
Event Details





POLICY NUDGE

The 'Policy Nudge' series is a bi-weekly initiative by the MA (Public Policy) cohort at CHRIST (Deemed to be University) to bridge the gap between academia and industry know-how. The series invites policy practitioners and professionals to cover various aspects of policy and career prospects in the policy field, followed by Q&A sessions and skill training workshops. The invited guests include professionals from different sectors, such as corporate professionals, activists, change makers, and urban planners.

The sessions took place in form of seminars for various weeks. The first session was held on 20th August, 2022. Sharat Chander, Head of public policy, APAC at Coursera was speaker who acknowledged 55 participants about the public policy at Coursera and skills required. He outlined the role of politics in implementation of policies. Mr Chander also shared critical insights on implementation of policies and the skills required to pursue a career in this field. The main points to remember include the implementation of policies in the field, employment possibilities in the policy sector, and an understanding of how an internal policy department operates within a corporate organization. Another pair of speakers are Ankit Jain, Rashi Mishra, Sunny Roy Kolla who are Cofounder and Associates of GDi Partners talking about the policy. They spoke about Policy implementation in the political framework, the role of think tanks in supporting and guiding the government to analyze the on-ground situation and suggesting appropriate policies to better the scenario is done by think tanks. One such organization is GDI partners, the session was held on the 20th of august and had 50 students present for the session. GDI partners that perform on field surveys to compile the conclusive data for the government to take appropriate measures in order to implement the best possible policy. The role of government and think tanks were discussed and the short- and longterm goals of implementing policies were also discussed. Soft and hard skills needed in the public policy work frame, Growth of policy in the Indian aspect and Diverse career opportunities linked to the Policy space are the key takeaways from the seminars. Shiv Chhatrala was the Rapporteur.

On 3rd September 2022, the seminar was conducted by Bhuvana Anand who is Founder and Director, Trayas and former director, Centre for civil society. She addressed about Sub-National comparison of legal barriers to women rights to choose work in India. She spoke about the representation of women in various government and non-governmental bodies, discrepancies on pay, work opportunities and hurdles a woman has to go through to climb up the ladder in her workplace. Way forward on the empowerment of women was also discussed. The following was taken away from the seminar: Critical analysis on state of discrimination of women in India, discussed types of discrimination, Representation of women in rural local bodies, How to look at discrimination issues from various angles, Political influence on women being discriminated. Krupa Thakkar was the Rapporteur.

On 20th September, 2022 was a seminar about Skills required in the public policy domain and ways to acquire them by Kazim Rizvi who is Founder, The Dialogue. Mr Kazim Rizvi, Founder of The Dialogue. Addressing over 50 students, Mr Rizvi explained the key skills required in the public policy sector and the various career options available to students. He also emphasized on the importance of networking and getting hands-on exposure to projects in areas of one's interest. The major highlights from his speech are Required skills to become a successful policy professional, Importance of soft and hard skills in policy space, Exposure to the diverse career options linked to the policy space, Importance of networking and how to network in the policy space, How to create year wise planning for achieving success in policy career. Sneha Devi, being the Rapporteur.

Another seminar was conducted on 24th September 2022 where Mr Srinivas Alavilli, Ms V R Vachana, Ms Mythreyi Mugundan Head, Civic Participation, Manager - Advocacy, Senior Associate of Janaagraha spoke about Avenues for civic participation and how to become an active citizen Critical Analysis of 74th Constitutional Amendment. Policy implementation in the political framework and role of bureaucracy was the highlight of the seminar. They discuss various avenues of civic participation, what is it to be an active citizen and how do we become one. The speakers also discussed the 74th Constitutional Amendment at length and the impact it has on governing of cities. Having worked in these areas first-hand, the speakers were able to provide the students with some useful insights into the real-world working of urban policies and the role that bureaucrats play in implementing these policies. Shiv Chhatrala was the Rapporteur.

14th January 2023, Yash Agarwal, Founder of Public Policy India spoke about Skill Development: What it takes to be a successful Public Policy Professional led to Interaction on resume building and personal branding. It provided the students with an insight into the working of the policy space and what it takes to be a successful professional. He encouraged students to take up personal projects such as creating a website and writing opinion pieces on contemporary issues. He highlighted the importance of getting an exposure to the different sectors within the policy space and understanding the nuances of each. The major key takeaways were Personal branding and portfolio building, Importance of working on projects and/or doing internships, Key skills required to excel in the field of public policy. Krupa Thakkar was the Rapporteur.

M Anilkumar, Mayor of Kochi, Government of Kerala spoke about his Journey as an elected representative on 19th January 2023. The seminar highlighted the Policy implementation in the political framework. He conducted an inspiring seminar on how policies can be implemented efficiently through an accountable political framework. He also enlightened with his political career journey on how being a committed leader for his own region and bring holistic development of the region. All the aspirants of public policy, gained an in depth knowledge on effective roles & framework of political know how in policy formulation & implementation. The upshot of the seminar was Political system in policy implementation, Efficient bureaucratic roles, Balancing Politics and policy developments, How elected representatives have an edge to create larger impacts in policy space. On 24th January 2023, Meghnad S., Journalist, Creative Director at IVM Podcasts addressed the students about Policy on-ground. This basically provided information to the students about the Digital media journalist & public policy professional, Meghnand S Sir threw an insightful knowledge on how efficiency of Public policy at grassroots level is the initial point in solving most of the policy loopholes. He also discussed accountability in implementation of policies by the officials & ended on how future business models of the media industry will transform & ease the policy formulation & implementation framework not only domestically but internationally as well. The payoffs from the seminar were efficiency of Public policy at grassroots level, Accountability of policies, Insights on policy fellowships and other career opportunities in the space and Future of business models of media industry in India and at global level. Vaidehi Sahasrabhojanee being the Rapporteur.

The concept of Civil Society, Its Regulation & Evolving Trends was introduced to the students through a seminar conducted by Nivedita Krishna, Founder, Pacta & Technology Policy Consultant at Wadhwani Foundation on 4th February 2023. She delivered a very honest & a reality on how civil societies & philanthropy framework works in India. She deliberately explained how the funding is done for various think tanks & non-profit organizations & how law & order is accountable in the whole process. The major conclusions drawn were Process of funding in civil societies and Critical discussion on NGO, philanthropy, civil societies, etc. Sneha Devi was the Rapporteur. Another seminar conducted on the same day was by Vincy Davis, Assistant Professor, Indian School of Public Policy about Drafting Policy Brief. Shiv Chhatrala was the Rapporteur for the conduct.






Distribution of Value Added Course Certificates

- The goal is to conduct environmental campaigns to promote awareness and enhance the environmental conditions of specific localities.

- Offering volunteer assistance to organisations dedicated to safeguarding and conserving the environment and its wildlife.

Events/ activities organised

1. Wall painting drive with voiceless India.

On the 3rd of April, 2022, the Sustainability and Forest Education (SAFE) Club from the Department of Professional Studies collaborated with Voiceless India to conduct a wall painting drive. The event's main goal was to raise awareness about animal rights and veganism. The event began with a speech from Voiceless India at 9:30 am and lasted until 2 pm, during which volunteers painted a section of the wall opposite BES Educational Institute in Jayanagar. The paintings were designed to spread the message of compassion and kindness through art and caught the attention of many passers-by, allowing volunteers to explain the purpose of the drive to them. The artwork conveyed the need for action to prevent animal cruelty and emphasised the benefits of making small lifestyle changes to help these sentient beings. The paintings addressed various societal issues, including animal testing, adopting animals instead of buying them, and the maltreatment of animals in the cosmetics, dairy, and poultry industries. The event was a success and attracted many volunteers from both SAFE Club and CSA, who were actively involved in the effort to make a difference. The initiative led by Voiceless India gave voice to the rights of nonhuman animals through art, encouraging people to be more compassionate and considerate towards animals with simple messages and touching images. It provided a platform for animals to be treated with the respect and kindness they deserve.

2. " Maa Ka Doodh" movie screening

In collaboration with the Animal Save Movement Foundation, the Sustainability and Forest Education (SAFE) Club from the Department of Professional Studies organised a documentary film screening of "Maa Ka Doodh: Uncovering a Nation's Dairy Disaster" on April 1st, 2023. The documentary sheds light on the impact of unethical dairy farming practices in India and provided an opportunity for students to understand the complexities of the dairy industry and its implications on public health and animal welfare. The event included a Q&A session with the filmmaker, Harsha, who shared insights on the making of the film and answered questions from the audience. The discussion focused on the importance of ethical and sustainable dairy farming practices, the benefits of veganism and a plant-based diet, and the risks associated with consuming dairy. screening profoundly affected the students, challenging preconceptions and raising important questions about the food they consume. Many were shocked by the reality of the animal farming industry and expressed interest in learning more about vegan and plant-based diets and their benefits.

3. Vegan Delight: Food-tasting event

The SAFE Club also organised a vegan food sampling event to allow students to taste and discover plant-based foods and the benefits of adopting a vegan lifestyle. The event featured a diverse range of vegan dishes, including appetisers, main courses, and desserts, and was attended by many students who gave positive feedback. The students were pleasantly surprised by the variety and quality of vegan dishes and were impressed by how delicious and satisfying plant-based food can be. Some students wanted to learn more about veganism and incorporate plant-based foods into their diets. The event also helped raise awareness of animal agriculture's environmental, health, and ethical consequences. It motivated many students to take steps towards a more sustainable and compassionate future.

4. Visit to wildlife SOS.

The SAFE Club, dedicated to raising awareness about animal welfare, organised two trips to Wildlife SOS, a wildlife rescue centre in India, with 14 and 30 participants in the first and second trips, respectively. Both trips included a documentary showcasing the centre's activities, such as rescuing, treating, and rehabilitating animals back to the wild. The students were also given a tour of the entire centre and interacted with the staff, who explained the daily routines of the animals and the centre's operations. Feeding the bears was a highlight of both trips, and the students received a brief on the appropriate food and how to interact with them safely. The trips provided the students with a greater understanding of the challenges faced by wildlife in India and the significance of organisations like Wildlife SOS in safeguarding and preserving wildlife. They also learned about the importance of education and awareness-raising on animal welfare and how they could contribute to the cause.

Overall, the trips were immensely successful, and the students had a unique and memorable experience. They left the centre feeling motivated and inspired to positively impact animal welfare in their communities.

With over 350 members, FIC has become a strong community that aims to establish a platform for learning and networking with finance experts. The club's main objective is to cater to the needs of its members, as they are the essence of FIC.

LIST OF EVENTS CONDUCTED IN THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-2023:

1. FIC Annual General Meeting

Type of event: Panel discussion + Orientation

Date Organized: 21st November, 2022

Overview of the event: Binod Shankar, the Chief Guest, provided insight to the audience on the intricacies of pursuing a career in Investment Banking and Asset Management. The session was followed by a panel discussion that focused on Mr. Shankar's life and career journey. FIC also conducted an orientation session for new members, where they were briefed on the different divisions, as well as their respective roles and responsibilities.

2. Financial Literacy Programme

Type of event: Educational Project

Date Organized: 18th November - 1st December

Overview of the event :The FLP, which stands for Financial Literacy Program, is a joint effort between FlC and ClSl. Its aim is to educate students on basic financial concepts, as part of FlC's goal to provide quality education and ClSl's mission to enhance its introductory financial literacy program.

The program lasted for 10 days and followed a specific structure, which included an initial assessment to determine the students' financial literacy level, a series of 10 modules covering different financial topics, 10 days of teaching, and a final evaluation.

3. FIC x Mentoverse: Case Conundrum

Type of event: Competition

Date Organized: 25th & 26th November

Overview of the event: Case Conundrum was an event focused on Management Consulting, which involved a competition where teams presented case studies. The event was organized in partnership with Mentoverse, and more than 50 teams registered for the competition. The preliminary round shortlisted 12 teams, which proceeded to the finals. The final round included a case study with two different scenarios, one about advising a company with decreasing profits, and the other requiring a comprehensive analysis of the financial impact of a significant sporting event. The judges for the competition were Anirudh Ramesh and David Pinto, both from Mentoverse.

4. Navigating the Financial Landscape

Type of event: Panel Discussion Date Organized: 18th January, 2023

Overview of the event: The panel conversation commenced by exploring recent developments in Asset management and how the CFA curriculum equips students to deal with them. Nick Pollard, Arati Porwal, and Amit Chakrabarty, as guest speakers, shared their experiences of career growth and provided valuable networking tips.

The students were also informed about the objectives of the esteemed CFA program 'Young Women in Investments' and its contribution to enhancing the financial scenario for women in India. Additionally, the discussion highlighted the significance of networking in the professional world and the value of having a thirst for learning and development.

5. FIC Financial Modelling Workshop + Competition

Type of event: Panel Discussion Date Organized: 18th January, 2023

Overview of the event: Mr. Chinmaya Amte, an expert in Microsoft Excel and financial modeling, served as the guest speaker for the event. During the three-hour workshop, he discussed various intriguing topics such as different types of financial models, computing home loans with goal seek, tax calculations, automating charts with excel tables, analyzing sensitivity using data tables, a case study on payback period, cell referencing, and dynamic arrays. The competition was centered around a financial modeling case study, primarily covering the workshop topics, to assess the participants' understanding of the concepts taught during the workshop.

FLP

Financial Literacy Program (FLP) is an initiative taken by FIC to impart knowledge about finance to the students of Christ Junior College students.

About CISI

The CISI, available at www.cisi.org, is a leading professional organization for individuals in the fields of securities, investment, wealth management, and financial planning. It was established in 1992 by London Stock Exchange professionals and has over 42,000 members across 116 countries, with over 40,000 CISI exams administered in 80 countries last year. CISI exams are globally recognized and accepted by 75 regulators, including FAC UK, RBI, SEBI, and ESCA. The CISI offers various levels of professional qualifications and membership, including foundation, qualifying, advanced, and professional levels of study in areas such as Operations, Wealth Management, Compliance/Risk, Capital Markets/Corporate Finance, Financial Planning, and Islamic Finance. As a chartered body, the CISI is associated with several global banks that endorse its certifications, including BNY Mellon, Mphasis, AXA, Eclerx, Northern Trust, State Street, Goldman Sachs, HSBC, and Morgan Stanley.

Through its capacity building initiative, the CISI collaborates with its corporate partners to provide support to colleges referred by them. The organization has partnerships with several top colleges worldwide, such as CHRIST University, ST. Teresa College, Jian University, Bengal Institute of Management Studies, St. Mary's, and Amity Business School.

CISI- Christ University Partnership

On May 20, 2013, an MOU was signed with CISI, and since then, the program has been running successfully. Additionally, on November 22, 2016, the University was awarded accreditation by CISI, which recognizes its excellence in providing higher education in financial services. CHRIST (Deemed to be University) received this status following three consecutive years of outstanding performance, during which the average annual pass marks achieved by its students were comparable to those of the industry over the same period. To increase the global employability of students in the Department of Commerce at CHRIST (Deemed to be University), they are offered the Investment Operations Certificate (IOC) and Wealth Management certifications from CISI. This provides them with an opportunity to obtain a professional qualification alongside their degree program.

Financial Literacy Programme (PLP)

The pandemic has had a detrimental impact on the quality of education, particularly in the field of finance fundamentals. As a result, both undergraduate and postgraduate programs have experienced a decline in quality, which has been exacerbated by the impact of the pandemic at the school level. This has had a noticeable effect on programs that integrate professional bodies with university curricula, and student progress in international professional courses has been negatively impacted.

Therefore, there is a pressing need for a robust intervention at the +2 level to enhance and ensure the dissemination of high-quality education. Most professional bodies from the UK, such as CISI, ACCA, and CIMA, offer paper exemptions based on the mapping of existing curricula at the undergraduate level, depending on the quality credentials of the university. However, post-pandemic career progression in these professional courses has experienced a significant decline, which makes this proposal even more critical.

PLP Model

The first step is to identify potential +2 level schools, which can be accomplished by calling for applications for the CIS financial literacy program leading to joint certification with CHRIST University. An independent UK body, such as the British Council or UKTI, can make this call for applications. Once a sufficient number of applicants are received, a joint inspection body composed of experts can assess the quality credentials of the schools. Then, a tripartite agreement between the University, CISI, and the concerned school can be established. Once the schools are onboarded, CHRIST University will undertake the pedagogy and evaluation process.

FLP foundation training conducted for Christ Junior College

The Department of Professional Studies' Finance and Investment Cell collaborated with The Chartered Institute of Securities and Investment to offer Financial Literacy Programs to Christ Junior College. The program consisted of nine modules, 10 hours, and 24 trainers. It began on November 22 and ended on December 2.

Dr. Tomy K Kallarakal, the Dean of the department, Prof. Biju Toms, the Director of the department and Prof. Mathew Varghese & Dr. Jerlin Jose, faculty in charge overlooked the entire program.

Pre-Assessment Forms:

Prior to the classes gaining momentum, FIC distributed a Pre-Assessment form to the students of I and II Commerce PUC classes at CJC. The purpose of this form was to assess the students' proficiency in financial literacy by assigning a task that covers different aspects of Financial Indicator.

Following observations were made

- 1. The majority of students possess a fundamental comprehension of Personal Finance and acknowledge the significance of budgeting.
- 2. The students recommended including subject matters that span from stock markets to taxation.
- 3. Their grasp of the quantitative and practical utilization of theories is inadequate.

Modules:

First session was conducted on the 22nd of November at 8:30 AM will be led by fourteen instructors who will explore the Warren Buffet case study and the lessons from Rich Dad Poor Dad. Following were the learnings:

- 1. Recognize the importance of having multiple streams of income.

- 2. Comprehending the operations of stock markets.
- 3. Familiarizing oneself with relevant terminologies in the context of business and simplifying them.
- 4. Assessing the need for companies to list shares in the stock exchange and how it facilitates the buying and selling of shares through a ready market.

A session on A Guide to the Banking System with eighteen trainers as the facilitators was scheduled for the 30th of November at 8:30 AM. These are the outcomes of the session:

- 1. Comprehending the banking system and the functions that banks perform.
- 2. Grasping the way banks operate and generate revenue.
- 3. Acquiring familiarity with the banking terminology and explaining it in relation to the industry.
- 4. Evaluating the significance of central banks and their responsibility in maintaining the stability of the banking system.

On the 30th of November at 2:45 PM, 17 trainers facilitated a session on A Guide to Long Term Investing. The following are the learning outcomes:

- 1. Recognizing the importance of long-term investment and its advantages.
- 2. Differentiating between short-term and long-term investment and comprehending their characteristics.
- 3. Gaining familiarity with the investment-related terminology and explaining it in the context of the industry.
- 4.Evaluating the relevance of Warren Buffet's four principles for long-term investment and why they matter.
- 5. Appreciating the impact of compounding and its potential for generating longterm returns.

On the 1st of December at 8:30 AM & 2:45 PM is when another session was conducted on Ethics, Entrepreneurship and Social Responsibility took place, with 22 instructors as the facilitators. Following were the learning:

Armed with this advice, the trainers would then prepare and endeavor to enhance their abilities for the subsequent session.

Assessment/ Foundation Exam:

On December 2nd, 2022, there were 12 invigilators for the exam. The I PU exam will commence at 8:30 AM, followed by the II PU exam at 2:45 PM. The exam will consist of a total of 30 questions, with a duration of 30 minutes.



GENESYS

Genesys, an initiative of the Department of Professional Studies at Christ (deemed to be University), aims to develop digital literacy and communication skills in young individuals. Specifically, the program targets the children of the housekeeping staff. Each child is paired with a trainer, who is a university student, and classes are held in the evenings at a mutually convenient time. The online classes began in September 2022 and are continuing in the current academic year.

As Aesop said, "No act of kindness, however small, is ever wasted." Despite their busy schedules, the university students who serve as trainers have selflessly volunteered their time and skills to teach children from classes 3rd to 12th. Although the effort put into the sessions may seem minimal, it has had a significant impact on the children, enhancing their subject knowledge and familiarizing them with using gadgets for education.

Our Faculty In-Charge reminds us that one does not need to be a teacher or a computer expert to participate in this initiative. By spending a few hours with the children, anyone can make a positive difference in their lives. As Dr. Budha Anuradha, our pillar of support, says, "A candle loses nothing by lighting another candle. Let's be the light for them." If you would like to be a part of this initiative, please approach Dr. Anuradha.

ACTIVITIES

- 1. Digital literacy- teaching the children basic computer skills like using Paint, Microsoft word, powerpoint and excel depending on their age.
- 2. Familiarising them with online mode of teaching and learning using PDFs, whiteboard, and other remote teaching methods.
- 3. Developing oratory, public speaking and digital skills.
- 4. Making them aware about current affairs and various global issues.
- 5. Teaching them importance of extracurricular activities through various events and workshops to help them hone their skills in the same.
- 6. Imbibing in them a love for the environment and a concern for social issues
- 7. Explaining their subjects through practical examples and developing in them a conceptual framework.

IMPORTANT EVENTS

1. Core Team Selection

At the start of the new academic year, Genesys invited all active participants from the previous year who had volunteered to teach to be part of the Core Committee selection process. The existing members reviewed the submissions and selected students who had made the highest contribution and showed consistent dedication to be part of the committee. The committee for the current year consists of eight members, with an additional variable group of first-year students assisting with operational work.

This year, the core committee's main focus was to help students adapt to offline classes after the pandemic, jumpstart weekly group sessions, identify new students who could benefit from the program, and ensure overall academic and extracurricular development. To achieve these goals, the committee recruited new trainers by sharing a form, resulting in a new group of enthusiastic trainers joining the program.

2. Classes/ Sessions

In the 2021-22 academic year, 30 children were taught by 183 volunteer trainers through various platforms such as Google Meet, Zoom, and WhatsApp video calls, depending on convenience and accessibility. As soon as it became feasible, some students were shifted to offline mode of instruction. These classes were conducted on a one-on-one basis within Block 4, at the convenience of both the trainers and students.

3. Offline Group Sessions

Every alternate week, Genesys trainees were invited to the campus for digital literacy classes. These 2-3 hour sessions were tailored to each student's age, capability, and prior experience and were conducted one-on-one. The sessions covered topics such as typing skills, Microsoft Word, Microsoft PowerPoint, and Microsoft Excel. To provide hands-on experience, the trainers used their own laptops during the sessions. Each session had a minimum attendance of 12-14 students.



4. Republic Day 2023

The Republic Day celebration brought together the trainees in a patriotic spirit. The event mainly comprised various activities that allowed the trainees to socialize and showcase their extracurricular talents, thus building their confidence. The trainees were given memorabilia to keep as a memento of the event.

The club expresses its heartfelt appreciation to the Department of Professional Studies and Anuradha Ma'am for their unwavering support, which has facilitated consistent and gratifying growth.

The Genesys team is working collaboratively to ensure the utmost benefit for the children and volunteers who have invested their time and effort in this program. The team strives to maintain consistency in lessons and enhance the efficiency of the teaching process.

NIMMAGAAGI MAAHITI

A new initiative called 'Nimmagaagi Maahiti', which translates to 'Information for you', has been launched by M.A. (Public Policy) students. This is a social cause aimed at improving the lives of marginalized communities. The students believe that knowledge is power and that sharing their learnings with frontline civic workers and other marginalized communities is essential. The program covers topics such as financial literacy, health and nutrition, legal awareness, women's safety, and mental health. Its goal is to bridge the gap between the government and marginalized communities by providing them with the necessary information to improve their quality of life. The pilot session on financial literacy was conducted on January 13, 2023, with the housekeeping staff of Christ (Deemed to be University), Central Campus. The students started with an ice breaker activity to gauge the staff's knowledge of concepts such as finances, savings, insurance, and banking. They then provided information about government schemes that the staff could benefit from. The session was attended by 20 housekeeping staff and received overwhelmingly positive feedback. The following sessions covered topics such as health and nutrition, legal awareness, and mental health, and were held every fortnight.

The cohort collaborated with Bommanahalli B.B.M.P and Adugodi B.B.M.P to conduct sessions for pourakarmikas. The first session was held on March 11, 2023, in Bommanahalli B.B.M.P ward. The cohort is also in talks with Hasiru Dala to conduct sessions for different marginalized groups such as waste pickers and hair pickers. They hope that Nimmagaagi Maahiti will continue to grow as an initiative to facilitate social outreach and promote social justice.

In the second semester, as the students returned to offline mode, they decided to watch the movie '83' as their first class outing. This movie is about India's historic victory in the 1983 cricket World Cup. They watched the movie on January 4, 2023, at the Forum Mall in Kormangla. It was a surreal experience for the students to watch the movie on the big screen with their newly-made friends and to relive one of the golden moments in Indian cricket history.
