
Eco Emporium

From Gala-Galas to Sugar Cookies



The aroma of freshly fried gala-galas wafting through our home on Christmas mornings, staying up late to help fry the many, many delicacies to be distributed in the neighbourhood, and being with family. It doesn't get better than this. When I was a child, my family and I visited our hometown Kolar Gold Fields every Christmas. It was my favourite time of the year, as I'd get to meet my cousins, and my grandparents, and above all, have access to unlimited festive food.

Every year, my grandparents' house would be in high spirits— pun intended, complete with Christmas decorations, carols playing on full volume in the background, and last-minute cleaning in progress.

These times of bliss came to an unprecedented halt after our grandfather's death. Though we did gather together to celebrate Christmas in our home, it was not the same anymore. Now the house felt like a body without a soul, an emptiness clinging to it which no Christmas spirit could wish away.

It has been ten years since my grandfather passed away, and ten years since our grandmother last cooked Christmas delicacies for the neighbourhood. Those Christmases have given birth to new traditions in our family. Now, it is my mother who carries forward the tradition by replicating her mother's dishes and sharing them with our neighbours in Bangalore. We've incorporated new items into our Christmas menu, including my amateur, albeit palatable creations such as cookies and plum cakes, beside the occasional hot chocolate - but is there really a special occasion needed to
