around 1000 Christites, and another 49 students within India and international universities have got an opportunity to learn from the rural communities during this year. They were sensitised towards working with marginalised communities to become socially responsible. 74 marginalised youths from urban slums were also helped to develop soft skills, communication skills, customer relation skills, retail skills, etc., and were employed with various merchandise outlets.

Student Volunteerism of CSA had brought in a re-structured approach for engaging the students more meaningfully. The re-structured Student Volunteerism will engage students through six cohorts, viz., i) Education & Skill Development, ii) Child Sponsorship, iii) Social Entrepreneurship, iv) Environmental Sustainability, v) Health, Hygiene and Wellbeing and vi) Media & Advocacy. CSA contributes to environment and ecology by maintaining a separate unit "Parivarthana" focusing on managing the waste generated in the campus and has controlled the rejected waste by only 5.22 %, whereas 10 to 15 % is allowed by BBMP. During this academic year, CSA had partnered with United Nations on UNAI, Ministry of Human Resources Development (MHRD) for the UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN, Social Entrepreneurship, and Swachta, Rural Engagement Cell (SES REC) for Sanitisation and Hygiene, Waste Management, Water Management, Energy Conservation and Greenery. CSA has responded to the initiatives of Govt. of India by contributing to Government Schemes including New India Literacy Programme, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Swachh Bharat, and Atma Nirbhar Bharath.

## CENTRE FOR COUNSELLING AND HEALTH SERVICES

The Centre for Counselling & Health Services (CCHS) strives to maximise student engagement and success in the University and beyond by providing responsive and practical support, education and health care services.

In the academic year 2022-23, CCHS initiated several activities for the betterment and well-being of the CHRIST community.

Through our new MOU with St. John's National Academy of Health Sciences, the Health Centre introduced the Certificate Programme in Basic First Aid by St. John's Medical College - Division of Occupational Health Services

Through the academic year a total of 484 Christites, including students, security personnel, staff and faculty completed

the Certificate Programme in Basic First Aid, enabling a first-aid-ready campus.

From the list of students who completed the above course, volunteers were selected based on a written assessment and interview process, to be members of RAFT, Christ University's Rapid Action First-aid Team, a flagship initiative by CCHS, possibly the first of its kind in the country. During a formal Investiture Ceremony presided by the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar, RAFT members were inducted into the team.





## CENTRE FOR ASSOCIATION OF CHRISTIAN CHRISTITES (ACC)

Association of Christian Christities (ACC) is a community consisting of all the Christian students in our institution. ACC is supported by a team of committed people who, through sincere prayers, share the same vision and objective as the ministry. In order to realise its objective, ACC reaches out to people through five key domains. They are outreach, audio-visual, media & communication, and animation

On August 26, 2022, the inaugural mass in DVK marked the start of the 2022–23 academic year. The main celebrant was Rev. Fr. Thomas C. Mathew. The other celebrants included Rev. Fr. Jose CC, Fr. Lijo Thomas, Fr.

Joseph Kuriathara, and Fr. Thomas Mangalam. Alegre, an orientation programme was held for all freshmen to learn more about ACC and to determine their roles in a team. The University Core team, Deanery level team, and class reps were chosen. To introduce students to a Godly experience and provide an overview of the leadership positions, Transcend, a leadership training programme, was organised for the denary level team. Additionally, ACC members organised a Taizé Worship that includes liturgical readings, meditation, songs, and chanted prayers. A CR workshop was held for all of the Class Representatives from all the departments. Christmas Mass and celebrations were held in December to strengthen the fellowship by sharing the Christmas message.

Founder's Day was observed on January 3rd in honour of our founder, St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara. There was a quiz



## OFFICE OF IT SERVICES

Office of IT Services at Christ University endeavors to provide effective and prompt service so as to achieve total satisfaction to all its stake holders in the university. Processes and objectives have been defined to optimize its operations. Documentation and analysis methods are in place for the continued Service improvement.

### OFFICE OF IT SERVICES

Roles and Services IT Infrastructure IT Infrastructure is well designed to handle student and staff strength. Usage of IT services like knowledge pro (KP), Learning management systems (Moodle), Digital learning sessions and other IT related activities are extensive due to which infrastructure upgrade is done to handle the load efficiently. New higher end Servers are in place and Internet bandwidth has been upgraded for the effective internet usage. IT Services infrastructure Support processes has been implemented to facilitate the effective use of all the services offered to the stake holders with adequate IT infrastructure

### IT SUPPORT

Office of IT Services offers Hardware/ Software/Network support to all users in Christ University by carrying out various activities at the appropriate time. It has also initiated the implementation of various processes to meet the requirement of quality system support and maintenance. Network security enhancement is enforced by implementing Network access privileges to the staff members and students. Support Request handling tool has been implemented to automate the infrastructure support requests from the staff members and students. This is to track and ensure that all requests are handled in time by the IT Infrastructure Support staff. Infrastructure Module incorporated in Knowledge Pro (ERP System) for staff and students are in use to register issues related to all the Services provided by the University. This is tracked and coordinated by office of IT Services to make sure that requests are effectively addressed within 24 hours. Escalation matrix is implemented up to the top level of the management to enhance the efficiency of the support system. A dedicated team is handling and monitoring IT Support requests.

### WEBSITE MANAGEMENT

Christ university website content management is monitored by a dedicated team who coordinate with various departments to update latest contents like News and events, details about academic programs, faculty members, syllabus, and evaluation systems. IT Service team also maintains dedicated pages for exam alerts and support services.

### SOCIAL MEDIA CONTENT MANAGEMENT

Regular updates on social media platforms like Instagram, Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, Flickr, blogs etc. are carried out by Office of IT Services on daily basis to facilitate the public reach of the departments and university.

### ERP – KNOWLEDGE PRO

ERP is enhanced with new features facilitating online solutions for the academic needs of the staff, students and parents. New features and tools are added in KP as per request from various departments in consultation with the management. A dedicated team is in the campus for the development and monitoring of our ERP software. KP training and implementation is handled and monitored by IT team.

### DIGITAL TRAINING TEAM

Digital learning training team is a part of IT Services department with the responsibility to assist and train staff and faculty in IT related activities. The team also trains faculty members to prepare and implement Online Certification courses using Moodle – The Learning Management System. Training materials are prepared by the team for Moodle and useful Digital tools which are being distributed.

### SERVICES OFFERED AND MONITORED BY IT TEAM:

Mobile applications for faculty and Students Learning Management System (Moodle) Intranet Databank – for students to download eBook, articles and study materials. Online Databases - For students to access books, articles, journals and research publications. Repository – This Service assist students in their exam preparation by providing questions banks for the previous years E-journals - This service pro-



vides members of the university access to e-journals for research, self-learning and preparations for assignments and presentations.

**Library Services** – Provides online library catalogue to search books, new book arrival details, Online renewal/reservations, SMS and email alerts for all transaction.

**Email services for staff and students** -. University provides official email IDs to the staff members and students. Class wise Group Email ID is made available for the faculty members and students for effective communication. Bulk mailing of university level / department level circulars is carried out by the office of IT Services.

At CHRIST Consulting, we empower students to work alongside over 200 experienced faculty members who serve as mentors and guides throughout the project engagements. In 2023 alone, the consultancy centre initiated 17 impactful projects, marking a significant milestone in its journey.

Amongst the very many projects, one notable project CHRIST Consulting undertook was the market research conducted for Ed4All, UK High Commission. Recognising the significance of technology in education, the project aimed to gain deep insights into how technology was integrated into Indian schools and its overall impact on students' learning experiences.

## OFFICE OF PERSONNEL RELATIONS

Office of Personnel Relations in CHRIST (Deemed to be University) works as a strategic partner to provide an effective workforce and institutional capabilities that drive excellence in the University. It is responsible for recruitments, attendance and leave monitoring, faculty and staff appraisal, salary fitment, financial incentives, welfare measures and grievance redressal of the employees. Our mission is to ensure timely and accurate processing, recording, and delivery of Personnel Services to all the faculty and staff of the University as well as candidates seeking employment with CHRIST (Deemed to be University).

In total, during this academic year 239 faculty and 150 staff members were recruited in various Departments/Centres

and Offices which includes 6 Research Assistants and 4 Post Doctoral Fellows. In addition to the list we have also engaged 175 and 182 guest faculties in even and odd Semester respectively. 109 faculty members were promoted to the higher level. 339 faculty/staff were relieved from service for various reasons. 168 faculty members utilised the Financial Incentives offered by the University for their Paper Presentation, attending Conferences and completing MOOC/online courses from various universities. In total, as of the close of this fiscal year, CHRIST had 2440 employees. (1265 faculty, 1151 staff, 12 Research Assistants and 12 Post Doctoral Fellows).



## OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

With the academic year 2022-2023 starting off with high aspirations, the Office of International Affairs started off with its key focus on student welfare and partnership management. Even before the semester started, students were invited for a rejoining online orientation session followed by coffee and a campus tour to get a feel of the campus life. The current toll of international students on campus comes to approx. 525 students who throughout the year were not just active but were completely involved in regular activities. Amongst these were multiple educational tours having social and service learning, city culture and historical visits to Mysore.

The Summer School 2022 and India Gateway programme welcomed students from multiple partner institutions globally to be a part of the campus life at CHRIST University and have a varied experience of the student life through the various sessions; academic and cultural.

The year 2022-2023 also marked an important year for partnership management as over 40 faculties visited various

institutions and partnered for various teaching activities, project discussions, research work and exploratory discussions with most being funded or cofunded.

It was also a year that saw over 120 visiting faculties to CHRIST University where they were engaged in teaching and research discussions staying at the University and engaging in co-teaching opportunities.

This year saw a huge number of students coming into the University to take part and associate themselves in short term and long term semester-wise exchange and internships through facilitations from the Center for Social Action.

## OFFICE OF EXAMINATION



The office of Examination at Central Campus is responsible for managing various aspects of the examination process. The office facilitates and monitors examinations and examination related work to thousands of students every semester. It starts with the Mid-Semester Examination which is conducted twice in Odd and Even Semester in September and February. Two End Semester Examinations for all UG-PG programmes, one in December and another in the May month are conducted. It also conducts end trimester examination for MBA programmes. In between, supplementary examinations are held for Odd Semester and Even Semester once in January and another in June. Special Supplementary Examination are exclusively conducted for final year students.

Exam office also takes care of students Digilocker and Academic Bank Credit(ABC) in which 493120 certificates are uploaded in Digilocker so far (63110 Degree certificates and 430010 Mark sheets) and there are 556 students created ABC account. Office of examination take the responsibility of running open elective administration and there are 3125 students registered for different open elective courses in odd semester and 2007 registered in the even semester. In the academic year 2022-23 the graduated students count in the Convocation -2022 for UG programme is 7191, PG programme is 2695, CBCS is 85, Mphil is 28 and for PhD is 25.

puses came together and shared the stage to present a wonderful dance performance.

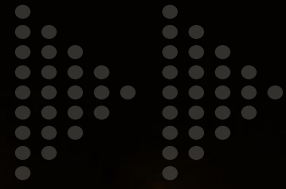

Some of the key speakers included Shankar Ramakrishnan, Kani Kusruti, Dr Bindu Menon, Jeo Baby and Kamal K.M. A hybrid workshop on Wiki-learning under the Wikipedia initiative of the university for both PG and UG students was held on the 8th and 13th of October 2022. A workshop on documentary production for beginners was conducted between 16th and 17th of February 2023.

The department conducted a series of guest lectures and Master Classes (specifically for PG students) that touched upon a varied range of subjects and themes such as Queer subjects, Dalit Studies, Translation Studies, Food Studies,

Urban Studies, crip poetry, critical kinship, sustainable development and so on. The prominent guest speakers were Dr V.B Tharakeshwar, Prof. Arunava Sinha, Dr. Sayan Dey, and Prof Niladri Ranjan Chatterjee.

Apart from academic activities, the department also engaged in many co-curricular and extra-curricular activities under the banner of the department association, Ellipsis. Ellipsis 2022-23 was inaugurated by the renowned film critic and national award winner, Dr. Blais Johny, with his keynote lecture on redefining cinematic experiences on 20 August 2023. An exciting carnival week featuring stalls and events was organised from 23 to 25 August 2023 to acquaint the first-year students with the various clubs and wings under Ellipsis. The annual flagship event of the association, Carnivalesque: The Literary Fest, based on mythology, was conducted from 6-9 March 2023. The valedictory ceremony of the fest also featured an exciting puppetry performance to promote the local and regional art forms which are on the verge of extinction.



## DEPARTMENT OF MEDIA STUDIES

The Department of Media Studies began with high spirits and passion to initiate and explore new opportunities. At the very onset, with ideas of peer bonding, 'Talent Fiesta' an event that helps freshers to showcase their inner potentials was initiated to build a sense of connection among the students followed by the department orientation by MESTA, The Media Studies Association.

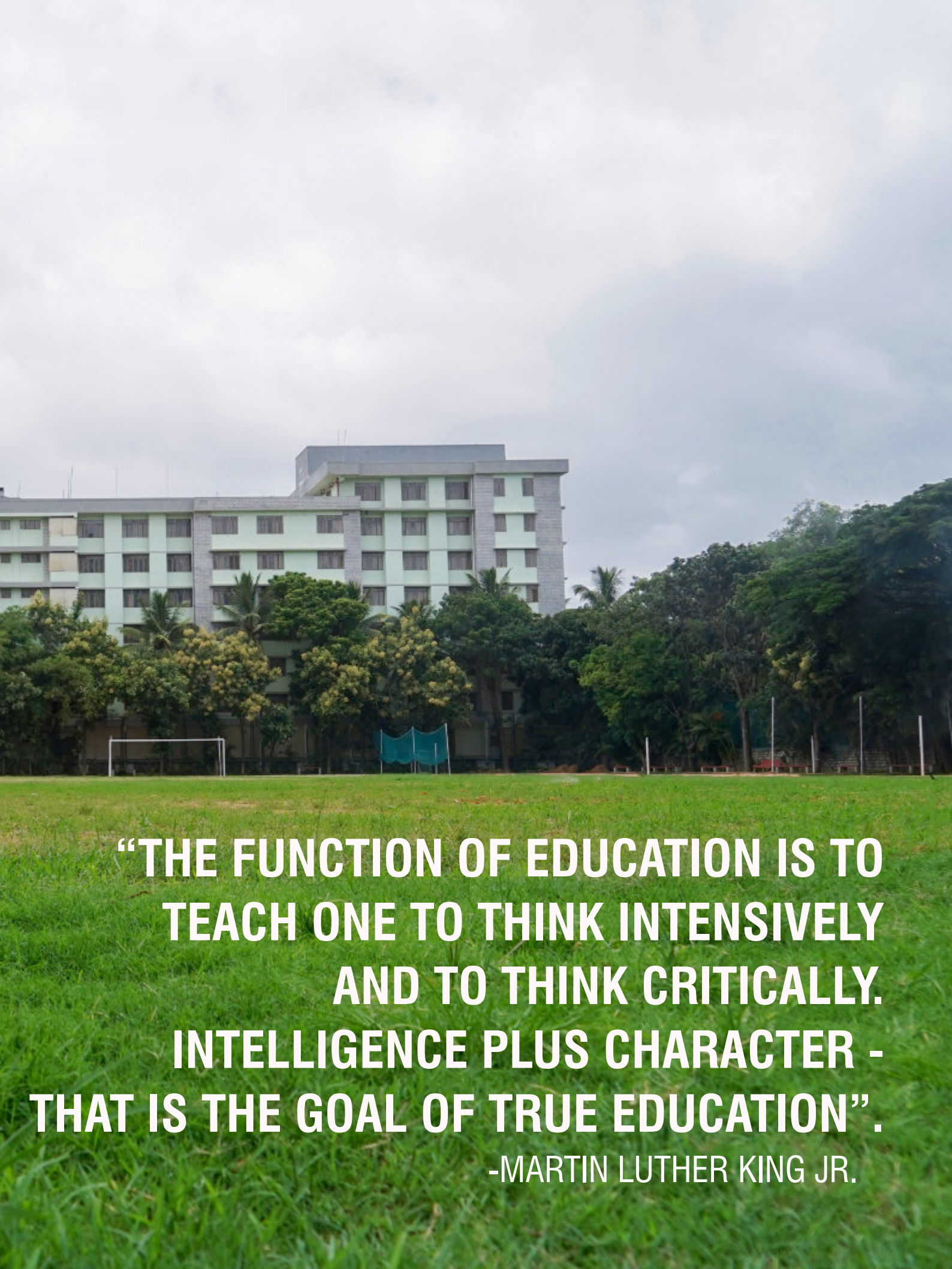

## CENTRE FOR STUDENT COUNCIL

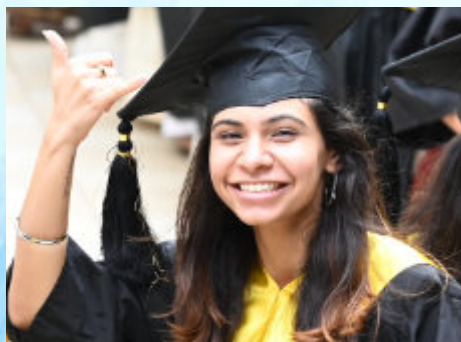

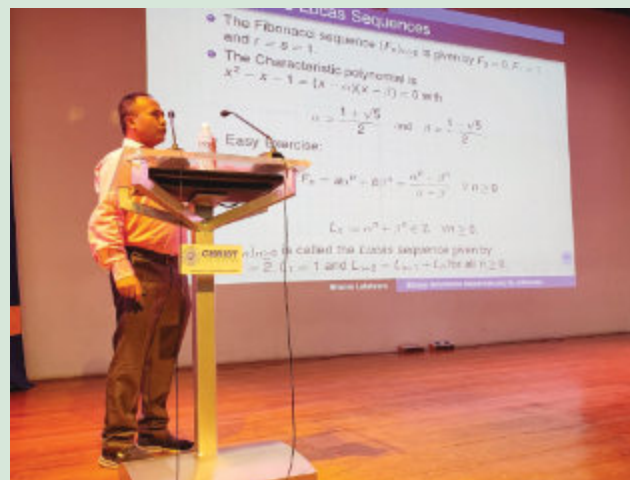



## DEPARTMENT OF SCHOOL OF ARCHITECTURE

Our close working relationship within the ecosystem of CHRIST University has evolved an academic space where social consciousness and commitment to the community constitute the vitality of our praxis. The school offers a five-year Bachelor's Degree Program, a two-year Master's Degree Program in Architecture, and a Ph.D. Program in Architecture and Sustainability. In our efforts to reinforce inclusive classrooms during this post-pandemic period, we take special care to build trust with students and to stay inspired.

As we embrace the new dimensions of the National education policy, we have been able to develop new multidisciplinary courses in the last academic year with special focus on digital proficiency, behavioral psychology, and virtual reality. We continue to extend ourselves to examine and participate in the rural reconstruction of the region and also participate in the national discourses in architecture, urban studies, and materiality with publications and a funded research project from the Council of Architecture. The exhibition of student works at the Bangalore International Exhibition Centre



(BIEC) on Politics of Ecology, Gender, and Materiality, the receipt of the Jeffrey Cook Award for the scholarship of the faculty published paper, the winning of a consultancy project from the National Highway Authority of India NHAI, and other accomplishments make the journey commendable and strengthen our students' and faculty presence within the Architecture and Design Community. Our new building, designed by the CHRIST Design Cell of School of Architec-

ture, hosted the 64th annual NASA convention ANC, serving as an academic and cultural forum for over 4500 architecture students nationally. Currently we are working on developing strong international collaborations for faculty student exchange programs, research and sustainable practices.

## CENTRE FOR STUDENT COUNCIL

The Student Council has played a pivotal role in the successful completion of the academic year 2022-23. Interaction with Dr Hiroki Shayama from Binghamton University, USA, has been a significant exposure for the students. The Industrial visits and visits to IISc have strengthened the industry/academic interactions. The department has organised an E-Waste management campaign, e-Quizzes, and IoT exhibitions. Collaboration with NASSCOM, Intel Unnati, Open Weaver, and ICT Academy is being designed.



## DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

The Department of Economics, Yeshwanthpur Campus, comprises ten full-time and two adjunct faculty members led by Dr Vineeth M as the coordinator. The Department offers Master's, Bachelor Honours, and Dual Major programmes. The newly formed department association – COGNOSCERE, was inaugurated by eminent economist Dr M. Govinda Rao on November 03, 2023. The Association organised eight invited lectures, one student panel discussion, two expert panel discussions – on Gender Equity and Union Budget 2023, and one expert talk on career guidance. The Department conducted field visits and weekly UGC-NET/JRF Mock tests for the Master's students. Ann Mary James (MA Applied Economics) was selected for the student exchange programme with the University of Cincinnati. The faculty members produced two paper publications, delivered four paper presentations and four invited talks, and became part of one research project during 2022-23. In April 2023, the Department released the first edition of its annual Newsletter – ECONSCOOP.





## DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

The Psychology Department of Yeshwanthpur Campus organised several activities in honor of "Eunoia – Mental Health Awareness Week," from 6th October 2022 to 20th October 2022. The theme for this year was 'Making Mental Health and Well-Being for All, a Global Priority'. It provided an opportunity for everyone to recognize and discuss the progress in the field of mental health. Several events were organized and students participated with immense enthusiasm which led to the great success of this event.

BSc Psychology Honours students developed a drug awareness programme called "Conscientia." The main goal of this campaign was to raise public awareness about drug usage and drug abuse.

On the 3rd of March, the Psychology Association hosted a street play competition. The theme of the street play competition was 'IKYAM: Inclusivity and Togetherness.' All the participating classes brought forth incredible stories and depictions of the struggles faced by everyone in society. Their stories covered various topics, from inter-religious conflicts, to struggles faced by LGBTQIA+ people.

As a part of observing and celebrating women's day 2023, the Psychology Association hosted a panel discussion on women's empowerment. Dr. Ananthalakshmi, the chairman of Equibeing Foundation, and Ms. Pragya, founder of Atijeevan Foundation were the panel members.



## DEPARTMENT OF PROFESSIONAL STUDIES

With the right blend of academic and extracurricular activities, the Department of Professional Studies (DPS) Yeshwanthpur Campus had a fruitful and enriching year with 19 achievers in CA (Foundation) and 17 in Insurance (Licentiate). ## DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH AND CULTURAL STUDIES





## DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

## DEPARTMENT OF LAW

## CENTRE FOR COUNSELLING AND HEALTH SERVICES

The Centre for Counselling and Health Services is a dedicated facility aimed at promoting well-being and providing comprehensive support to individuals in need. With a holistic approach to mental and physical health, this center plays a vital role in fostering a healthier and happier campus. Some of the significant activities of the centre for the academic year 2022-23 are as follows:



### Peer Education Programme (2022-23)

Peer Education is a flagship programme at the university, and the third batch of this program has been inducted in 2022-23. Students from all programs across the campus were selected to participate in the programme. The peer educators received comprehensive training on a wide range of topics, including personal and professional development, self-improvement, and building and maintaining relationships. The sessions were facilitated by campus counselors, as well as experts in their respective fields, such as Dr. Shaibya Saldahna, Ms. Mahika Singh, and Dr. Rajesh Kumar. These sessions proved to be invaluable in helping the peer educators establish meaningful and productive relationships with one another, and in upholding the legacy of Peer Education. They were equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to become torchbearers, effectively carrying forward the ideals and principles of the program. The expertise and guidance provided by the counselors and experts played a significant role in shaping the peer educators' abilities to foster positive connections and contribute positively to the student community.

### Psychoeducation Programme

Psychoeducation refers to the process of providing education and information to individuals, to help people better under-

stand concerns, therefore considered to be an essential aspect of intervention programs. Considering its importance, the Centre for Counselling and Health Services (CCHS) in collaboration with the Department of Psychology organised a training and implementation programme titled, 'Facilitators of change: Skill Training for Psycho-education'. This programme was aimed at training students to facilitate psychoeducation sessions for their fellow mates across the campus. The psychoeducation sessions were conducted on three topics: Boundaries in relationships, Personal Safety, and, Addiction and Substance Use.

### Gatekeeper Training

A Gatekeeper Training Programme was organized by the centre on 16 September 2022. The resource person for the session was Ms. Mahika Sharma, Clinical Psychologist. Participants gained a deeper understanding of the meaning, roles and responsibilities of the gatekeepers and the importance of this training. Further, students developed an understanding of QPR -Question, Persuade and Refer- with the mission to reduce suicidal behaviour and save lives by providing innovative, practical and proven suicidal prevention training.

### Health Talk

Health, stress, and sleep are interconnected aspects of our well-being that play a crucial role in our daily lives. Acknowledging the importance of the topic, the Health Centre organised a health talk on the topic 'Stress and Sleep'. The invited resource person for the session was Dr. The students were explained about the management of these three factors for maintaining physical, mental, and emotional health. Further, strategies for effectively managing these aspects in lives were also discussed for further practise.

Overall, the Centre for Counselling and Health Services serves as a pillar of support, empowering individuals to navigate life's challenges and prioritize their well-being. It serves as a beacon of hope, fostering resilience, and promoting a healthier campus.



## CENTRE FOR ASSOCIATION OF CHRISTIAN CHRISTITES (ACC)

The Association of Christian Christites (ACC) at the University upholds faith in God as its core value. The year began with the Inaugural Mass in August, followed by monthly Holy Masses. 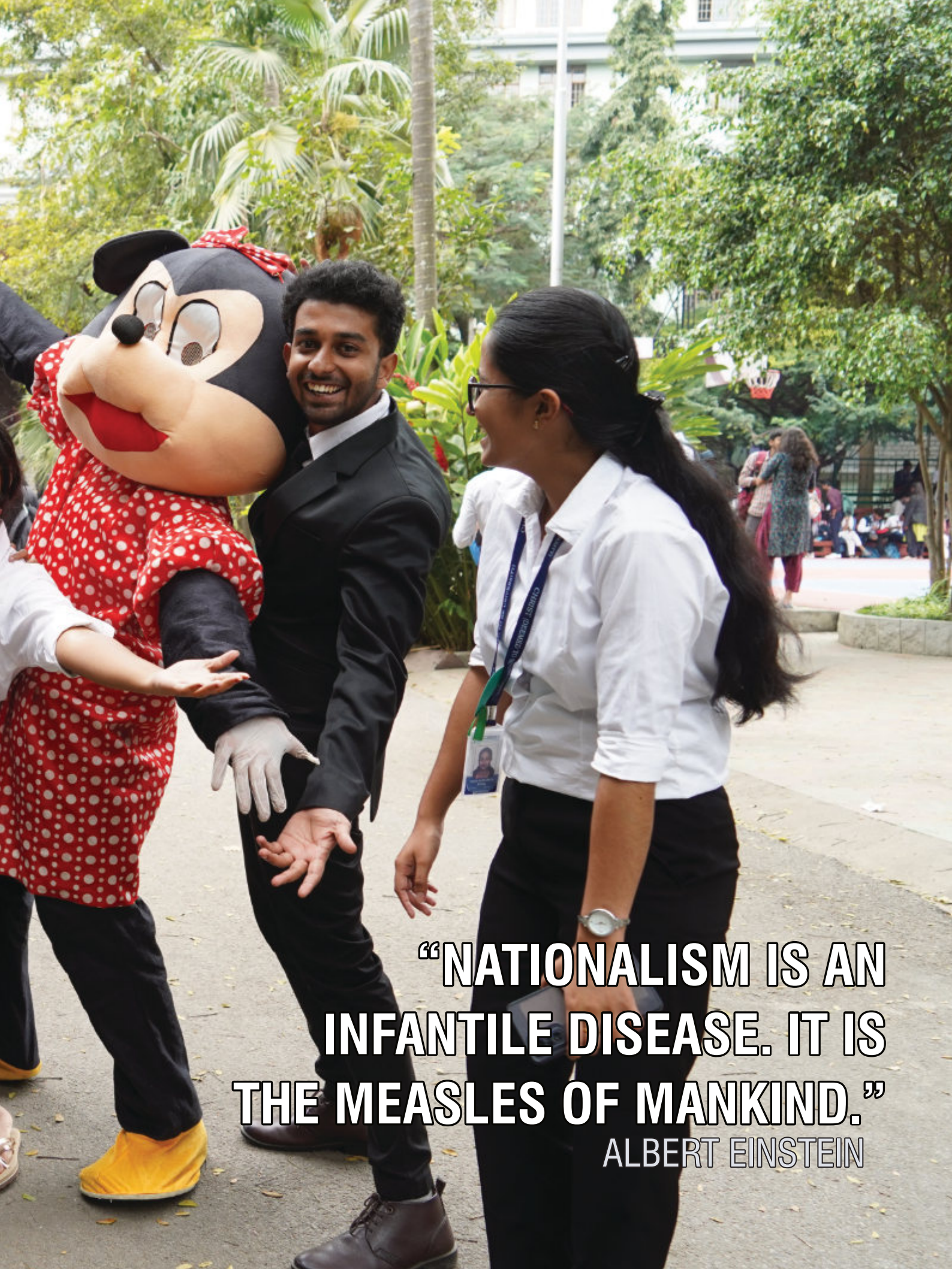

The Centre for Social Action (CSA) is a student-led organisation that promotes social initiatives in education, health-care, and environmental sustainability. Established in 1999 in the Central Campus and 2019 in the Delhi NCR campus, CSA inspires students to make a positive impact on society. This year, CSA collaborated with departments to organise events like clean-up drives, educational programs, mental well-being sessions, and donation drives. CSA also conducted

"Buniyad" Early Learning and Training Centre, providing personalised online education to students. The organisation organised blood donation camps, signed partnerships with schools, and offered free health services through health camps. ## CENTRE FOR RESEARCH

The Centre for Research fosters a research culture among students, offering Ph.D. programs in 12 disciplines with 36 experienced guides. Currently, 77 scholars are being trained and supervised in their research work. The scholars undergo rigorous coursework to refine their research skills and develop professional and personal competencies. They also contribute to teaching undergraduate courses, sharing their expertise with fellow students. The Centre organizes workshops on various research topics and supervisors attend orientation programs to enhance their mentoring abilities. Scholars collaborate with prestigious institutions, present their research nationally and internationally, and publish in renowned journals. The Centre for Research is dedicated to driving innovation and empowering scholars, upholding its vision of a research-intensive environment.

## CENTRE FOR CONCEPT DESIGN (CCD)

The Centre for Concept Design (CCD) at CHRIST University serves as a pedagogical intervention and ensures that all University documents adhere to the branding policy. It supports faculty in content creation and video modules for teaching purposes. The objectives of CCD include talent development, maintaining a consistent brand image, producing high-quality content, fostering excellence and collaboration, establishing partnerships, and staying updated with concept design trends. The coordinator oversees operations, develops content aligned with university goals, provides guidance, and leads content production. Student interns assist in content development, research, editing, collaboration, training, representation, and feedback. The process involves submitting documents for review and approval, with a stipulated time frame. CCD's role focuses on public domain documents, while internal circulation documents are exempt.

## OFFICE OF ADMISSIONS

The Office of Admissions represents CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Delhi NCR Campus and functions as a coordinating office with high schools, colleges and other educational institutions. We are involved into handling the intake, processing, evaluation and determinations of submitted applications. The responsibility of the Office of Admissions is to disseminate information to the prospective students about the University and help them through the admission process. The Knowledge Pro is a digital tool that helps educational institutions manage the student enrolment process effortlessly. It lets admission teams capture student inquiries, check their eligibility, follow-up, collect documents, and complete the application process digitally. The office represents the University at national and international platforms to promote and educate the prospective students by participating in fairs and events. It ensures to develop and perpetuate a procedure wherein the applications are received and scrutinized respectively for each UG / PG / PhD applicant and determine the admission eligibility for these students before intimating them about the admission status. The office effectively supports the selected students by guiding them through the various financial assistance available and enabling them to utilize the options. The office also caters to the certificate requests of the students which also includes necessary documents required for loan sanctions. Throughout the year, the Office of Admissions acts as a vital support system connecting the students and faculty members for the fulfilment of their various service requests.

## CENTRE FOR ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT (CAPS)

The Centre for Academic and Professional Support (CAPS) is a vital part of our institution, providing comprehensive assistance to students and professionals. CAPS acts as a bridge between academia and the professional world, conducting training workshops, career talks, and mock interviews to help Christites enhance their skills. With five committees managing operations, content generation, research, media, PR, and technology, CAPS has become the fastest-growing student body at Christ Delhi-NCR Campus. The launch day was celebrated, featuring a Design Thinking Workshop and team-building activities. Student recruitment took place, resulting in the selection of dedicated recruits.

A LinkedIn 101 Masterclass provided insights on creating professional profiles, while the "Walk The Talk: Emerging Careers in the Digital World" event discussed digital career trends. CAPS also advertised its objectives at the DAKSH event and celebrated Fun Friyay every month. CAPS aims to shape individuals' academic and professional landscapes through its events and support services.

## OFFICE OF ACADEMIC SUPPORT

The Office of Academic Support facilitates communication and coordination between Academic and Non-Academic Offices. Led by Mr. A Sabu John, with Ms. Akansha Solomon and Ms. Anet Kunjumon as Coordinators, it ensures smooth academic operations throughout the year. ## CENTRE FOR LIBRARY AND INFORMATION




The Library and Information Centre at CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Delhi NCR campus, boasts a rich collection of textbooks, reference books, periodicals, journal archives, and e-resources. With over 25,000 journals and 200,000 eBooks, the library provides a comprehensive knowledge hub. It can accommodate more than 290 students and offers 50 computer terminals equipped with internet and Wi-Fi services. The library also features a symposium hall for group discussions, locker facilities, a computer lab, and reprographic services. ## CENTRE FOR IT SERVICES

IT Services encompass various aspects of technology support and management at the University. Some of their key functions are to provide e-training to staff and students, offering workshops, creating training materials, and guiding users on the best practices for using hardware, software, and online tools. The IT infrastructure is designed to handle the needs of students and staff, with upgrades in place to efficiently manage the load. This includes higher-end servers, doubled internet bandwidth, and improved firewall capabilities to enhance network security.

IT Services also support the use of Adobe Creative Cloud, particularly for students in media and graphic design fields.

The software suite, including Photoshop, Illustrator, InDesign, and Lightroom, enables students to enhance their skills in image editing, vector graphics, layout design, and photography.

IT Services play a crucial role in supporting campus-wide events such as TechGenX, providing technical assistance, website hosting, and network administration for the event volunteers. They also oversee system administration tasks, including network management, security, and server maintenance to ensure optimal performance, reliability, and security of the University's IT infrastructure.





## CENTRE FOR PERSONNEL OFFICE

The Personnel Office is responsible for maintaining employee records, including personal files, attendance, and leave records, in accordance with university policies. We ensure the staff's knowledge profile (KP) is updated regularly. Additionally, we assist faculty and staff with their appraisal processes and handle disciplinary issues and grievances.

During the pandemic, we supported the Director and new faculty members in conducting smooth online interviews and efficiently completing the onboarding formalities for new hires. We also verify research documents submitted for various incentives.

We offer support to other departments such as Facility Management, Accounts Department, and the Admissions Office as needed. Our goal is to ensure efficient personnel management and provide assistance to various departments across the university.

## OFFICE OF INFORMATION PROCESSING AND MANAGEMENT (IPM)

The Office of Information Processing and Management (IPM) at CHRIST University is responsible for supporting, monitoring, and communicating all data related to students, staff, and the university itself. It collects, analyzes, and disseminates data to ensure effective governance. IPM ensures the timely collection of information regarding students, faculty members, and staff, and processes this data to enhance the implementation of the curriculum. It collaborates with other departments, centers, and offices to coordinate activities and track students' academic progression. IPM also manages the issuance of Smart Cards

for students and maintains the timetable for all classes, including room assignments. The office is responsible for printing and distributing University ID cards to students each academic year. Additionally, IPM monitors student attendance and provides attendance reports to department heads, coordinators, and teachers. It also sends attendance shortage letters to parents, facilitating communication between parents, counselors, and teachers when needed.

## CENTRE FOR NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) at CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Delhi NCR, offers students the chance to join the world's largest uniformed youth organisation and develop their personalities while excelling academically. Established in 2019, the NCC's Army Wing welcomes male and female students under the 37 Uttar Pradesh Battalion NCC. It provides a range of activities and programs focused on fostering leadership, teamwork, and discipline. Throughout the year, the NCC organised various events and initiatives, such as Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav-Suryanamaskar, Martyr's Day, Independence Day, Prabhat Pheri, Tree Plantation, NCC Day Celebration, Republic Day Celebration, Cleanliness Drive,

## DEPARTMENT OF LANGUAGES

## CENTRE FOR STUDENT COUNCIL

## CENTRE FOR LIBRARY AND INFORMATION CENTRE

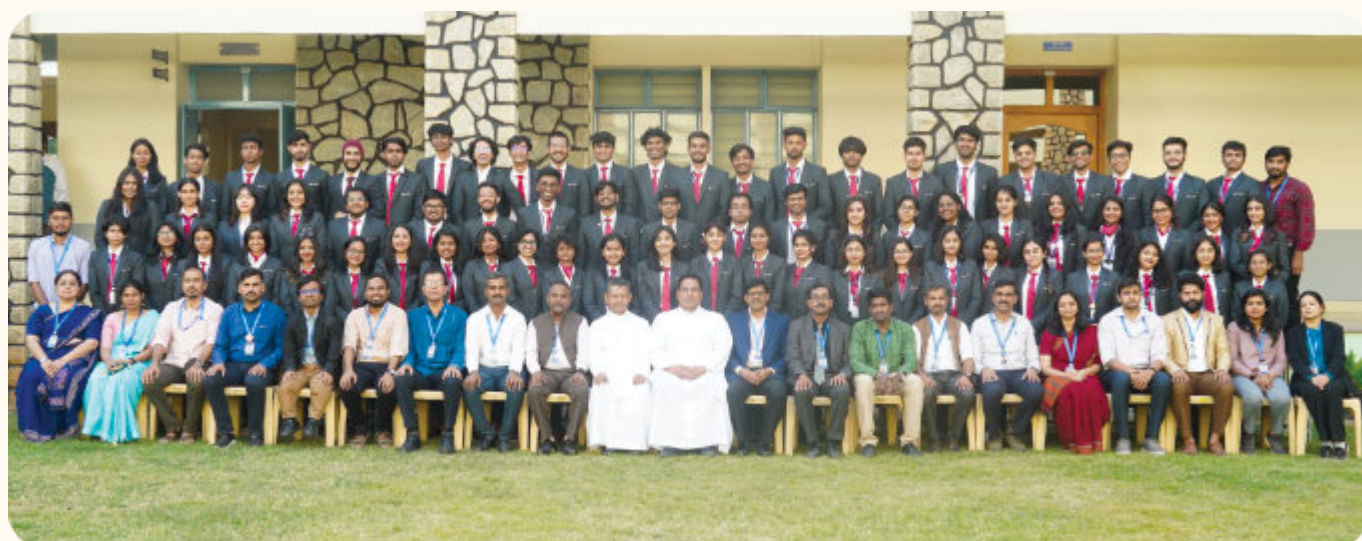
